FIRST STAKES SUCCESS FOR ROYALLY BRED MARE

Royally bred mare **Cheaperthandivorce (NZ)** (Savabeel) picked up the first stakes success of her burgeoning career when she finished powerfully in the home straight to claim the Gr.3 Gee & Hickton Funeral Directors Thompson Handicap (1600m) at Trentham on Sunday.

The four-year-old daughter of super sire Savabeel and Gr.1 New Zealand

Oaks (2400m) winner Boundless had scored a decisive fresh-up victory over the same distance at Hastings earlier in the month, however there were some doubts that she could cope with the Slow9 track conditions on offer at Trentham.

Those fears were quickly put to bed as rider Danielle Johnson had the mare settled beautifully in midfield before easing into the race at the 600m.

Taken to the middle of the track Cheaperthandivorce sprinted quickly with the well favoured Justaskme (NZ) (No Excuse Needed) and the pair set down to fight out the finish, with the Roger James and Robert Wellwood-trained mare proving too strong over the closing stages.

James had been happy with the mare leading into the race but began to

have some doubts creep in once he found out about the wetter than predicted underfoot conditions.

"I was pretty confident until I knew how bad the track was," he said.

"She had never struck a surface like that, even at the trials, so you never know how they will go until they get out there on it.

"Some handle it and some don't so I was hopeful more than confident.

"She ended up travelling well and finished her race off very strongly, so that was very pleasing to see."

James believes the mare has what it takes to tackle some of the better staying events over the summer after strengthening up nicely during her winter break.

"She was a bit frail last year, but still managed to run fourth in the New Zealand Oaks (Gr.1, 2400m)," he said.

"She is very lightly-framed but has matured well and we have also changed her gear around a little, which has helped with her development.

"She looked nicely placed today and even with the win she should still get into races like the Counties or Avondale Cup with a nice light weight."

Cheaperthandivorce has now won three of her 8 starts, with today's victory adding significant value to any future breeding career.

The four-year-old is the first filly out of Boundless and is raced by her breeders Brent, Cherry and Faith Taylor of Trelawney Stud.

The amusing moniker originates from a trip to the Inglis Broodmare Sale in 2011 where Boundless was being offered at auction to dissolve her racing partnership.

Cherry Taylor, who retained a share in Boundless after selling her as a yearling, was keen to buy the mare to add to the Trelawney Stud broodmare band.

"Brent (Husband) was at the sales and had been trying to buy a broodmare all day but hadn't been able to," Cherry Taylor recalled.

"He went to A\$700,000 to get Boundless, which was a lot of money, and as he walked out of the ring someone commented to him that it was a lot to spend on a broodmare and Brent replied with 'it's cheaper than divorce'."

The win continued a good weekend for Trelawney Stud, with the Taylors racing dominant Matamata winner Vamos Bebe(I Am Invincible), while they will also be represented by Pareanui Bay (NZ) (Lonhro), second favourite for Monday's Gr.2 James And Annie Sarten Memorial Stakes (1400m) at Te Rapa.

CUP DREAM STAYS ALIVE WITH FORGOT YOU

Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young have not given up on the hope of starting three-year-old **Forgot You (NZ)** (Savabeel) in the Gr.1 Melbourne Cup (3200m).

But first there is the Gr. 1 Victoria Derby (2500m) at Flemington on Saturday before any decision is made about the Cup.

Forgot You was the only three-year-old entered for this year's Melbourne Cup (3200m) at Flemington on November 2.

No three-year-old has run in the Cup since Arena (Danehill) finished 15th to Jezabeel (NZ) (Zabeel) in 1998 while Nothin' Leica Dane (Danehill) won the 1995 Derby before backing up three days later in the Cup to finish second behind Doriemus (NZ) (Norman Pentaquad).

The last Cup winner from a southern hemisphere-bred three-year-old was Skipton (Marabou) in 1941 while two northern hemisphere-bred, and trained, three-year-olds, Rekindling (High Chaparral) (2017) and Cross Counter (Teofilo) (2018) have won the Cup.

Last week Forgot You underwent the required scans to accept for the Melbourne Cup before going onto win the Gr.2 Drummond Golf Vase (2040m) at The Valley on Saturday.

