PATTERSON EYEING ANOTHER BRISBANE VENTURE

obbie Patterson made his mark with a small team at last year's Queensland winter carnival and is keen on a return trip.

The New Plymouth horseman's stable has been in fine form this season with a career-best tally of 39 winners to sit third on the Trainers' Premiership and has several potential travellers to Brisbane with numbers to be firmed up in the coming weeks.

"You've got to be right on top of your game to go over there so we'll see where they all sit in the next fortnight," he said.

High on the list are The Fearless One (NZ) (The Bold One) and Nom De Plume (NZ) (El Roca), who performed with distinction in Brisbane 12 months ago when they accompanied Patterson's now retired dual Group One winner Coventina Bay (NZ) (Shamexpress).

The Fearless One produced a bold showing in his Australian debut when third in the Gr.3 Premier's Cup (2400m) and had no luck in his next appearance.

"With a decent draw he could have won his first one and then he got caught three wide in the Brisbane Cup (Gr.2, 3200m) and you can't do that over two miles," Patterson said.

A son of The Bold One, the five-year-

old has fashioned a tidy record with three wins and five placings from his 11 appearances and is making good progress toward a return to racing.

"He will be having another jumpout on Wednesday and then trial the following week before I find a race somewhere for him," Patterson said.

"There's the Lord Mayor's Cup (Gr.3, 1800m) over there for him on May 27 and the Ipswich Cup (Listed, 2150m) three weeks later, all going well."

Nom De Plume, who won a three-year-old event over 2150m at the Sunshine Coast last winter, was successful over a middle distance two runs before she stepped up in class in the Gr.3 Cuddle Stakes (1600m).

"She ran sixth without much luck and then I backed off her in anticipation that she might be going to Brisbane," Patterson said.

"She'll have a run at New Plymouth on May 13 in a Rating 75 mile and if she goes well we'll probably look at taking her again."

Multiple winners Mary Louise (NZ) (The Bold One), One Bold Cat (NZ) (The Bold One) and Puntura (NZ) (Vespa) are also in the mix for Brisbane, as are a couple of promising younger stablemates.

"I've got a horse called Bow Hill that won her first start (at New Plymouth) the other day and she'll line up again this weekend at Feilding in a threeyear-old race, she looks very promising and she's a chance to go," he said.

"There's also Uraskyfullastars, she's really promising and if she came out

and won her first start on Sunday then she could go as well.

"She won a trial the other day at Otaki and beat Mr Bully Tee, who ran second at Awapuni on Saturday and he looks quite a smart horse.

"She was tentatively sold, but that has fallen through. She could be anything, she's a very smart animal."

Guineas winner to HK

Promising three-year-old Loosespender (NZ) (Turn Me Loose) will continue his career in Hong Kong.

The son of Turn Me Loose came a long way in a short time from Ben Foote's Cambridge stable and following a debut win at Hawera, the grey finished fourth in the Listed Gingernuts Salver (2100m) and then triumphed in the Gr.2 Waikato Guineas (2000m).

Loosespender is owned by the Hong Kong-based Upper Bloodstock and was raced by them in New Zealand on a short-term lease arrangement with Foote and Stride Racing Club Syndicate.

Meanwhile, top sprinting mare Babylon Berlin is enjoying time out in the paddock following her last-start seventh in the Gr.1 William Reid Stakes (1200m) at Moonee Valley.

"She pulled up super after that, we probably could have carried on but decided to pull the pin and she's in the paddock," Foote said.

Babylon Berlin enjoyed a lucrative but frustrating domestic campaign with Group One runner-up finishes in the Railway (1200m), the Telegraph (1200m) and the BCD Group Sprint (1400m) before she romped home in the Gr.3 King's Plate (1200m).

LOWRY LOOKING TO MAKE RIDING MARK IN AUSTRALIA

f Ciaron Maher and David Eustace need any more evidence of Jacob Lowry's riding ability, they can just watch his efforts to win Saturday's Listed Easter Cup (1600m) at Riccarton aboard Times Ticking (NZ) (Tavistock).

