PLAN COMES TO FRUITION **FOR JUSTACANTA**



Justacanta sprints clear to win the Listed Paris Lane Stakes (1410m) at Flemington (Bruno Cannatelli)

thrilling victory by Justacanta (NZ) (Per Incanto) in Saturday's Listed Paris Lane Stakes (1410m) at Flemington saw the successful culmination of a plan hatched by trainers Shaun and Emma Clotworthy after the now eight-year-old had completed his summer campaign in March this year.

A model of consistency over his 47 New Zealand starts, where he won six

races and was placed a further 20 times, including at Group Three level, the son of Per Incanto had reached an awkward place in the handicaps with his owners of the opinion there were limited options left for him on the local scene.

An opportunity to transfer him to the Patrick Payne stable in Melbourne was taken up with the goal of trying to win at stakes level in the competitive Victorian market.

A solid run for sixth at Sandown in just his second-up run provided hope that a victory was close at hand and so it proved on Saturday as rider Dean Yendall kept Justacanta under wraps behind horses before exploding clear in the final stages to win easing down by half a length at the line.

The win set off mass celebrations in the Clotworthy household as they

cheered their pride and joy home from the comfort of their living room.

"It was pretty special alright," Shaun Clotworthy said.

"The race was the last on the card at around eight o'clock, so we had settled into the living room for the night to watch some rugby.

"When we saw him going so well just in behind them the excitement levels rose and when he burst to the lead the yelling and screaming went up a few volumes.

"It is very satisfying that the plan we had has come off as we knew there wasn't much for him over here anymore and we felt there was still some juice left in him.



"I think the easing of the ground yesterday helped and it was a lovely ride as there was plenty of speed on and he didn't expose him until late in the piece.

"He's not very big but he has an electric turn of foot and was going away from them at the post, although he was up to his normal tricks and wanted to knock off a bit when he hit the front."

Now that he has found form, Clotworthy is keen to see what Payne has planned next for Justacanta.

"Patrick has done a really good job with him," he said.

"We had a very quick chat after the race and I think he is looking at a mile on Cox Plate day as his next run.

"I'm not sure whether Moonee Valley is his best track, but the beauty of the set-up over there is that you are spoiled for choice at this time of the year.

"There are so many options, all for good money, so we will wait and see what Patrick tells us once the horse has had a few days to get over this run."

While the Clotworthy's couldn't be in Melbourne to witness the win first-hand, they were also feeling frustration like most Aucklanders who are unable to travel outside the region due to COVID19 restrictions.

"We're doing it tough like everyone else around here at the moment with all the restrictions," Clotworthy said.

"Not being able to travel to racemeetings with your horses is a terrible situation and puts a lot of pressure on us all.

"We put four on the float to Te Aroha today for the Great Northern meeting and had to wave them goodbye as they went out the gate.

"It is getting to the point where it isn't feasible to keep going the way it is, not only is it playing havoc with your mental wellbeing, it also is putting pressure on other areas.

"You are actually very limited in what type of horse and how many you can send to the races, with the need to have staff or stand-ins handling them at the other end and we are very mindful of not sending some horses who can get fractious or need special handling.

"It really is a struggle and you can only hope it is going to change as quickly as possible." – **NZ Racing Desk**

WILDE TO CONSIDER CUP OPTIONS WITH ROSE

rainer Symon Wilde remains hopeful of getting a Gr.1 Melbourne Cup (3200m) start with **Tralee Rose (NZ)** (Tavistock).

Symon Wilde may not start Tralee
Rose again before the Melbourne Cup
despite the mare being down the
ballot order.

Tralee Rose went within 1-1/4 lengths of gaining a start in the Melbourne Cup at Flemington on November 2 when second in the Gr.3 The Bart Cummings (2500m) on Saturday.

Victory in that race provided Grand Promenade (Champs Elysees) a ballot exemption into the Melbourne Cup.

Like Grand Promenade's trainers Ciaron Maher and David Eustace, Wilde had planned Tralee Rose's campaign around winning Saturday's race.

"We were really pleased with the horse," Wilde said.

"It's the race we had aimed her at, but we've come up short by one, but that's racing.

"We're just lucky to have a nice horse like her to be able to compete in these races."

Wilde could not have asked for a better ride from Dean Holland who had Tralee Rose in the one-one position in fourth spot turning out of the straight from their widest draw.

Unfortunately for Wilde, Grand Promenade showed a better turn of foot entering the straight.

"There were no excuses whatsoever," Wilde said.

