MEMSIE OPTION FOR DRAGON LEAP

here is a strong chance the Lance O'Sullivan and Andrew Scotttrained **Dragon Leap** (Pierro) will be seen in action at Caulfield rather than Te Rapa this weekend, with the highly-talented six-year-old amongst the 20-strong nominations for the Gr.1 Memsie Stakes (1400m) on Saturday.

With wet weather forecast in the lead-up to the Gr.2 Waikato Stud Foxbridge Plate (1200m) at Te Rapa, where the track is currently heavy, the Matamata conditioners are keeping their options open.

The son of Pierro made an impressive return to racing when a closing second over 1100m behind Imperatriz (I Am Invincible) at Ruakaka earlier this month. He has been well supported in futures markets for both the Foxbridge Plate (\$6) and the Gr.1 Tarzino Trophy (1400m) (\$4.80).

The multiple Group Two winner has raced on just four occasions in

the past two years due to injury and is on the cusp of making what shapes as a competitive Memsie field with a capacity of 16.

"Fortunately, the flights are not until Wednesday afternoon, so we should be able to see if he makes the field for the Memsie and also keep a close eye on the weather," Scott said of the 96-rater.

"He hasn't handled wet ground in the past and with the softer nature of

the ground in New Zealand at present, we would like to get some consistent racing into him on better footing."

Michael Dee has been tentatively booked to ride Dragon Leap should he step out at Caulfield on Saturday, with Scott admitting the chances of the horse returning for the Tarzino Trophy at Hastings are slim.

"If he was to not run as well as we hoped in the Memsie, then there is a chance that he could be back for the second day at Hastings."

Scott was pleased with Dragon Leap's first-up run, particularly given his frustrating preparation last season.

"We couldn't have been more pleased with his first-up run. He settled well and quickened well and has come on in such an encouraging manner." Scott said.

"All the team are so pleased to see him back to somewhere we knew he could.

"We had such a frustrating run with

him last season with his feet, he was below his best. We are confident he is in good form and what will hopefully be a successful season in front of him."

Australia is something the Matamata operation is also contemplating with fellow Group Two winner **Dark Destroyer (NZ)** (Proisir), however, his imminent targets lie in his homeland.

"We will take it one race at a time with him. He is going to have a trial (at Taupo) on Wednesday," Scott said.

"David and Dianne (Archer, owners) were quite keen to run him at Hastings in the first race (Gr.1 Tarzino Trophy, 1400m) and then look to options from there.

"It looks to be a good kick-off point which keeps him closer to home in this early part of the spring."

Reflecting on racing at Ruakaka on Saturday, Scott was relieved to see Sonofabutcher (NZ) (Buffalo Man) get up for a well-deserved win in the Fireco (1600m). The son of Buffalo Man had strung together a couple of placings and Scott said luck hadn't been on his side in those runs.

"He certainly deserved it," Scott said. "He has been racing without a lot of luck in his last two or three starts, so it was good to see him get a well-deserved win.

"Whilst he is racing well, we will continue on with him. He has had a bit of racing now but has had good spacing.

"It was encouraging to see the good turn of foot he showed on Saturday. He is racing well."

Meanwhile, Karaka Million 3YO Classic (1600m) placegetter **Karman Line (NZ)** (Myboycharlie) pleased with her 1000m trial at Avondale last week, however, it may be a while before punters see her on raceday.

"She is a typical young mare that has been a bit slow to come to it in her coat and condition," Scott said.

"We won't be rushing with her, we are hoping that her trial last week will just stimulate her coat and appetite and we will look to find somewhere to go.

"Craig (Grylls) rode her the other day and was quite cautious of the soft ground, he said she was able to just handle it. We might have to show a bit of patience with her and wait for some firmer ground.

"By doing that it will give her a chance to come in her coat and condition a bit more.

"We haven't made any plans with her, but it was so encouraging to see her trial in the manner she did the other day." – NZ Racing Desk

Melody Belle has first foal

Champion New Zealand mare **Melody Belle (NZ)** (Commands) has given birth to her first foal, a filly by Written Tycoon, on Saturday night.

The daughter of Commands was bought as a yearling by Te Akau principal David Ellis and she went on to win 14 Group One races for Fortuna Syndications before being sold as a broodmare in Australia for A\$2.6 million to Yulong Investments.

"We are absolutely thrilled with the first foal of Melody Belle," said Yulong's Chief Operating Officer, Sam Fairgray.

"You could not get a better first foal. A super job by the mare."







NORTHERN MOVE PAYING OFF

FOR BARNES

n admirable mix of talent and hard graft were rewarded when Courtney Barnes successfully combined with leading filly Lickety Split (NZ) (Turn Me Loose) at Ruakaka on Saturday.