The last winner of The Vase – Derby double was Efficient (NZ) (Zabeel) in 2006.

Forgot You had to dig deep to run down stablemate Commander Harry (NZ) (Reliable Man) on Saturday who also put his hand up for a Derby start with his narrow second.

"It was a little bit of a different week for Forgot You," Young said.

"We had to take him to Werribee (for his scans) on Monday and then we galloped him on Tuesday, so he missed out on his beach trip this week, but it has paid off.

"He always leaves us with our hearts in our mouths, but it is good to have two live Derby contenders."

Young said Commander Harry, who is a close relation to last year's Derby winner Johnny Get Angry (NZ) (Tavistock), deserved his shot at the race after being run down late by the

stablemate.

Forgot You heads the market for the Derby with TAB at \$3.50 and is a \$51 chance in Melbourne Cup betting while Commander Harry is a \$17 chance for Saturday's Derby contest.

RAIN SINKS PROBABEEL **AT THE VALLEY**

Trainer Jamie Richards admits he hasn't had a lot of luck with star mare Probabeel (NZ) (Savabeel) and her bid for feature race success at The Valley after her second attempt at the Gr.1 Cox Plate (2040m) was thwarted by rain on the day.

The four-time Group One winning daughter of Savabeel looked a solid chance in Saturday's iconic weight-for-age event, but with the rain that fell steadily during the day turning the track in favour of those who relish a rain-affected surface, her chance to shine was severely reduced.

Typical of her fighting nature, Probabeel battled hard all the way but finished a well beaten fifth behind European raider State Of Rest (Starspangledbanner).

Similar circumstances had seen her 2020 attempt at the race end the same way, while her bid to win the A\$5million All Star Mile (1600m) back in March was also hampered by rain, leaving her record at the track a damp and miserable zero from three.

"As soon as the rain came it was game over pretty much," Richards said.

"We were actually tossing up about

late scratching her, but as the track wasn't downgraded during the day, we had no option but to go around.

"I thought she was very brave, but when Brett (Prebble) let her head go at the 600m she was just spinning her wheels from then on.

"We will now take a few days and see how she is before we make any further decisions with her.

"She left a little feed last night which she hasn't been doing in this campaign, so it might be time for a break, but that decision won't be made until the dust settles."

Richards, who enjoyed a red-letter day back in New Zealand with six wins including two at stakes level, also had no luck in Sydney where race favourite Entriviere (NZ) (Tavistock) finished a frustrating fourth in the A\$2 million The Invitation (1400m) at Randwick.

Trapped wide from an outside barrier when the pace slackened, jockey Tommy Berry sent her forward to sit outside the leader, where she failed to settle, leaving her no kick in the final stages of the contest.

The daughter of Tavistock earned A\$100,000 for finishing fourth.

"The plan was to get cover where we could with Entriviere, but when he couldn't Tommy elected to go forward," Richards said.

"He spoke to me after the race and said he probably got that wrong as she over-raced a little and didn't have a lot left for the business end of the task.

"I guess that is racing and you have to take it on the chin, but we didn't really get to see the best of her in the race.

"Dad (Paul Richards) is looking after her over there and he has said she trotted up well this morning (Sunday), so we will also take a few days to decide whether she has another go over there or comes home for a break."

Richards was delighted with his local team and paid tribute to the work of his staff in trying circumstances.

"We've been a bit slow to hit top gear and it is pretty tough with the

circumstances around the country, but I'm really proud of how the team has put in the hard yards to get the results we got yesterday," he said.

"It's hard to win one race let alone six, so a big congratulations to everyone involved."

Richards will now turn his attention to the Te Rapa meeting on Monday where he has three runners engaged including Palamos (Extreme Choice) in the feature event, the Gr.2 James & Annie Sarten Memorial Stakes (1400m).

"Palamos has had a frustrating start to this campaign with a few things going wrong, so I'm hoping he is near right for his third-up effort tomorrow," he said.

"This race will give us a good guide

as to where he is at, as we are thinking about taking him south for the 2000 Guineas (Gr.1, 1600m) if he shows us he could cope stepping up in distance.

"We already have Noverre in the 2000 Guineas after his impressive win in the Group Three at Riccarton yesterday (War Decree Stakes), so a good performance could see Palamos join him down there."

The Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m) is the feature event at Riccarton on November 6, where Noverre (NZ) (Savabeel) is the \$5 Fixed Odds favourite with Palamos currently at a \$26 quote.

PITMAN TEAM REGISTER ANOTHER MILESTONE

With the gritty win of Okay Pal (Dissident) at Riccarton on Saturday, the Michael and Matthew Pitman training partnership registered another significant milestone.

The victory was the 400th for Matthew since he commenced in partnership with his father back in the 2014/15 racing season and comes hard off the back of Michael moving into second place on the all-time New Zealand trainers by domestic wins with 1878 victories to his name, second only to Graeme Rogerson (in excess of 2500)

and one ahead of Dave O'Sullivan.

The moment wasn't lost on the younger Pitman who joined the family business straight after leaving secondary school.

"It was a special moment on Saturday as there are not many trainers who get to that number (400) in their career," he said.

"In saying that I was under no illusion when I left school that I was walking into a fantastic set-up that Mum and Dad had established and I was extremely fortunate to become a part of that.

"I guess I was always going to be involved given we had grown up with it, but I like to think I have learned off the best and that is something not a lot of people get to do.

"Dad has said he will give it away when he gets 2000 wins on the board and while it will be exciting to step out on my own, it could also be quite bittersweet as well, although

I know both Mum and Dad will continue to be heavily involved.

"It is very much a family atmosphere we have here, where everyone in the stable is involved and we pretty much treat our apprentices as our own kids.

"It is my son's birthday today (Sunday) and we are having a party at home where all of the staff are invited and I'm sure it is going to be a great afternoon."

While Pitman is looking forward to the party, he also has his eyes on the big dance that will kick off at Riccarton on November 6 with the first day of New Zealand Cup Week.

With the spotlight firmly on southern racing over the week, the Pitman team knows it is their time to shine.

"We have a really good team preparing for Cup Week and a number of good chances in some of the bigger events," he said.

"It was great to see Okay Pal back to his best on Saturday, as he had been a little disappointing at his last start.

"He is not the easiest horse in the world, but when he is focused, he is a very talented sprinter who we think is up to Group One quality.

"We are going to have a chat tomorrow about what race we target, but at this stage I think he will go straight to the Stewards Stakes (Gr.3, 1200m) on the middle day (November 10).

"He has great tactical speed and if he could draw a barrier then he will be very competitive."

The Pitmans look set to play a major role in the main race that day, the Gr.2 Coupland's Bakeries Mile (1600m), with Miss Tycoon Rose (Written Tycoon) currently at the head of the TAB's Fixed Odds market for the race at a quote of \$4.

"Miss Tycoon Rose is very well after her last start win and we couldn't be happier with her," Pitman said.

"She has come back in superb order this season, after having her three-year-old campaign cut short by the injury she suffered in the 1000 Guineas (Gr.1, 1600m).

"We have always had a high opinion of her and you can see that in the way she conducts herself around the place.

"She is ultra-competitive and even in her work her ears go flat back and she wants to compete.

"The Coupland's is her major mission for the spring, but we think there are a number of options open to her later in the summer and through the autumn.

"We were also delighted with both Mackenzie Lad (3rd) and Fireglow (5th) in the War Decree Stakes (Gr.3, 1600m) on Saturday and they are on target for the 2000 Guineas (Gr.1, 1600m) on day one of the carnival.

"Fireglow is probably still six to twelve months away from his best, but the blinkers will go on for the Guineas and that should sharpen him up even more.

"Mackenzie Lad had an interrupted run and he found the line well.

"He will have side blinkers for the Guineas and that will help him as well.

"It is an exciting time of the year and to have the team we have for the carnival I can't wait for it to kick off."

FLYING MASCOT IN SEARCH OF BONUS

Flying Mascot (NZ) (Tavistock) has created dreams of a Derby Day payday after cruising to a 4.25-length victory in yesterday's Gr.3 Tesio Stakes (1600m) at The Valley.

Trainer Tom Dabernig will nominate Flying Mascot for Saturday's \$1m Gr.1 Empire Rose Stakes (1600m) at Flemington and should the Tavistock mare win again against her own sex, she'll collect an A\$1 million bonus for her ownership group led by Flying Start Syndications.

