TURN ME LOOSE FILLY IMPRESSES WITH DEBUT VICTORY



Lickety Split wins on debut at Ellerslie (Trish Dunell)

A gritty victory by two-year-old filly **Lickety Split (NZ)** at her first raceday start at Ellerslie has given her sire Turn Me Loose a timely boost ahead of the upcoming New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale at Karaka.

The Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman-trained youngster followed up an impressive trial win at Ellerslie late last month with a similar performance on Saturday as she overhauled pacemaker Slipper Island (No Nay Never) in the final stages after the pair had gone head-to-head over the final 400m.

The well-proportioned filly looks a likely three-year-old type for next season, an opinion shared by co-trainer Forsman who was pleased to see her pick up the victory at just her first start.

"She has a bit of scope about her and to see the way she knuckled down and fought so hard after just the one trial was very heartening," Forsman said.

"She did most things right, which was also good to see and I liked the way she found the line so strongly over the last little bit.

"She is a filly we think can go on with it next season now she has had a taste of what the racing game is all about.

"We're not sure what we are going to do next with her, but I'm hoping we can get one or two more starts before we put her away for the winter."

An interested observer was Windsor Park Stud Master Rodney Schick who stands Turn Me Loose at his Kaipaki property in Cambridge.

Windsor Park will offer a total of 14 individuals by Turn Me Loose across the Book 1 and 2 sessions at Karaka and the win, combined with a tenacious performance by three-year-old filly Ancient Girl (NZ), who went down narrowly in the Gr.3 The Vanity (1400m) at Flemington later in the day, a perfect advertisement for their resident son of Iffraaj.

"That was a great win by Lickety Split and there is a really neat story around her," Schick said.

"She was bred by Dean Hawkins and Nick Hewson, who both worked for me when they were starting out.

"While Dean and his brothers and family established Wentwood Grange, Nick went off playing rugby overseas for 15 years, but he came back a couple of years ago and is back working for me again.

"Dean and Nick got some mates together to race Lickety Split so it is just great they could have such a good win first up with her.

"It is also perfect timing for Turn Me Loose who went pretty close to getting his second stakes winner with Ancient Girl, who went a cracker of a race at Flemington.

"Funnily enough she was bred by Dave Morris and Jason Thomasen, who also worked for me, so there is quite a tie in there."

Schick is bullish about prospects for the success of this year's sale at Karaka, with a good-sized draft of 45 yearlings to be presented from Windsor Park Stud, featuring a wide cross-section of stallions that he believes will appeal to the buying bench.

"We have some lovely horses to sell right across our draft," Schick said.

"Turn Me Loose has a cracking filly in Lot 26 from the good mare Trepidation, who has already produced a winner in the two-year-old full sister named Wessex who won on debut.

"Lot 540 is a Turn Me Loose colt out of Rolling In The Deep and is from a wonderful family while Lot 246 is out of Fastnet

Rose and from the family of Stradbroke Handicap (Gr.1, 1400m) winner Trekking.

"They are both beautiful, athletic colts with the looks to match.

"We also have stunning individuals by Shameexpress, Ocean Park, Almanzor and Charm Spirit to name just a few off the top of my head.

"I think the best thing about our draft is the variety you can find in it.

"New Zealand bred horses have had another outstanding season in our major markets like Australia and Asia and I would like to think that will be evident when the bidding starts."

Like other vendors, Schick would love to have seen the borders open to welcome international buyers and visitors to the sale but is still confident that the sale will deliver without them physically in attendance.

"It's certainly not ideal that we can't have our international friends on the ground at Karaka, but it is a different ball game to what it was when COVID first struck," he said.

"People are far more attuned to buying online now and we have the material and procedures in place to get them the information they need.

"We've seen the yearling sales so far in Australia be extremely strong and I have no reason to think it will be any different at Karaka this year."

The National Yearling Sale will commence at 11 am on March 7 and run until March 12.

WALKER READY TO IMMERSE HIMSELF IN NZ STABLE

Mark Walker is enjoying the fresh air, green pastures and wide-open spaces in Matamata as he prepares for a return to training duties in New Zealand following an extensive stint in Singapore.

Walker spent 11 years in Singapore at the helm of Te Akau Racing's Kranji operation, where he was crowned champion trainer on four occasions, adding to the five national premiership victories he amassed in New Zealand prior to his Singapore departure.

There will be a cross-over period between Walker and current Te Akau Matamata trainer Jamie Richards, who has been licensed in Hong Kong next season and departs for the region in April.

"I've just got out of seven days in

MIQ in Auckland and arrived back in Matamata this afternoon (Sunday)," Walker said.