The 28-year-old jockey made the decision 12 months ago to head north to Waikato to further her career and dedication to the cause delivered her biggest result on Saturday.

Barnes regularly rides trackwork for Lickety Split's trainer Andrew Forsman and was rewarded with the mount on last season's Gr.1 Sistema Stakes (1200m) winner in the Gr.3 Northland Breeders' Stakes (1200m).

In a copybook display, she gave the filly a dream run in fourth spot to the turn before driving strongly to the line to claim top honours.

"It was awesome. I galloped her on the Thursday morning and she gave me a really good feel. I definitely thought she was very capable of winning the race," she said.

"It panned out the way I hoped and she will take a lot of benefit from the race."

Forsman has yet to decide on the next step for Lickety Split and Barnes remains understandably hopeful she may get another opportunity to partner the three-year-old.

"Fingers crossed, but we'll have to wait and see what happens," she said

Saturday's result was Barnes' seventh at stakes level and her second Group Three victory, having won the White Robe Lodge Stakes (1600m) aboard Coulee (NZ) (Gallant Guru) in 2017.

"I moved to Cambridge a year ago

and it's taken a while to find my feet, but it's definitely starting to pay off now," she said.

"I ride a lot of trackwork for Andrew and Stephen Marsh and the opportunities are coming. I just want to ride as often as I can and ride as many winners as I can."

Barnes served her apprenticeship with Coulee's trainers Brian and Shane Anderton following a background in pony club, show jumping and eventing.

She began race riding in February, 2012 and posted her first winner seven weeks later at her fifth ride aboard Cheap Date (NZ) (Personal Escort) at Wingatui.

Barnes comes from a well-known New Zealand racing family, her grandfather Mick Didham was a jockey as was his brother Midge, who won a Gr.1 Melbourne Cup (3200m) on Baghdad Note (NZ) (Kurdistan).

He also finished runner-up in the Flemington feature on Igloo (NZ) (Artic Explorer) and won an Auckland Cup (3200m), Wellington Cup (3200m) and two Caulfield Cups (2400m).

Barnes will be hoping to continue her run of form at Taupo on Wednesday with rides aboard the Marsh-trained pair of Margaret Jean (NZ) (Sacred Falls) and Provence (NZ) (Savabeel), having been aboard both in their lead-up trials.

Margaret Jean has won two of her eight starts and the daughter of Sacred Falls will make her first appearance in the Noverre @ Waikato Stud Handicap (1300m) since she ran third in the Dunstan Stayers' Championship Final (2400m) at Ellerslie on New Year's Day.

"I'm expecting her to go okay freshup and she will be better when she gets over a bit more ground later on," Barnes said.

Savabeel filly Provence will debut in the Ribchester & Belardo @ Haunui Farm Maiden (1200m). "Provence is a nice horse, I really like her. She had a couple of trials on quite wet tracks and she didn't really handle them that well," Barnes said.

"Hopefully, it's not that wet at Taupo and she definitely trialled better in her second one at Avondale."

Graffard looking for more distance with Verry Elleegant

The connections of **Verry Elleegant (NZ)** (Zed) are looking forward to getting the mare over more ground after a disappointing first-up run in France overnight.

The 11-time Group One winner was having her first start for trainer Francis Graffard in the green colours of part-owners Jomara Bloodstock in the Gr.1 Prix Jean Romanet (2000m) and uncharacteristically put in a subpar run to tail the field home after racing at the rear throughout in a sedately run contest.

"I think it's fair to say that we are all a bit deflated. It has been months in the build-up making sure the logistics were right and she had acclimatised, and had the right programme," part-owner Brae Sokolski told RSN.

"We felt like everything was on song for her to perform well.

"While I do feel like there are excuses, there is no denying the fact that she has run last and she was not the Verry Ellegant we have come to expect."

While naturally disappointed with the run of the New Zealand-bred seven-year-old, her ownership group are putting a line through that run and are looking to press on to the Gr.1 Prix Vermeille (2400m) at Longchamp on September 11.

"It's not a fact of throwing the baby out with the bath water, we do feel like



there were enough excuses to justify giving her another opportunity to step up in distance," Sokolski said.

"The Prix Vermeille in three weeks is going to be D-Day and we will be wanting to see a more characteristic performance from her."

RACING FAREWELLS ONE OF ITS GREATEST SUPPORTERS



enny Moroney was well known as the father of prominent identities Michael and Paul Moroney, however, his reach went far beyond his immediate family to encompass countless members of the racing community.

Tributes and memories of the man known to many simply as Horace have abounded since he passed away at age 93 on Saturday morning following a period of hospitalisation.

His name will forever be linked to Ballymore Stables, but his initial passion for racing dated much further back.

