HO HO KHAN WINS HOBART CUP

allarat-based trainer Mitchell Freedman will chase a \$100,000 bonus after his former Hong Kong-galloper **Ho Ho Khan (NZ)** (Makfi) took out the Gr.3 \$250,000 Ladbrokes Hobart Cup (2400m) on Sunday.

A last start winner at Caulfield over 2000 metres on 8 January, the seven-year-old claimed the first of Tasmania's feature Cups double with Victorian apprentice Tahlia Hope in the saddle.

Following the horse's fourth start in Australia after transferring from Hong Kong, Freedman credited fellow trainer David Hall for the New Zealand-bred Ho Ho Khan (\$5.50) making the successful transition.

"David Hall in Hong Kong suggested that the horse came here (to Australia) and we're thankful for David doing that as he's been a really good addition to the stable," Freedman told tasracing.com.au.

"To win a feature race like this in Tasmania is a real thrill.

"He's a really good horse and we were rapt with the way the track was presented."

Despite the race being on Freedman's radar for some time, it was only in the days prior that the decision was made to cross the Tasman Sea.

"We hadn't had a run for a little bit, but he worked that good on Tuesday morning at Ballarat that we just had to bring him here," Freedman said.

"He's done well since he's been here with Scott Brunton and Tahlia rode the horse perfectly."

Hope noted that despite being caught in an awkward position midrace, Ho Ho Khan's toughness was the difference to score by 4-lengths in 2:32.59 over In A Twinkling (Fastnet Rock) and White Hawk (Tough Speed) 1½-lengths away in third.

All being well after race day, Freedman is eyeing the rich bonus available should Ho Ho Khan also snare the Gr.3 Launceston Cup (2400m) on 23 February.

Bred by Westbury Stud principal Gerry Harvey from his former resident stallion Makfi, Ho Ho Khan did his early racing in New Zealand from the Tony Pike stable where he went under the name Mulanchi.

He won one of his four starts for Pike before being sold to his Hong Kong connections, where he was successful on four occasions before transferring to Freedman where he has added two further wins and now sports total career prizemoney of A\$1.646 million.

Earlier on the card Kiwi-bred galloper **More Than Exceed (NZ)** (More Than Ready) took out the Listed Mills New Norfolk Thomas Lyon Stakes (1400m) in the hands of Ismail Toker for trainer Phillip Stokes.

The six-year-old More Than Ready gelding was bred locally under Dato Yap Kim San's Raffles Dancers (NZ) Pty Ltd banner out of their Exceed And Excel mare Exceedingly Ready and comes from the family of Gr.1 1000 Guineas (1600m) winner Lady Of The Pines. - **RAS NewsWire**

NEWS IN BRIEF

O'Shea Running to Canterbury Stakes

John O'Shea will chase Group One glory in Sydney rather than head to Melbourne with **Lost And Running (NZ)** (Per Incanto), following his win in Saturday's Gr.3 Southern Cross Stakes (1200m).

The son of Per Incanto was a dominant winner of the 1200m contest and provided O'Shea with the first part of his double at Randwick.

"I'm very happy with the way he went," O'Shea said on Sunday.

"He pulled up well, so it's a good start to the campaign."

Saturday's victory took Lost And Running's career tally to eight wins from thirteen starts, and he will now head on to the Gr.1 Canterbury Stakes (1300m) at Randwick on March 5 for his next assignment.

"He's matured a bit and really learned his craft as we've gone along steadily with him," O'Shea said.

"He's starting to develop into a really nice sprinter."

O'Shea confirmed that The Everest (1200m), which Lost And Running finished fourth in last year, would be the main goal for the five-year-old this year.

Lost And Running was bred by JML Bloodstock's Lib Petagna and raised at Blandford Lodge in Matamata.

Petagna retains an interest in the impressive galloper, who races in the colours of Carl Holt, with partners including Frank and Christine Cook and O'Shea's wife Isabel.