"There was good tempo, she got

into a great spot, but the winner was too good.

"But from a Melbourne Cup point of view I was heartened that in the last 50 to 100 metres she was getting back at the winner, so it does make us think we really do want to get her into it.

"She's a really, really strong stayer, and the last 100 metres would not put me off going that way."

With Grand Promenade gaining a ballot exemption, Tralee Rose is now 37th in the ballot order.

Wilde said the Gr.3 Geelong Cup (2400m) on October 20 could be an option in the hope of winning and receiving a re-handicap.

"Or we may even chance our arm," Wilde said.

Bred by Sir Patrick and Lady
Hogan, Tralee Rose was a \$50,000
purchase by bloodstock agent
Cameron Cooke and Wilde from the
Cambridge Stud draft at the 2018
National Yearling Sale at Karaka.



MISS TYCOON ROSE SETS SPECIAL MARK FOR PITMAN

comfortable victory by Miss Tycoon Rose (Written Tycoon) at Riccarton on Saturday provided co-trainer Michael Pitman with more than the usual satisfaction of a job well done.

Pitman, who trains in partnership with son Matthew, has now moved into second place on the all-time New Zealand trainers by domestic wins with 1878 victories to his name, second only to Graeme Rogerson (in excess of 2500) and one ahead of Dave O'Sullivan.

It is an achievement that Pitman is mightily proud of and one that may never have occurred without the determination and resilience he has displayed throughout his more than 40 years in the industry.

"This really means a lot to me, especially given the circumstances of how I got started and the flak I copped in the early years from people who told me I probably got my trainers license from a weetbix packet.

"There are still a few of them in the game now, so I'd like to think that may have changed their minds a bit."

Pitman caught the bug for thoroughbreds in his early twenties, when working for Olympic bronze medalist in rifle shooting, Ian Ballinger.

A sports mad teenager, who had spent several years

caddying for Stuart Jones, one of New Zealand's foremost amateur golfers, Pitman had just changed jobs and was managing Ballinger's rifle shop when he got the opportunity to race a horse with Ballinger from the Ray Harris stable.

"I think I was about 20 at the time and had just finished up as the sales manager in the South Island for PGF golf equipment," Pitman said.

"I loved golf and when I was a teenager, I spent a few years caddying for Stuart Jones, who was the leading New Zealand amateur at the time.

"When I was at lan's we got involved with a mare called Parilla and she provided me with my first win as an owner.

"I was hooked then and there and decided I would like to get into training along with my wife Diane, who I had just met."

Pitman applied for his public license, which was granted, but before he had a chance to secure his first winner tragedy struck as he was pinned against a concrete wall by his car and eventually had his left leg amputated below the knee.

"I hadn't even trained a winner and I was in hospital for 26 weeks after the accident," Pitman said.

"Diane looked after the team at the time and when I left hospital, I had \$17 in the bank, so I started from pretty much nothing.

"I remember the doctor said to me to enjoy whatever I did as I would be in a wheelchair by the time I was 50.

"Well, I'm 66 now and that isn't looking likely, but I can tell him I've had plenty of enjoyment in my life."

Pressed to name some of his most memorable victories over his career, Pitman settles on three that he holds most dear.

"I think the win that means the most to me is when Just Tommy won the Canterbury Cup in Sydney in 1992," he said.

"Chris Johnson rode him while on a stay of proceedings after being suspended and the placegetters were trained by Lee Freedman, Bart Cummings and Tommy Smith.

"To think we had beaten those legends that day will always stand out to me.

"In more recent times Savvy Coup winning the Livamol Classic (Gr.1, 2040m) when I had been diagnosed with bowel cancer was very emotional and a special win, while the journey we went on with Enzo's Lad to Hong Kong and Royal Ascot is also a wonderful chapter in my life.

"Enzo's Lad was a huge part of my recovery from cancer and that trip overseas with him is a once in a lifetime experience.

"I still have his owners ring me and reminisce about it, which is just magic."

While he may be approaching a well-earned retirement, Pitman is adamant there is one more goal he wants to achieve before he hands over the family business to Matthew.

"This has always been a family business with Diane, who has been the mainstay, Matthew and my late son Jonny," he said.

"When I retire it will still be that way and I'm sure Matthew is probably itching for that to happen.

"I've told him that the minute I get to 2000 winners I will give it away at the end of that season, so we may only be a couple of years away.

"Depending on what the COVID situation is, Diane and I would like to travel more, but we will always be here for Matthew

"We have some lovely horses in our team and we're gearing up for Cup Week at Riccarton, as for the South Island trainers, that is the pinnacle of each year.