"At other times of year I wouldn't back her up but it's a Group One and there's a bonus of \$1 million for the owners if you win both the Tesio and Empire Rose which sounds all good in theory but I'm sure is not as easy to do," said Dabernig.

"The race yesterday, the Tesio, was always the plan as it's a race that I've found over the years with the Empire Rose the following week, sometimes doesn't have the depth.

"I thought it might be an opportunity to get a black type placing, that was my theory."

Flying Mascot, in winning the Tesio as an \$8 chance, provided Dabernig with his first stakes victory since departing Lindsay Park midway this year and training solo from Warrnambool.

"It was a big thrill and it certainly, although I don't at this stage of my career get any nerves anymore, it's still very satisfying," Dabernig said.

"After the race it's probably a bit more relief, as a trainer you feel a certain amount of expectation.

"We tried for Adelaide as a three-year-old filly and she fell short. Now as a four-year-old mare she's fully matured and really improved with each run."

KING'S COMMAND CLOSER TO GOLD

King's Command (NZ) (Tavistock) boosted his chances of a ticket to the SNG\$1million Singapore Gold Cup (2000m) after his commanding win on Saturday.

On 67 points, trainer Shane Baertschiger's five-year-old grey languished around 10 nominations down the list of the time-honoured handicap race, badly in need of a win to climb his way up closer to the cut-off mark.

While it was mission accomplished after the son of Tavistock came off a patient ride from claiming jockey Zyrul Nor Azman to take out the \$50,000 Class 4 race over 1800m, they're not out of the woods yet.

A penalty of say five to six points from the handicapper might only see him leapfrog over six or seven runners – which may or may not be enough.

With the race still three weeks away on November 14, his Australian handler, however, remained upbeat given much water could go under the bridge by then.

"He had to win today. There's no way he would have won with 59kgs and that's why I put Zyrul on – to get three kilos off," said Baertschiger.

"He's one of the best three-kilo claimers around, and as he was available, I booked him early.

"My instructions to him today

were to settle midfield or worse than midfield. When I saw the two leaders (Buddy Buddy and Con Speranza) going at each other upfront, I was smiling.

"The win has even more merit after he ripped his front shoe down the backstraight. He's a really nice horse.

"He was a bit flat after his last run (July 3) before he was supposed to run in the Singapore Derby. I gave him a spell and today was his first time going beyond the mile, second-up over 1800m.

"But he's a Tavistock, I never had any doubt he can get the trip and even 2000m. He would be a good lightweight chance in the Gold Cup."

King's Command has now taken

his smart record to five wins and three placings from 14 starts for more than \$155,000 in stakes earnings for the Aramco Stable.

FIRST STAKES WINNER FOR RIBCHESTER

Flaming Rib (Ribchester) became the first stakes winner for his first-season sire Ribchester when registering a one-length win in Saturday's Listed Doncaster Stakes (1200m).

Prepared by Ton Dascombe, Flaming Rib landed a trio of nursery handicaps—at Thirsk, York and Chester—in his three most recent outings and continued on an upward trajectory with a first black-type triumph.

"He's been great and has won four on the bounce now," said assistant trainer Colin Gorman.

"He's been straightforward and has improved as the year has gone on. He's rated 108 now and it takes a fair bit to get a two-year-old to that rating. He's very tough and, as [jockey] Pierre-Louis [Jamin] said after the Chester run, he manages to pick up twice in a race. In our book, the horses that do that are

good horses. He puts his head down and battles it out as well.

"He will get seven furlongs, but I don't know if we need to step up in trip as he does it well as it is. I'd say that will be it for the year and he could be a Commonwealth Cup horse (Gr.1, 1200m) next year."

Ribchester, who shuttles from Darley in the UK to Haunui Farm in New Zealand, has now sired 14 winners from his first crop in Europe.

A four-time Group One winner at a mile, Ribchester stood his first two shuttle seasons at Darley in Australia, and covered 78 mares in his first season at Haunui Farm last season.

A son of Iffraaj, who worked so well in New Zealand, Ribchester is standing his fourth season at Haunui Farm this year for a fee of \$15,000 + GST.