Lowry heads back across the Tasman next week for a second autumn stint riding work for the leading Australian stable – and this year he's keen to spend more time riding in races as well.

"I'm going back this time just looking to build on that and try to make the most of my opportunities," Lowry said.

"Last year was a great experience over there. I only had the one raceday ride there last time, but to be fair it probably wasn't in the front of my focus.

"This time the race riding is definitely a focus. I have a lot more familiarity with Ciaron and David and it will literally be up to me, with my weight and whatnot, and if they throw me a bone I've just got to make the most of it."

Lowry returned to Otago last winter to help with foaling at his grandfather Brian Anderton's White Robe Lodge, and while working there he didn't ride in races and his weight got up more than he wanted.

The 25-year-old questioned whether he wanted to keep riding in races, but eventually decided to keep going and returned to the saddle in November. His rides are limited by his weight, which has been about 59kg, but he's ridden seven winners from 58 rides.

He had to be good to guide Times Ticking home, not only because the horse was giving away 6.5kg to his two main rivals



Tyler Eight and Our Echo, but also because the gelding tended to lay into the others while making his challenge.

"He's certainly quirky. He likes getting in close, but once he did get in close he seemed to lengthen his stride," Lowry said.

"He's definitely one of those horses who the more you know about him, the easier he is to ride. He certainly knows where the winning post is."

Lowry hopes to make it a black-type double with Times Ticking if the seven-year-old as expected backs up in the Gr.3 Coca-Cola Canterbury Gold Cup (2000m) at Riccarton next Saturday, though it means giving up the ride on his regular mount Exchange, from the Brian and Shane Anderton team.

"It's a difficult decision because Exchange has very loyal owners, but I think Times Ticking is very well in at weight-forage next week and it's pretty hard to get off him really."

Lowry said he very much enjoyed foaling horses at White Robe Lodge this spring, and in particular he's been excited by the first crop by the farm's new stallion Ancient Spirit.

A son of notable stallion Invincible Spirit, Ancient Spirit is out of the Galileo mare Assisi, who hails from the family of Melbourne Cup winner Almandin. Despite the stamina genes on his distaff side, Ancient Spirit was a Group Two winner at 1600m and has the potential to produce runners over a variety of distances.

"We're just weaning a lot of the Ancient Spirits right now and they're looking pretty exciting," Lowry said.

"I think they'll get up and run. He certainly complements our mares very well. The fact that ours are bred to get that extra trip, and all the foals he's left, he's put a lot of leg into them and they've come to hand very quickly. Even when they're weaning they've shown good enthusiasm and good attitudes.

"As a racehorse they look like they'll come to hand fairly quickly. I want to get a chance to ride them."

Lowry expects to be back in July once more after his stint with Maher and Eustace. He said he is learning a lot from them not only in terms of riding but also with an eye towards potentially training at a later time in his career.

"They're very good at what they do and they're not onetrick ponies either. They train top sprinters, Melbourne Cup winners, and top jumpers as well. With that dynamic there's plenty to take in from them." – **NZ Racing Desk**

THOROUGHBREDS A KEY SECTOR IN TAIMATE TRIUMVIRATE

ince 1905, the Hickman family have farmed a 168ha parcel of land known as Taimate on State Highway 1 just outside of Blenheim.

Renowned for producing high quality Angus cattle stud stock and premium Sauvignon Blanc grapes, a chance meeting with the late Chris Luoni, a well-known thoroughbred enthusiast, and driving force behind the establishment of the NZ Racing Hall of Fame, saw brothers John, Paul, and David and the 'Taimate' brand expand into thoroughbred breeding.

Thoroughbred racing is not

completely new to the Hickman family, their father Ossie and grandfather Jack were former presidents and life members of the Marlborough Racing Club.