"Miss Tycoon Rose is heading to the Coupland's Bakeries Mile (Gr.2, 1600m) and we have a large number of runners set for the each of the three days.

"If we could get a big win during the week, it would be great, but any win is special, so we will take whatever we can get and I will keep chipping away at that 2000 mark."

THRILLING FINISH TO GREAT NORTHERN STEEPLECHASE

fter competing for the full six-kilometre distance of a gruelling Diprose Miller Great Northern Steeplechase (6200m), less than half a length separated eventual winner **Te Kahu (NZ)** (Zacinto) from gallant runner-up Zartan (NZ) (Zed) at Te Aroha on Sunday.

Raced at Te Aroha instead of its spiritual home over the famed Ellerslie hill due to COVID19 restrictions, the race lived up to its epic history as the first two home settled down to a ding dong battle over the final fence.

Pacemaker Zartan and rider Shaun Phelan had controlled proceedings from barrier rise and went for home with three fences to clear.

Te Kahu and Matthew Cropp along with No Tip (NZ) (Mettre En Jeu) and Shaun Fannin headed the chase and joined issue with Zartan entering the home straight.

No Tip was the first to drop away,

with the Dan O'Leary-trained Te Kahu taking a narrow lead after jumping the final obstacle.

Zartan would not be denied and rallied again to push Te Kahu all the way to the line, however the eight-year-old Marton visitor had enough in hand to hold out the challenge by half a length to register the third and biggest win of his 14-start career.

O'Leary, who co-owns Te Kahu in

partnership with his wife Jane, was struggling to take in what his charge had achieved at such an early stage in his jumping life.

"It's a huge thrill and I'm just absolutely stoked," he said.

"It's a funny thing, but when he was first being schooled and taught to jump by Matthew, he came in one day and said to me he felt like a real Northern type of horse that would just stay all day.

"I told him he was mad as he hadn't even had a start at that stage, but it just shows you that sometimes these things are meant to be.

"He has always been a little slow for the flat but just loves his jumping, with the bigger the fences the better.

"He had a couple of races at Ellerslie last season and really finished off well, so I thought with a year on him and getting over the Northern distance then he could be a chance, but you are never confident in a race like this."

O'Leary will now spend the summer planning a schedule for Te Kahu which could include an Australian sojourn if he comes up well for a new campaign.

"We'll get him home and let the dust settle before we do anything with him, but he is a young horse that still

"There are several options here, although I have in the back of my mind that he could be the perfect type for a race like the Grand Annual Steeplechase (5500m) at Warrnambool.

"Who knows what the travel situation will be like then, but I'd like to give it a shot if we had the opportunity."

One race earlier **The Cossack** (NZ) (Mastercraftsman) cemented his reputation as one of the best hurdlers of modern times when he defended his title in the Paul Bibby Memorial Great Northern Hurdle (4200m).

The Paul Nelson and Corinna McDougal-trained eight-year-old has swept all before him this season, adding his second Great Northern title to victories in the Waikato Hurdle (3200m), Wellington Hurdle (3100m) and Grand National Hurdles (4200m).

Assigned clear topweight of 70.5kgs, the son of Mastercraftsman was settled in behind tearaway pacemaker Alfie Dee (NZ) (Zed) by rider Shaun Phelan, before making his move with 600m to run.

Second favourite Dr Hank (NZ) (Redwood) (\$3.50) charged to the front on the point of the home turn but was quickly gobbled up by The Cossack (\$2.20) as Phelan sent him clear over the last two fences, winning with plenty in hand by four and half lengths from Dr Hank and the late closing

Aigne (NZ) (Sufficient), who took third.

Nelson was exceptionally proud of the star jumper as he reflected on the victory.

"He is a magnificent jumper and I guess that shows with the win today," he said.

"We just weren't sure if he could carry that sort of weight and on a track where they were pinging along a bit, but we had to give it a try.

"He's probably more dominant on bad ground, however he jumped really well and Shaun rode him beautifully.

"I thought he was in a good spot and handy enough if he could manage the weight. Shaun let him come with the one run and that proved the winning of the race."

The Cossack will now head to

the spelling paddock with Nelson undecided on how he will tackle a programme for his charge next season.

"He's off to the paddock now and he deserves a good break," he said.

"What I do know is that he has a pretty hard case bunch of owners back home and they will be celebrating and making all sorts of weird and wonderful plans I would think."

The victory was the fifth in the race for Nelson, who produced Chibuli to win in 2002, Just Not Cricket (2006, 2007) and now The Cossack (2020, 2021).

