GROUP ONE DOUBLE A SPECIAL RESULT FOR RICHARDS

amie Richards made the penultimate weekend of his current training stint in New Zealand a memorable one when he produced a Group One winning double at Trentham on Saturday.

Richards, who will enter the next stage of his storied career when he makes the move to Hong Kong in May, will prepare his last runners in New Zealand this coming weekend and made sure he took the opportunity to sign off his local Group One achievements in spectacular style.

After kicking off the day with a stakes victory for Leaderboard (Street

Cry) in the Listed New Zealand St Leger (2600m), Richards hit overdrive when exciting three-year-old filly **Imperatriz** (I Am Invincible) headed home a Te Akau Racing first four in the Gr.1 Levin Classic (1600m) before going agonisingly close to the trifecta in the Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks (2400m) where **Belle En Rouge (NZ)** (Burgundy) defeated Self Obsession (NZ) (Shocking), with The Perfect Pink (NZ) (Savabeel) close up in fourth.

Richards took time out on Sunday to reflect on what he considered another day at the office, albeit one with more action and excitement than most.

"While I'm getting to the end of it here in New Zealand, Saturday was an important part of the job and a day where we wanted to see our horses perform up to their very best," he said.

"To win any Group One is special and to make it two on the day was terrific and due reward for all the hard work our team has put in over the last few months.

"It has been a pretty testing time for everyone with COVID knocking us around and the staff never waivered in their professionalism and dedication and the stable has reaped the reward.

"I think the evidence on Saturday is that the stable has some very exciting horses to work with next season and I'm sure David (Ellis) and Mark (Walker) are looking forward to that.

"We did go into the day with our confidence high and knew if we got some luck we would be there fighting out the finish in those races, but there were also some lovely rides as well which played a big part in the success we had."

Richards also believes that Levin Classic winner Imperatriz had what it takes to compete at a high level in Australia next season if the decision is made to tackle an offshore campaign.

"Mark and David will be doing the planning for a filly like Imperatriz, but I think she can compete at stakes level over in Australia," he said.

"She will need a break now, but next season she could well head over there for a campaign.

"She is such a tractable filly as she showed in her recent races where she got back at Ellerslie and ran home strongly to push Sword Of State close in the Almanzor Trophy (Gr.3, 1200m) and then came out and lead up and blitzed the older mares at Matamata.

"Michael (McNab) gave her a lovely sit on Saturday and she showed an impressive finishing burst, so I think with a good break and natural maturity she can certainly improve again for her next campaign."

The 32-year-old, with 52 Group One wins to his name, will have a chance to add a last stakes victory to his resume' on Saturday with Prise De Fer (NZ) (Savabeel) and Brando (NZ) (Savabeel) to tackle the Gr.2 Ultimate Mazda Japan Trophy (1600m) at Tauranga, before he puts his feet up for a well-deserved spell of his own.

"We will be a bit quiet this weekend as we have a number of horses heading to the spelling paddock, however Brando and Prise De Fer will start in the stakes race at Tauranga," he said.

"Once racing has finished for the day I guess I can have a bit of a break before Danielle and I head up to Hong Kong on May 11.

"We might slip over to Syndey for a couple of weeks as I plan on going to the Easter Yearling Sale there, while we might also go up to the Hunter Valley for a look around as I've never been there before.

"When we get back it will be full on preparing for the move and getting ready for what we will experience in Hong Kong."

While excited about the Hong Kong move, Richards is realistic about the hard work that will be involved for both he and Johnson as they attempt to settle into their new surroundings

"It's a new challenge and an exciting one at that, but there is plenty

to do to make it work," he said,

"I've only been there once before so most things will be new and a bit different to what I'm used to.

"I know I have to really work hard to learn about the methods up there and preparing the horses to fit the environment.

"I will have sixty boxes at Sha Tin to start with and there is the possibility for another twenty at Chonghua later on

"We have some nice young horses getting prepared here in New Zealand while there will be some being transferred into my stable to start things off.

"Danielle and I will be based in an apartment at Sha Tin where the other jockeys, trainers etc. are and we are sending up some familiar possessions, while I'm sure there will be some shopping to do when we get up there.

"I guess there might also be a bit of a send off back here before we go, but how we actually fit that in will be the big question."

Saturday's stakes winning treble took Richards' domestic black-type haul for the current season to 28 just eight shy of the 36 he achieved in the 2020/21 racing season.

QUARTET JET TO SYDNEY AS BAKER-FORSMAN EYE AUSTRALIAN RICHES

n attack on the riches of the New South Wales autumn carnival by trainers Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman gathered momentum when stablemates **The Chosen One (NZ)** (Savabeel), **Regal Lion (NZ)** (Jakkalberry), **White Noise (NZ)** (El Roca) and **Marroni (NZ)** (Makfi) flew to Sydney on Saturday.

The well performed quartet will all be in action this coming weekend as they prepare to tackle Group One targets during the two-day The Championships carnival at Royal Randwick in April.