However, after having a bit of fun when taking over their father's racing interests and then crossing paths with Chris, the brothers identified they had the necessary fundamentals to do things commercially and figured they should turn a bit of fun into something more serious, and Taimate Equine was born.

In 2018, Taimate made the first entry

in their equine ledger after acquiring in-foal broodmare Mistaar. Since then, the brothers have carefully explored as many aspects of the industry as they could on a small budget to learn and gain the necessary experience to gradually become more commercial.

"We started out in 2018 with a plan to get involved in as many aspects of the industry as we could in a small way, on a shoestring budget, to learn and gain experience," David Hickman said.

"Since then, we've bought another mare, continued breeding, syndicated

to race, created a brand and racing silks, bought at yearling sales, sold at the yearling sales, sold online, invested in young stock for trading and invested in stallion shares.

"It's been a rollercoaster journey with some initial tough times, but this year in particular has seen plenty of success.

"All combined, it has given us a huge boost of confidence that we have what it takes to be successful thoroughbred breeders."

One horse racing in their green and black silks marked with a 'T' is Taimate Diva, the foal purchased in utero with Mistaar. The Andrew Carston-trained daughter of Telperion has won two and placed in two of her last four starts and is a promising staying mare.

Expanding into thoroughbred

breeding has not been without its challenges for the brothers. Their location means they have limited access to expert resources such as equine vets and farriers, and a lack of proximity to other studs creates logistical challenges.

They've been able to negate some of these hurdles with the help of knowledgeable Marlborough locals and the Taimate Angus staff who happen to also be skilled horse people.

"We don't have any official advisors but every time we've reached out to others in the industry for advice or to visit and see how they do things, we have had a fantastic response," Hickman said. "One of the most enjoyable aspects of getting involved in the thoroughbred industry has been just how good the people are."

As Taimate Equine expands year on year, John, Paul and David will strategically plan and invest accordingly to fulfil their long-term goal of becoming a highly successful boutique breeding operation that produces champion athletes.

Recent investment in significant local land purchases to increase their land to over 1500ha has enabled all three Taimate businesses to co-exist. While one third of the operation may seem significantly different to the others, all three are very complimentary of each other.

"The vineyards complement the dry stock operations and provide great business diversification," Hickman said.

"Significant local land purchases in the last year have relieved the competition between the business units for the best land. Ultimately, we all get on well while having our individual roles which just seems to work."

Taimate is in one of the driest regions of New Zealand. Prone to drought, it is a tough place to farm consistently. The construction of onfarm dams capturing excess winter river flow allowed diversification into Sauvignon Blanc grape production which has seen Taimate as a business thrive.

That same harsh climate producing outstanding Angus cattle and world class Sauvignon Blanc is also perfect for producing high quality, tough equine athletes. The three units fit the land, the climate and their passions and according to David, combining them just makes sense.

mere nose separated Roger James and Robert Wellwood from a perfect result on what was still a successful weekend for the Cambridge training duo.

James travelled south to Hastings with in-form stable runners **Pinion (NZ)** (Pins) and **Avalene (NZ)** (Vadamos) for the first Hawke's Bay Racing Inc. fixture since the region was inundated by Cyclone Gabrielle in mid-February.

He was on a dual mission, however, with his intention to confirm on

Saturday how the six-figure flood relief fund he and associates had raised would be allocated.

"We had done a lot of homework around various organisations aiding the people who had been so terribly affected by the cyclone," James said.

"The most prominent one was the East Coast Rural Support Trust, and when I drove down into the Esk Valley and realised the scale of the devastation, I rang our four main contributors for their permission to allocate the full amount to the Rural Support Trust.

"We really wanted to see all the money raised go directly to those in need, and as the Rural Support Trust had explained, the Government subsidy that takes care of their administration costs saw to that.

"When I explained all that to our key supporters, they were unanimous that the Rural Support Trust fitted our intentions."

The Hawke's Bay club had played a major role in the immediate cyclone response, opening its facilities to the community and using the racecourse as a distribution point for donated goods.