The Cossack has won ten races for Nelson and fellow owners John Frizzell, Peter Grieve and his son Doug and over \$319,000 in prizemoney.

There was a dramatic aftermath

to the race with rider Emily Farr transported to hospital via Air Ambulance after a fall from Kaharau that saw her knocked unconscious while also suffering a punctured lung and a potential break under her left eye.

Two further jockeys also suffered significant injuries on the day with Craig Thornton breaking his arm when falling from Lacustre in the Great Northern Steeplechase, while Gary Walsh broke his left thigh after a fall from Jakki Sparrow in a maiden hurdle contest. – **NZ Racing Desk**

Moor rapt with Young Cups contender

Daniel Moor saw enough from **Young Werther (NZ)** (Tavistock) in Saturday's Gr.1 Turnbull Stakes (2000m) to know he's a legitimate Gr. 1 Caulfield Cup (2400m) contender, but he still thinks Incentivise is the horse to beat.

In what was his first race ride on Danny O'Brien's dual-Derby placegetter, Moor loomed as the winner on Young Werther inside the final 200m of the Flemington feature before Incentivise (Shamus Award) raised another effort to fend off the challenge.

Moor, who has now been locked in to ride Young Werther with 52kg in both the Caulfield Cup and Gr. 1 Melbourne Cup (3200m), said both horses deserved their place at the top of Caulfield Cup markets.

- "I probably found a little bit more respect for Incentivise after that effort," Moor said.
- "I thought we had him for three or four strides, but he kicked and went again.
- "For a horse to quicken twice, they generally have to be pretty good.
- "But my bloke was very honest.

"He was second-up, he's got good improvement, he's down in the weights and he's in with a shout in those Cup races going forward.

- "I would've liked him to have 50.5kg or 51kg but we can't be choosers.
- "His run yesterday behind probably the weight-for-age star in Australia is good enough at the moment."

GAYLARD LEGACY HONOURED AFTER WIN

pirit of Gaylard's (NZ) (Puissance de Lune) maiden win has honoured the legacy of the late Rob Gaylard in fine style after the Puissance de Lune colt scored smartly at Bendigo on Sunday.

The Mitch Freedman-trained colt lived up to the expectations of punters as the \$1.60 favourite and also to the cheer of many on lookers, with Gaylard a longtime friend and mentor to many in the racing industry.

Gaylard passed away in July last year, but friends and coowners Gerry Ryan and Terry Henderson as well as John and Joan Spence set out to honour his legacy and race the horse in partnership with Gaylard's wife Karen.

Not many however would have been as excited as Casey Bruce, who cheered on from afar, who the Gaylard's look upon as their own daughter.

"I'm out at Living Legends and watched it on my phone, I had to get into some service because I wouldn't have missed it for the world," Bruce explained.

"For me my heart skipped a beat and had a flutter and then I lost it when Rick (McIntosh) said there will be a few tears and I knew Karen would be inconsolable.

"It's exciting, the horse means so much to a lot of people."
Spirit of Gaylard was purchased for \$120,000 out of the
Berkley Stud draft at the 2020 NZB National Yearling Sale and
caught the eye with an impressive debut performance at
Flemington back in May.

"I think the story goes Terry and Gerry were both bidding against each other, and both realised and thought why don't we stop driving the price up and buy the horse together," Bruce recalled.

"They spoke to Mum about naming the horse after Rob, but tried to keep it a little surprise as well.

"I know a few names got submitted and rejected, he was known as the silver fox at the track, so I think that was one, but as soon as I found out it was Spirit of Gaylard that was very fitting."

Trainer Mitch Freedman was also pleased to get the win with another of the progeny of Puissance de Lune, following in the footsteps of stablemates Southern Moon and Moonlight Maid.

While both those horses contested the Gr. 1 VRC Derby (2500m) and Gr.1 VRC Oaks (2400m) respectively in their three-year-old season, he's not quite sure Spirit of Gaylard will follow the same path, looking more towards an autumn preparation.

"We put him away pretty quickly after Flemington, I think for those stayers to get a run as a two-year-old and get their bones moving and get them to work out what it's all about is important," Freedman said post-race.

"He's not too hardened yet, we just want to get some racing into him and see where he takes us."

Spirit of Gaylard's sire Puissance de Lune also carried the Gerry Ryan silks to victory at Bendigo when he won the Listed Bendigo Cup (2400m) in track record time in 2012 when strapped by Mitch Freedman. – Racing.com