Both promising stayer Marroni and

established Group One performer The Chosen One are being set for the Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) on April 9, with The Chosen One to have his lead up run in Saturday's Gr.1 Tancred Stakes (2400m) at Rosehill while Marroni will tackle either the Gr.3 Neville Sellwood Stakes (2000m) on the Rosehill card or the Listed Albury Gold Cup (2000m) a day earlier.

"We put four of them on the plane on Saturday and plan to run them all this coming weekend," Baker said.

"Marroni and The Chosen One are both being set for the Sydney Cup, however Marroni may need to win to make it into the final field for that one.

"He was very unlucky at Ellerslie last time as he was badly interfered with during the running and was a bit stiff and sore afterwards.

"It has been pretty wet in Sydney lately and that type of track won't worry him, but it is more a matter of ensuring he is hard fit for a race like the Sydney Cup.

"The Chosen One pulled up really well after running third in the Bonecrusher Stakes (Gr.1, 2000m) at Ellerslie and he has performed well in Sydney before.

"He will start in the Tancred Stakes and then go straight to the Sydney Cup."

The Chosen One enjoys a good record in Sydney having won the Gr.3 Frank Packer Plate (2000m) as a three-year-old following an unlucky run for fourth in the Gr.1 AJC Derby (2400m) while he also finished second in the 2020 Sydney Cup before running sixth in the race last year.

Three-year-old duo Regal Lion and White Noise are set to contest the Gr.1 Australian Derby (2400m) at Randwick on April 2 after finishing third and seventh respectively in the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m) at their last start.

The pair will tackle the Gr.2 Tulloch Stakes (2000m) at Rosehill on Saturday, a race that Baker has won on five previous occasions with Our Palliser (NZ) (Palatable) (1987), The Bill (NZ) (Grosvenor) (1993), Harris Tweed (NZ) (Montjeu) (2009) along with Jon Snow (NZ) (Iffraaj) (2017) and Quick Thinker (So You Think) (2020) when in partnership with Forsman.

"Both of our three-year-olds that we sent over have thrived since their New Zealand Derby runs, but they will need to run well this weekend to justify a start in the Derby," Baker said.

"I don't think a wet track will bother them too much and the tempo of the racing in Sydney will also suit them.

"Once we have seen how they go this Saturday we can confirm whether they go on to the Derby or look for another option."

The master horseman, who hopes to make it to Sydney at some stage through the carnival, is in the final throes of his training career and is set to retire at the beginning of May, with Forsman to take the reins in a solo capacity.

Baker also advised that Gr.1 Sistema Stakes (1200m) winner Lickety Split (NZ) (Turn Me Loose) would attempt to complete a Group One double next month when she tackles the Gr.1 Courtesy Ford Manawatu Sires' Produce Stakes (1400m) at Awapuni on April 2.

determined win in the opening event at Trentham on Saturday may have secured promising two-year-old **Slipper Island** (No Nay Never) a berth in the team that trainer Tony Pike plans to take to the Queensland Winter Carnival this year.

The son of No Nay Never showed

plenty of heart to fight back in the hands of Michael McNab, after being challenged in the straight on Saturday, to defeat Matamata raider Perfectly Suited (NZ) (Savile Row) in the 1200m dash.

A \$180,000 purchase by Pike from the Hallmark Stud draft at the 2021

Karaka Yearling Sale, Slipper Island showed he had learnt plenty from his debut defeat at Ellerslie where he was narrowly beaten by subsequent Gr.1 Sistema Stakes (1200m) winner Lickety Split (NZ) (Turn Me Loose).

"He's a pretty laid-back customer who we had contemplated applying blinkers to for Saturday, but we resisted the temptation," Pike said.

"It was nearly his undoing as he got left alone across the junction when the horse outside dropped away and he started to loaf around a bit.

"Michael said he was still a little green but when the filly came up alongside him near the finish he fought back really well and was holding her comfortably at the finish, with plenty up his sleeve."

Pike will let the dust settle on the victory before deciding any future plans but indicated that he will be well in consideration for a trip to Brisbane if he comes through the race well.

"It's a long way to Wellington and

back for any horse, so he can have a few easy days before we decide anything further for him," he said.

"He wasn't nominated for the big two-year-old races in Brisbane, like the Sires' Produce (Gr.2, 1400m) or JJ Atkins (Gr.1, 1600m) as he wasn't named at that stage.

"If he does go over there and performs well then a late nomination for races like that will be considered."

Pike made it a winning double at Trentham when lightly raced three-year-old **Lebanese Trader** (Shalaa) took out the second race while promising mare Samiam Seussie (Hinchinbrook) went a blinder to secure her first black type placing when finishing third behind Sinarahma (NZ) (Darci Brahma) and Mai Tai (NZ) (Atlante) in the Gr.3 Cuddle Stakes (1600m).

"It was good to see Lebanese Trader win as he has thrown a couple of races away through greenness and immaturity," Pike said.

"He was still a little wayward on Saturday but knuckled down well in the closing stages.