He grew up with horses in his life, while his wife Mary's parents had a heavy involvement that included breeding Centenary Melbourne Cup winner Hi Jinx (NZ) (Pride Of Kidare).

The decision to sell their Walton dairy farm and relocate to Matamata township coincided with Mike founding Ballymore Stables in 1982.

For the family patriarch, retirement was less of a lure than freeing him up to become a full participant in stable activities.

On a daily basis he joined Ballymore staff, walking stable members to and from the track, saddling up and hosing down, and travelling and strapping them at race meetings.

"Dad's passion for racing came more from Mum's side of the family, but I remember him telling me about riding work at the Waharoa Aerodrome on horses owned and trained by his father," Paul Moroney, a noted bloodstock agent, recalled.

"Once he had a family, he would supplement income from the farm by working part-time at Evergreen Lodge, which was just around the corner from home.

"Also our next-door neighbour at the time was fellow racing enthusiast lan Signal, who stood Lord Sasanof and owner-trained horses he bred.

"The best of them was Johnny Cash (NZ) (Lord Sasanof), who Dad became the regular strapper for and even included taking him by trailer-float to Auckland to meet the legendary American musician he had been named him after.

"It's incredible to think they took the horse to the Hotel Intercontinental and put him in the service lift up three floors to meet his namesake.

"It was broadcast live on the nightly TV show Town And Around and us kids waited up until Dad got home to hear all about it.

"I can still remember how bemused he was that Johnny Cash, who always dressed as a cowboy, was scared of horses."

Moroney senior was the primary influence in his two elder sons' interest in racing, something that he was only too willing to foster.

Love Reigns supreme at Saratoga

Love Reigns became her sire U S Navy Flag's second stakes winner when she was victorious in the US\$150,000 Bolton Landing Stakes (1100m) at Saratoga on Sunday.

It was the juvenile filly's second win from three starts, having finished fourth in the Gr.2 Queen Mary Stakes (1000m) at Royal Ascot in her previous start.

Trainer Wesley Ward is now looking to target the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Sprint at Keeneland on November 4 with his filly.

U S Navy Flag shuttles to The Oaks Stud in Cambridge, where he stands for a fee of \$15,000+GST. The well-credentialled son of War Front has had six northern hemisphere first-crop winners to date, including Ocean Vision, who was a Listed winner in France earlier this month.

"Once Dad realised Mike and I were as keen as him, going to the races became a regular activity, to Matamata, Te Rapa, Te Aroha, Paeroa and other tracks in the region as well as big days like the Great Northerns at Ellerslie on Queen's Birthday weekend.

"He nurtured our passion – that's where it all started for us – but as well as that, especially when he got involved in Ballymore, he looked out for so many other young people.

"He was a friend to virtually everyone at the Matamata track and in racing's wider circle he was able to mix with people at all levels.

"He travelled to the races in the float with everyone else until well into his eighties and he was still a registered stablehand when he turned 90." Over the past couple of years his trackwork sessions had to be curtailed, but he made sure to drop in and reconnect with his fellow workers and friends on the morning of his 93rd birthday in April.

"Dad's legacy is huge, not just within his own family but across such a wide spectrum," added Paul Moroney.

"Since the word went out that he had passed away I've had something like 800 messages and phone calls, which tells you just how well thought of he was."

Denny Moroney's funeral will take place at Matamata's Anglican Church at 11am on Thursday, with his own parish church, the Holy Angels, currently undergoing renovation.

BILLY'S BACK AND TARZINO BOUND



Group One winner Ocean Billy will trial at Taupo this week (Trish Dunell)

ast year's Gr.1 Auckland Cup (3200m) winner **Ocean Billy** (NZ) (Ocean Park) is somewhat of a surprise nomination for the Gr.1 Tarzino Trophy (1400m) at Hawke's Bay on September 10.

The seven-year-old looked likely to be sidelined for the year following a tendon injury suffered when cast in his box in the Sydney stables of Chris Waller back in February.

However, the gelding, who has recently returned to the care of original trainer and part-owner Bill Pomare after a fruitless Caulfield and Melbourne Cup campaign last spring, has made giant strides and he is likely to be seen back at the trials this week.

"He is very well. He came back from Australia super fit and he kept very active but his leg has settled down. There was hardly any sign of a tendon problem with him," Pomare said.

"We brought him into work maybe seven weeks ago. He has bulked up and probably grown another hand and looks a different horse.

"He has that Australian polish on him that he developed in those few extra months they kept him over there.

"I couldn't be happier with him. He will go to the trials on the 24th at Taupo and from there straight to the Tarzino."

Pomare was unable to travel to Melbourne last spring due to COVID restrictions, denying the build-up to the Cup first-hand access to one of life's great characters.