Lost And Running is by Little Avondale Stud's Per Incanto, with the proven son of Street Cry represented by 33 yearlings at the forthcoming New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sales which commence on March 7. – **NZ Racing Desk**





PATTERSON RELISHES GROUP ONE VICTORY

he long trip home to New Plymouth from Hamilton on Saturday evening flew by for trainer Robbie Patterson as he reflected on what had happened just a few hours earlier at Te Rapa.

Relishing the damp underfoot conditions, classy mare **Coventina Bay (NZ)** (Shamexpress) out-finished Vernanme (NZ) (O'Reilly) to take out the Gr.1 Herbie Dyke Stakes (2000m) to add a Group One title to her already outstanding career record, whilst also providing Patterson with his first elite level victory when training in his own right.

Patterson had experienced the Group One feeling once before when in partnership with Kevin Gray, when the pair produced Legs (NZ) (Pins) to win the 2006 Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks (2400m), but this time it was Patterson's solo responsibility and he relished the occasion.

"I have to admit it was a pretty good trip home, even

though it was late in the day.

"I had to wait around until the last as I was taking one home for Wheels (John Wheeler), which also won, so it was a fairly lucky load on the truck.

"It did mean I couldn't really celebrate too hard, despite there being plenty of yahooing, but I intend to make up for that today (Sunday)."

Patterson had been confident of a good showing when he left his New Plymouth base on Saturday morning and that feeling grew as he saw the moisture in the Te Rapa surface due to the rain that had fallen in the previous 24 hours.

"It all just fell into place really and I knew she was ready to go as her work had been terrific and when I weighed her in the morning she was exactly 445kgs, which is her prime racing weight," he said.

"I knew she would handle the track a little better than some of her rivals, but when you are racing at this level everything has to be right otherwise you get beaten.

"The race panned out well and Craig (Grylls) rode her superbly.

"When I saw how she was travelling at the 600m I got a little jolt as she was just ready to explode.

"To Vernanme's credit, he really fought hard and made it a great race, which is what you want from Group One racing.

"To actually win is amazing and honestly I think she deserves to have a Group One to her name."

Patterson is quick to pay tribute to the mare who he believes has put his name on the training map and is responsible for him having a full barn of 40 horses and more waiting to come.

"I owe this mare it all really, as she has put me on the map," he said.

"There is no doubt that over the past couple of seasons she has kept my name in lights and that has meant I have had people wanting to place horses with me.

"The racing game can be plenty hard and I've had some dark days along the way, where I wasn't sure if it is all worth it, but after a win like that I can tell you it is definitely worth it.

"I'm also aware that I have learnt so much from training a horse like her.



"She isn't easy as she has her problems and we have the physio to her at least twice a week.

"I've made some dumb mistakes along the way and I'm a lot wiser now, so hopefully I can now get her to an even higher level."

Patterson is determined to return to Australia with Coventina Bay after she endured a luckless three race campaign in Brisbane last winter.

"I really want to go back and show the Aussies just how good she is," he said.

"I felt I was on a steep learning curve over there and no matter what you have been told, you do have to experience it to fully appreciate the magnitude of the task.

"I had spoken with Wheels a number of times and wish I had listened a bit more, but now I've been there I think I can do a far better job with her this time.

"Now she has shown she can get the 2000m, I would dearly love to tackle a race like the Doomben Cup (Gr.1, 2000m) with her.

"She will most likely have two more starts here with the Bonecrusher Stakes (Gr.1, 2000m) at Ellerslie and the Breeders' Stakes (Gr.1, 1600m) at Te Rapa and then we will confirm if we are going over again.

"I've been in and seen her this morning and she weighs 444kgs and left half a dipper of feed, so she has bounced through the race extremely well.

"She had her head over the side of her box and was pretty keen to see me, which was a great feeling."

With raceday duties completed Patterson is looking forward to some afternoon revelry to complete the weekend.

"The weather here is atrocious and blowing a gale, but I don't think that will dampen the celebrations," he said.

"The owners of Coventina Bay have organised a 4:30pm meeting at the local pub which will make for a great night, although the warm-up will be with a few close mates at 1pm so I can definitely see it being a slow morning on Monday."