As part of the return to racing on Saturday, HBTRI hosted a function involving the Rural Support Trust and volunteers as well as a number of families who had been directly impacted by the cyclone.

"I was invited to the function and it gave me a huge amount of pleasure to announce on behalf of all of those involved at our end, that the \$190,000 raised in donations would go to the Trust bank account," James said.

"I got a standing ovation and it was very emotional but I stressed to everyone that it wasn't about me – it was about a whole lot of people from the racing industry who had got behind it."

James and his inner group had been joined in the initiative by former Hawke's Bay identity Tony Rider, now a Hamilton supermarket franchiseholder, who organised the collation and transport of essential grocery items.

"As well as the \$190,000, in the first week after the cyclone we were also able to purchase more than \$100,000 worth of supermarket essentials for first response delivery.

"That says a lot about who we are as an industry, which really is something to be proud of."

Out on the track on Saturday, James saddled up the promising staying mare

Avalene for the third win in her last four starts in the Rating 75 Vintech Poverty Bay Cup (2500m), and fellow four-year-old Pinion for the closest of seconds in the Listed Power Farming Hawke's Bay Cup (2200m).

"Avalene has a very bright future, but that will be it for now," James said. "She was backing up from her win at Pukekohe last week and she can go to the paddock now."

The daughter of Vadamos races in the colours of her breeder, Joan Egan, and is a half-sister to her star performer Concert Hall (NZ) (Savabeel), the winner of 11 of her 34 starts headed by the Gr. 1 Zabeel Classic (2000m).

"As always, Joan has allowed us to take as much time as we need with Avalene and it's very satisfying to see that patience rewarded," James said.

"When she comes back next season I think she's a chance to get two miles."

James also has a lot of time for Pinion, a gelding by Pins raced by his breeder Peter Doughty and still lightly tried with three wins and three seconds from 12 starts.

After his win late last month in the Rating 75 Kuripuni Sports Bart & TAB Masterton Cup, the decision was made to try Pinion in the Hawke's Bay Cup and it almost came off with a nose second to Fierce Flight (Flying Artie).

"With Colorado Star (NZ) (Alamosa) clearly highest rated at the top of the field, the weights were compressed and that worked against a horse like him," James said.

"It would have meant a lot to win, that would have capped off a special day, but he still performed with great credit.

"We have yet to make a decision, but we might send him to Melbourne for one run to round off his season."

Closer to home at Te Rapa on Saturday, Wellwood held up his side of the partnership with a win to the enigmatic **Roccia (NZ)** (Iffraaj) and a second placing to **Cullinan (NZ)** (Vadamos).

"Roccia has always been a good trackworker but hasn't reproduced that on raceday, and she did have two feet on a banana skin," James said.

"I said to Robert I wasn't prepared to give up on her, so we decided to take the blinkers off, train her in the paddock – pop her over some logs, that sort of thing – and she was a different horse this time."

James and Wellwood are enjoying a fruitful season with 32 wins and eighth place on the trainers' premiership building further on their tally of 37 and 10th place last season.

The star of the team has been trans-Tasman Group One winner **Prowess** (**NZ**) (Proisir), who was back home and in the spelling paddock days after her runaway victory in last month's Gr. 1 Vinery Stud Stakes (2000m).

"Yes, we're having another good season," James said. "The exciting thing is we've unearthed one that could be anything."

ALLEN MAKES WINNING START TO RIDING CAREER

pprentice jockey Jessica Allen made the perfect start to her riding career at Te Rapa on Saturday when notching up her first win aboard Aotea Lad (NZ) (Savabeel) in the Traffic Management Waikato LTD 1400.

It was Allen's first day of race riding and she was quietly confident of a bold performance from the Group Two winner, having tasted success aboard the gelding at the trials last month.

"It was really exciting to get that first win," Allen said.

"He was the one I was the most excited about riding because I had ridden him in a couple of trials and he had gone really well in those for me."