After a credible effort for ninth in the Gr.1 Caulfield Cup (2400m), that run proved too taxing on the popular underdog,

with Ocean Billy trailing the Melbourne Cup field home as star New Zealand bred mare Verry Elleegant (NZ) (Zed) raced away to a stirring victory.

"The Caulfield Cup took a bit out of him and he didn't eat a lot and he lost a bit of weight so had no petrol in the tank," Pomare said.

"Chris was getting him ready for the Sydney Cup and before the first lead up race he rolled and got cast in his box and struck himself around the tendon.

"He was give anti-inflammatories straight away and although it was swollen, he never went lame.

"Because flights got cancelled and a few different things, it took ages to get him back home and he looked magnificent when he arrived. He looked like he was ready to go into a race straight away.

"I was leading him down the race and he was rearing and carrying on. I'd never seen anything like it.

"He improved every day from then and exercised himself in the paddock so by the time he came into work he had quite a bit of fitness."

Pomare also took the horse in to be given the once-over at Matamata Vets and received the tick of approval.

The Rotorua horseman has no regrets about the failed Melbourne Cup bid and said that sentiment played a significant part, fulfilling the wish of part-owner Peter Ludgate to have a Cup runner, with Ludgate having since passed.

"Probably in a way it was a pity I couldn't have gone over with him because we do things a little bit

different to what other people do with their horses," Pomare said.

"He has just been like a big pet to us and he enjoys that and responds to that and once he got over there he did fret a bit.

"We knew that Peter was on borrowed time and he wouldn't see another Melbourne Cup Day.

"In hindsight, a mile and a half race on firmer footing and then going back this year would have been the go."

Pomare has confidence that his versatile galloper can make an impression on the Hawke's Bay Triple Crown series.

"He can sprint a mean 1000m this horse and in the Auckland Cup that is what got him home. He can do it. He has won over 1400m and over a mile and I think he can sprint well fresh," Pomare said.

The Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m) on October 15 is expected to be the most suitable target for the son of

Ocean Park while there are other Group One weight-for-age options into summer, although should he come up particularly well, Pomare hasn't ruled out a raid to Australia as any Trans-Tasman black-type would bolster the pedigree.

"I have a full brother going to the Karaka Sales next year that Waikato Stud have been preparing for me and they have a high opinion of him," Pomare said.

"His mother Cool Storm (NZ) (One Cool Cat) is due to foal in a couple of weeks to Ocean Park again. I haven't decided where she will go this year."

Pomare is working a small team of three and said the horses are a family passion.

"I am just fortunate my wife Suzi is my number one stable person, she does everything and loves horses and my son's partner Laura rides work as well, so it is all taken care of," he said. – NZ Racing Desk





CAMERON LAMMAS SET TO REJOIN JOCKEY RANKS

fter nearly two years on the sideline, Cameron Lammas is ready to resume his jockey career.

Lammas has not ridden competitively since mid-September 2020 after being stood down due to a positive test to methamphetamine.

That incurred a 12-month disqualification, with a three-month concession clause provided he completed a Salvation Army Bridge programme.

However, after undergoing the rehabilitation programme and completing his disqualification, Lammas opted to continue as a self-employed handyman working close by the Rotorua home he shares with his wife Tracey and young sons Blake and Kurt.

Last year he answered the call to return to trackwork riding duties at Matamata racecourse, assisting long-time supporters Pam Gerard and Ken and Bev Kelso.

"I've enjoyed coming over for gallop mornings with people I know, but I wasn't ready to start race-riding again," 38-year-old Lammas said between rides at the track this week.

"I've had a rethink lately and I'm going to get the paperwork done and hopefully kick off at the trials next month.

"That will help tell me how fit I am and I'll take it from there.

"My weight's remained good – I haven't had to get a new wardrobe and when I jumped on the scales the other day I was 56 kilos – so it shouldn't be too tough getting rid of a couple more."

Lammas admits that he fell foul of racing rules during a difficult period in his life, but thanks to the support of his wife and close confidants, he's keen about what the future holds.

"I was going through a bad time and I made some wrong decisions, but that's behind me, now it's about what's ahead."

Lammas served his apprenticeship with noted mentor Jim Gibbs and scored his first Group One win on Calveen (NZ) (Canny Lad) – also a first in the training career of former

champion jockey Lance O'Sullivan – in the 2005 Easter Handicap at Ellerslie.

Two wins at the start of the 2020-21 season took Lammas past the 800-win mark, providing an obvious target to motivate him in his comeback.

"I'd love to ride 1,000 winners, so that's one thing to aim towards, but just getting back riding on raceday would be a good start." – NZ Racing Desk