FUTURE PLANS STILL TO BE **DECIDED FOR LEVANTE**

rainer Ken Kelso is content to sit back and savour the thrill of winning a second consecutive Group One with star mare **Levante** (NZ), before any decisions on her immediate future are made.

The daughter of Proisir delighted her connections and multitude of fans when she held out the challenge of another class mare in Entriviere (NZ) (Tavistock) to take out the Gr.1 BCD Group Sprint (1400m), after the pair waged a two-horse war down the Te Rapa home straight on Saturday.

Kelso, who prepares the five-yearold in partnership with wife Bev, was a happy man after watching Levante deliver again at the elite level to confirm the promise he saw in her since the day she entered their Matamata stable.

"That win was very special and to make it back-to-back Group One wins is something I think she deserves," Kelso said.

"All the way through we have thought she could win at this level, however until her last two starts she just hadn't had the rub of the green.

"She has been bloody unlucky on occasions, but I guess that luck is evening out a bit now.

"It was a tremendous race and although the other mare (Entriviere) was in a pocket, I thought she got out in time to run us down."

Kelso admitted to some anxious moments when he saw rider Ryan Elliot out wide and challenging at the 600m but had the belief that his charge could do the job from there.

"I think the circumstances of the race meant Ryan got in the position he did, but there were a few concerns for a while there," he said.

"When you end up winning the race there is not much more you can say, but I'm pleased he took the bull by the horns and made a decision that proved to be the winning one.

"That's why you put those guys on and we got the result we wanted."

Kelso will now take a few days to let the dust settle before he sits down with the mare's connections to discuss what the future holds.

"She has always been a good eater and she got home last night and licked the bowl clean and was waiting for her breakfast this morning," he said.

"We haven't discussed where we go next and I spoke with Phillip Brown (co-owner) this morning (Sunday) and he was just keen to enjoy the moment before we plan for anything else.

"There are options for her, including Australia, so when we sit down there will be everything on the table to discuss."

Levante has now taken her career record to ten wins from 15 starts and over \$560,000 in prizemoney.

GROUP ONE BREEDER EXCITED BY FORTHCOMING KARAKA OFFERING

s preparations ramp up for the 2022 edition of the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sales at Karaka in March, Curraghmore principal Gordon Cunningham was once again celebrating the success of a past graduate of his Te Awamutu-based operation.

The popular Irishman bred outstanding Ocean Park mare **Tofane (NZ)** who added a fourth Group One victory to her impressive career record when she took out the Gr.1 C.F. Orr Stakes (1400m) at Caulfield on Saturday afternoon.

Although initially entered in the 2017 New Zealand Bloodstock Select Yearling Sale, Cunningham elected to retain Tofane and send her to trainer Michael Moroney's Matamata barn under the care of co-trainer Pam Gerard.

Tofane won an 820m trial at Te
Teko before Ballymore Stable clients
purchased her from Cunningham
and she was transferred to Moroney's
Melbourne stable where she has gone
on to win eight races from 27 starts and
over A\$3.39 million in prizemoney.

Cunningham is justifiably proud of the mare, who he admitted didn't really stand out as a young horse until she began to mature.

"She was a pretty typical Ocean Park early on, but with maturity she developed with more obvious quality and the look of a good horse," he said.

"She has gone on to show she is an absolutely elite galloper, who always

gives her best.

"I actually feel she is probably still a touch underrated as the field she beat yesterday was full of quality and she did it in confident fashion.

"She led all the way and was a sitting duck for the stalkers and nothing could touch her.

"I think she deserves all the accolades she gets."

With the National Yearling Sales less than a month away, Cunningham and his Curraghmore team are hard at work putting the finishing touches on a draft that will see them present 23 individuals in the Book 1 sale and a further four in Book 2.

Having developed and sold numerous elite horses on his Te Awamutu farm, Cunningham is confident the depth of his current draft will continue the legacy the farm has created since it was established back in

"We have been hard at work for the past five weeks and have enjoyed probably the best November and December period that I can recall.

"I'm delighted with how our preparations have gone so far as we certainly have confidence in our draft right through each colt and each filly," he said.

"Hopefully the rewards will be there for us, and all the vendors, and that bidding will be deservedly strong across the two catalogues.