"It's just fantastic to be back in New Zealand and I'm already eager to get back into stable life here, so I'm heading to the track tomorrow (Monday) morning to catch up with Jamie and to get started.

"My time in MIQ was actually pretty good and it's something that I've become a little used to as I did 14 days in Sydney earlier in the year before heading up to the Gold Coast yearling sales and then another seven days when I went back to Singapore.

"The time has gone quite quickly and I spent a fair bit of it studying the catalogue for the Karaka yearling sale next month while also checking out some videos and photos of the

yearlings through various websites."

This is the first time Walker has been back in New Zealand for over two years due to the COVID pandemic border restrictions and he is lapping up being back in his homeland.

"It is great to be back home finally after two years," he said.

"Like so many other New Zealanders the whole travel situation and the like has been pretty tough.

"I lost my father about six months ago and couldn't get back for the funeral, so I'm really looking forward to being back with my family.

"I've already noticed the drop in temperature from Singapore and I'm quite enjoying that as well.

"One of the many pleasures in New Zealand is the climate and having four

Lim's Bestbreaker scores on quick back-up

Leading jockey Danny Beasley was well inspired in asking trainer Daniel Meagher to back **Lim's Bestbreaker (NZ)** (Battle Paint) up this week after the gamble came off with happy results on Saturday.

The Battle Paint five-year-old ran a closing third in a Class 4 mile race last Sunday, with Beasley ruing upon dismounting the mid-race slackened pace that cost him the race.

The two Dans had a powwow shortly after to discuss about the next course of action, which was to reset him for Saturday's \$50,000 Class 4 Division 1 race over 1400m on the Long Course.

Beasley left the tactics virtually unchanged, again electing for a quiet run at the back, but the finish worked out to a tee this time.

"He was a bit of a headcase but he has settled down a lot now, and should have won over the mile last week," said Beasley.

"The speed came right out of the race in the middle sections, and he was also held up in the last 200m. I told Dan to put him on again this week, and we went into the race pretty confident.

"The only thing with this horse is he has to be ridden back, and more often than not, such horses lose, but today, things went his way."

In 19 starts, Lim's Bestbreaker has now taken his record to four wins and six placings for prizemoney around the \$165,000 mark for the Lim's Stable.

distinct seasons as in Singapore it is pretty much the same all year round and hot all the time.

"Mind you I may not say the same in the middle of winter in Matamata, but I'm sure I'll get used to it pretty quickly."

One of the key aspects of New Zealand racing that Walker is keen to get back amongst is the development of the young horses that Te Akau Racing boss David Ellis buys at the sales each year.

"I think spending time developing the babies is something I have missed the most in Singapore," he said.

"Over there you pretty much have ready-made racehorses whereas here one of my greatest passions is taking the raw yearlings and bringing them through the stages of their careers.

"Working with those young horses is such a challenge and you just never know where your next Princess Coup, Darci Brahma or Probabeel is coming from.

"Educating them, putting them through their first jumpout, then trialling and eventually getting them to the races is very satisfying and something I love.

"I certainly enjoyed my time in Singapore and winning the races that we did, while I will miss the very low tax rate when it comes to looking at my bank balance.

"But coming home is special and I just can't wait to get amongst it and training winners for Te Akau again."

RICHARDSON ALL SMILES WITH BONNY LASS

Talented filly **Bonny Lass (NZ)** (Super Easy) put a big smile on the face of co-trainer Graham Richardson after she returned to winning form with a comprehensive victory over 1200m at Ellerslie on Saturday.

Richardson, who prepares the daughter of Super Easy with training partner Rogan Norvall, had been confident of a good performance following some impressive trackwork earlier in the week and once she secured an ideal barrier draw in gate two, that confidence increased.

A well-judged ride from Craig

Grylls saw Bonny Lass settle behind the pacemakers before diving through a gap against the rail at the 250m to draw clear for a comfortable one and a half-length victory.

Richardson has always rated the filly, who was placed twice at Group One level during her two-year-old campaign, as above average and believes she is ready to tackle stakes company again at her next start.

"That good draw made all the difference as last time she worked too hard on the speed and that cost her as she just couldn't kick on in the last little bit," he said.

"Craig got her away nicely and waited for the run to come and she put them away fairly easily.

"Her work on Tuesday morning was outstanding and once she got the good draw, I had the feeling she was going to be hard to beat.

"At this stage she will be coming back to Ellerslie in a fortnight for the Mufhasa Stakes (Listed, 1400m) and safely through that we might take her down to Trentham for the Levin Classic (Gr.1, 1600m).

"She might be a little suspect at the mile, but against her own age that

might be the best time to see if she can get it."