Allen is apprenticed to Te Akau trainer Mark Walker and she was pleased to reward his faith in her on Saturday.

"I started working for Te Akau a couple of months ago. I was going to Matamata once a week for track work and Mark approached me and offered me an apprenticeship and I thought I might as well give it a go and see what happens," Allen said.

"It has been really good so far and it was great to get the win for Mark on Saturday."

Allen has always had a love for horses and her interest in racing was piqued when she began to work in a stable during the school holidays.

"My family isn't really horsey, but I always really liked horses and we got ponies when I was 10 or 11," she said.

"I worked for Jeremy Whale when I was 15 over the school holidays and went from there.

"I am from Morrisville and in the mornings before school I would go over to Te Aroha to ride track work for Scott Wenn and after school I went freelancing in Cambridge and I was with Murray Baker for a few years."

Allen kept her dream of becoming a jockey in check until a couple of years ago when she realised she would fit the stature.

"I always wanted to be a jockey but I thought I would get too tall or too big," she said.

"When I was 18 and realised I would be small enough, I thought I would really knuckle down and give it a go."

Walker has been impressed with Allen's riding ability and was rapt for the 20-year-old when securing her first raceday win.

"He's (Aotea Lad) an experienced horse and an ideal ride for Jess, and sometimes these types of horses really appreciate a

quiet young rider and just do their best for them," he said.

"He's one of the stable favourites and a real gentleman. He had a float accident in the spring, we nursed him back to health, and good on the owners for sticking with him."

New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing riding master Noel Harris has also been pleased with Allen's progress and he believes she has a bright future in the saddle.

"Jess has had a fantastic preparation before race day riding and those involved have been patient with her," he said.

"I think the amount of trial rides she has had has helped her immensely and she's come out and shown on her first day riding that she had the necessary skills to deal with it.

"She looked comfortable and she's ended up with a winner and two fourths from three rides, so I am very happy with her.

"She's very tidy on a horse and shows a lot of professionalism, so I'm very proud of her." – **NZ Racing Desk**





PUKETIRO CONTINUES GOLDEN RUN

xciting filly **Puketiro (NZ)**(Savabeel) continued her fine run of form at Te Rapa on Saturday when comfortably accounting for her opposition in the Tuatahi First Fibre 3YO (1200m).

The Mark Walker-trained filly settled in just behind the speed for jockey Vinnie Colgan and showed her superior turn of foot in the closing stages when dashing between runners to record a 3-1/4 length victory over stablemate I Choose You (I Am Invincible).

It was the third win from four starts for the daughter of Savabeel, who carries the gold and green silks of breeders and co-owners Christopher and Susanna Grace.

"It was another really nice performance," Walker said.

"She's been a bit highly strung, so a work in progress, but just keeps improving and has any amount of ability."

Guineas wish with Embellish's son

The powerful Te Akau operation already has hopes the Mark Walkertrained **What You Wish For (NZ)** (Embellish) can match the racing highlight of his sire.

The juvenile is by Cambridge Stud stallion Embellish, who was victorious in the Gr.1 New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m) and his son took an early winning step toward Riccarton with victory in the Thank You Resource For Your Help in The Community 2YO (1300m) at Hastings on Saturday.

"He's a beautiful animal with a big heart and he's going to grow into a lovely three-year-old," Te Akau Racing Manager Reece Trumper said.

"What he's doing now is a bonus. He looks like he will be a 2000 Guineas horse for the team."

What You Wish For finished runner-up on debut at Matamata where he was hampered at the top of the straight before rounding off strongly.

At Hastings, he bounded

straight to the front under Craig Grylls and forged clear with ease in the run home for a clear-cut victory.

"He began well and gave a good kick at the top of the straight. He's got a ton of ability and is still learning his craft," Grylls said.

What You Wish For was purchased out of breeder Cambridge Stud's Karaka draft for \$60,000 by Te Akau's David Ellis, who earlier this year went to \$190,000 for the half-sister by Savabeel.