Cunningham is loathe to single out individuals in his draft but does have a special mention for Lot 410, a filly by Fastnet Rock out of Galileo mare, Memories Of You which makes her a full sister to Gr.1 Australian Oaks (2400m) winner, Unforgotten and stakes placed filly Special Memories, who are both Curraghmore graduates.

"I guess our draft is headed by our full sister to Unforgotten Lot 410, who is a big prospect to run and is so well related. It is a privilege to be able to offer her for sale," Cunningham said.

"We sold both of her sisters in Unforgotten and Special Memories and I think this filly has a lot of similarities to Unforgotten although she may even be a tad more mature at this stage.

"She is typical of those good Fastnet

Rock fillies and is bred on the Fastnet Rock, Galileo cross that has provided ten individual Group One winners worldwide.

"We also have an Impending colt (Lot 433) who is a half to Karaka Million 2YO (1200m) winner On The Bubbles and he looks a lot like his half-brother, while we are offering three US Navy Flag Colts (Lots 125, 138, 157) who I also like.

"We have bred a lot of mares to US Navy Flag over the last three years as he was a terrific racehorse and I have high hopes he can make his mark as a sire."

Cunningham also believes Lot 615, a Pierro filly out of Strada Cavallo will be a popular choice for the buying bench but he cautions buyers not to overlook some of the lesser profile horses in both his and other vendors drafts.

"I think the best thing about our draft is that it is very even across the board," he said.

"We certainly have some standouts on paper, but the beauty of Karaka is that any yearling offered here could go on to be your next stakes winner.

"A case in point for us is Tarzino filly Gypsy Goddess, who is unbeaten in four starts, but was passed in during the Book 2 sale in 2020.

"For whatever reason, we were unable to sell her but look at her now as she won a Group Three race at her last start and will be one of the most favoured fillies for races like the Australian Oaks (Gr.1, 2400m) during the Sydney autumn carnival.

"Obviously there are some horses that are pretty obvious in their potential, but others like her can sneak under the radar so I really hope that buyers participate at Karaka in force and enjoy the rewards that are there annually for everyone."

New Zealand bred horses are enjoying another fine season in Australia and following Tofane's victory have now won 9 of the 32 Group One races (28%) conducted so far this term.

The New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sales Series commences at Karaka on March 7 with the three-day Book 1 Sale followed by a further three days of selling with Book 2 taking place from March 10-12.

NUNES HITS BULLSEYE WITH TWO TOP PICKS

n a day that generally favoured well-backed runners, Manoel Nunes got two of them home on Sunday – favourites **Sky Eye (NZ)** (Per Incanto) and **Fireworks** (**NZ**) (Ekraar).

The Brazilian ace proved again he seldom fluffs his lines when entrusted with a top fancy, giving both Sky Eye and Fireworks the well-judged steers he is known for.

In the third event, the \$50,000 Class 4 Division 2 race over 1000m, Nunes could be seen scrubbing Sky Eye up from his wide alley to secure the lead, which once secured, would lead to a one-way traffic for the Per Incanto five-year-old prepared by Jason Lim.

Formerly prepared by Leticia Dragon, Jerome Tan and Kuah Cheng Tee, Sky Eye, who is now owned by GC Gan, has now amassed around \$\$190,000 in prizemoney earned from his four wins and 11 placings from 23 starts.

"Last time, there was speed in the race and we sat at the back, but today from the wide draw, we had to press forward," said Nunes.

"Once he was in front, he controlled the pace and was too good. It's my first win for Jason, hopefully, there'll be more in the future."

Four races later, Nunes was just as effective switching to quieter tactics aboard Fireworks in the \$30,000 Class 5 Division 2 race (1400m).

The hotpot was never going to get beaten once he found galloping room between runners at the 400m. Tim Fitzsimmons's

six-year-old by Ekraar drew clear to win by just under three lengths.

Fireworks clocked 1min 22.92secs for the 1400m on the Long Course to take his record to five wins and five placings from 35 starts for stakes earnings that have now tipped over the \$\$100,000 mark for the Buffalo Stable.