Richardson is disappointed that he may have to find a replacement rider for Bonny Lass in the Mufhasa Stakes after Grylls copped a seven-day suspension and \$1500 fine for his ride aboard La Crique (NZ) (Vadamos) when winning the Gr.2 AJC Avondale Guineas (2100m) later on the Ellerslie card.

"It is very frustrating to see more senior jockeys being suspended (with Opie Bosson also suspended) when our biggest carnivals are coming up," he said.

"We just don't have enough jockeys for so many to be out at the same time and it has a serious effect on our racing as every week we are searching for riders.

"I understand that there has to be a deterrent and our racing has to be safe, but I'm an advocate for fining them far more than they are now.

"We just don't have the jockey pool to have our best riders sitting on the sidelines each week and it can cause more issues in races when the less experienced are out there."

Richardson also confirmed the immediate task for stable warhorse Tiptronic (NZ) (O'Reilly) who will tackle the Gr.1 Bonecrusher New Zealand Stakes (2000m) at Ellerslie on March 13 following a solid run for fifth on an unsuitable wet track at Te Rapa in the

Gr.1 Herbie Dyke Stakes.

"Tiptronic has come through Te Rapa well and he will be heading to the Bonecrusher next," he said.

"He didn't really handle the ground at Te Rapa, but he kept trying which he always does and he will be ready to go another big race at Ellerslie.

"We are also getting two of our three-year-old fillies ready for the Oaks (Gr.1, 2400m) at Trentham next month with Bigiff heading to the

Sunline Vase (Gr.2, 2100m) at Ellerslie in a fortnight while Aspen Colorado will have her final lead-up in the Lowland Stakes (Gr.2, 2100m) at Hastings."

Raced by her breeder Sandy Moore along with Brent and Wendy Cooper and the Social Racing Starting Gates syndicate, Bonny Lass has won four of her 8 starts and over \$162,000 in prizemoney.

Hallmark Stud will offer a half-sister to Bonny Lass by Shocking as Lot 501 during Book 1 of the New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sales which commences at Karaka on March 7.

LIM'S KOSCIUSZKO MAKES IT TO WIN NO 7

Danny Beasley was in awe when he gave **Lim's Kosciuszko (NZ)** (Kermadec) a squeeze inside the concluding stages of the \$85,000 Class 2 race over 1200m on Saturday.

Just like everybody else, the Australian jockey was blown away by the rising star's impeccable record of seven wins from as many starts at Kranji – putting him only five wins away from Better Than Ever's Malayan Racing Association record of 12 wins in a row.

But what really had Beasley shaking his head in disbelief as he jumped off was the instant reaction he got when he stepped on the gas at the 400m.

"From the 400m to the 200m, he probably did it in 9 ½ seconds when I said 'let's go,'" he said.

"I then switched him off knowing he had the race won. Don't get me wrong, the runner-up (Gold Star) ran a great race, but I was in neutral gear so to speak inside the last 200m."

Shouldering only 54.5kgs, the Kermadec four-year-old was almost toying with the opposition as he ambled up the home straight to win by half-a-length.

"He's a horse who keeps doing his job so professionally," said Beasley.

"He's very tough this horse and I'm not surprised he ran time.

"The only thing today was he got a break of two and a half weeks between races, and he did really well after his last win.

"We would have been more confident if it was two weeks as

we have to keep holding him together for a few days longer, keep him cool.

"But it's worked out okay in the end. I had no plan to ride him like that today, but he began the best and crossing the horses on his inside was easy.

"I tried to keep him as balanced as I could and didn't let him go until the straight. To win seven from seven and the way he did it today showed he was definitely above average."

Winning trainer Daniel Meagher joined Beasley in his enthusiastic post-race assessment of their new pin-up horse – arguably still a long way from the multiple-Group 1 winning deeds of their undisputed kingpin Lim's Lightning, but the happy headache of having the pair on a collision course towards the same race is real – the Kranji Mile (1600m) on May 21.

"This horse has been teaching me a lot, basically on how to keep him right on top," said Meagher.

"He's ultra-competitive, but he did score a soft win today when Dan eased him up. There's more to him, but he's so easy to read.

"We'll look at the Class 1 1200m on March 19 for him next, and then if he goes through his grades, it's on to the Kranji Mile."

Bred by Trelawney Stud, Lim's Kosciuszko was passed in as a two-year-old at the Ready To Run Sales and then sold privately after winning his first and only trial in New Zealand when under the care of Clayton Chipperfield.

Lim's Kosciuszko is the first foal out of Keeper mare Jacquetta, winner of the Listed Welcome Stakes, as well as a Group Two placegetter.

Trelawney Stud will offer a Almanzor half-sister at the upcoming New Zealand Bloodstock Yearling Sale as lot 334.