"He has promise but we will take it quietly with him as he is going to be a better horse next season.

"It was great to see Samiam Seussie get some valuable black type as she went an absolute cracker in a race where she was badly off in the weights.

"She only received half a kilogram from the winner and runner-up under the set weights and penalties conditions, although she was rated at least 16 points beneath them.

"In a true handicap she would have been far more competitive and may have even won it with the allowance she would have had.

"She is another promising mare, having just her ninth start, so there is plenty ahead of her in the future."

Pike indicated he would be taking

a team of eight to ten horses to Queensland over the winter including three-year-old Tutukaka (NZ) (Tavistock) who had to be late scratched from the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m) after suffering from a swollen leg on race morning.

"I will be sitting down and working out who we will be taking to Queensland later next week and at this stage it could be up to ten horses," he said.

"One of those will be Tutukaka who has recovered from the problem he had that caused him to be scratched before the Derby.

"We treated him with antiinflammatories that morning and he was as good as gold the next day, so it was pretty disappointing and just bad timing

"I'm excited about campaigning in Brisbane again this year as we have had some good success there and hopefully, we can replicate that again."

One horse who won't be heading away is Gr.2 Waikato Guineas (2000m) winner Field Of Gold (Starspangledbanner), with Pike advising the three-year-old was destined for the spelling paddock before being prepared to tackle the feature events at the Hastings Spring carnival next season.

ZAHRA TAKES OVER ON THE INFERNO

ark Zahra will be the new rider on Karaka graduate and former Singapore star **The Inferno** (Holy Roman Emperor) when he makes his return to The Valley on Friday night.

The Inferno is set to contest the Gr.1 William Reid Stakes (1200m) on Friday night, the track he was successful at in his second start following his arrival from Singapore.

Lane has been aboard The Inferno in his four starts in Melbourne with Regan Bayliss in the saddle for The Everest (1200m) at Randwick last October.

With Lane heading to the Dubai World Cup meeting at Meydan where he has picked up rides on a number of Japanese-trained horses, Zahra has been given the nod for Friday night.

Zahra partnered The Inferno in a jump-out at Balnarring last Wednesday, his second in as many weeks after heading to Woolamai the previous week.

Trainer Cliff Brown said last week's jump-out confirmed The Inferno had recovered from the Gr.1 Lightning Stakes (1000m) at Flemington on February 19.

The Inferno stumbled and almost fell after striking interference at Flemington, before finishing eighth.

"It was a bit wet, but he worked through the line," Brown said.

"It's been five weeks since he ran in the Lightning. I didn't want to push him, but he's come back OK. He was

a bit sore through the back, but he seems alright."

While The Inferno was successful at Group Two level in the McEwen Stakes (1000m) at The Valley last year, Brown is still not sure where the gelding, a winner of nine of his 14 starts, sits in Australian racing.

And the unbeaten Marabi (I Am Invincible) frightens him, especially if The Valley on Friday night is a leaders track.

"She's outstanding and those good horses rarely have an off day," Brown said.

"I know it sounds silly, but I can't really get a guide on him yet. He was good at The Valley both times but then he didn't like the wet track in Sydney.

"He doesn't like wet tracks, that's one thing I do know."

KID BLAZES THROUGH FOR FIRST VICTORY

lazing Kid (NZ) (Swiss Ace)
overcame waywardness to
easily secure his first win in the
\$20,000 Open Maiden race over 1200m
on Saturday.

Prior to the start, the field of 12 saw some newcomers getting restless, which included Kranji Jewel (First Samurai) who played up and threw off apprentice jockey Yusoff Fadzli. He was scratched eventually.

Blazing Kid lost his right-hind shoe behind the gates amid the chaos, but the Singapore Turf Club farriers fixed the issue in no time. Jockey Oscar Chavez made sure he calmed the four-year-old son of Swiss Ace down upon loading.

Not long after jumping, the \$8

favourite had to jostle for the lead however, from then on, Chavez had the race all sewn up. Despite racing greenly, the New Zealand-bred brown gelding still bounded away under a few reminders from the Panamanian-born jockey to score an easy two-and-a-quarter lengths victory.

With Blazing Kid having already placed second twice from two starts, winning trainer Jason Ong thought going one better was not beyond his reach this time.

"I was happy with him coming into the race, so I expected him to run a good race," said the young Singaporean trainer, who was leading in his ninth winner of 2022.

"He was coming along very well

after two seconds and was also getting stronger in terms of physique.

"There were a few horses playing up behind the gates, which probably affected him. Credit to the club farrier who helped replace his shoe before the start.

"He still has a few things to learn and there are a lot of upsides with him. He is a nice horse going forward.

"The owner (Blazing Kid Stable) bought him in a trial in New Zealand. He has been patient with the horse.

"Oscar delivered the job well too."

Chavez said Blazing Kid was still green but he did see the underlying potential in going up to the mile in future.

"The plan was to go in front, but my horse was very green," said the naturalised Singaporean.

"But it was an easy win for him, and he can go up to the 1600m, no problem."
