SMART 3YO DELIVERS EMOTIONAL GROUP VICTORY

merging three-year-old He's Lucid (NZ) (Contributer) provided Mapperley Stud's Simms Davison with a bittersweet result when he downed a competitive age group lineup at Riccarton.

The Kevin Myers-trained representative's timing was faultless to break his maiden in Saturday's Gr.3 War Decree Stakes (1600m) and is now a

\$10 equal fourth favourite for the Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m).

Davison bred and sold He's Lucid, a son of the late Contributer who tragically passed away at the Matamata nursery last month.

"Contributer had been a big part of our lives and our stud for many years," he said. "It was a tough one to swallow, very difficult.

"From limited numbers, he's performed incredibly well as a sire. I think you'll see more winning in the next six months, he's got a lot of smart young horses coming through."

He's Lucid won at his fifth appearance after earlier placings in the Listed Castletown Stakes (1200m) and

the Listed Wanganui Guineas (1200m).

The gelding accounted for Tony Pike's dual black-type winner Raziah (NZ) (Niagara) and Kiwi Skyhawk (NZ), another highly rated son of Contributer with Stephen Marsh, in the War Decree.

He's Lucid was bought out of Mapperley's New Zealand Bloodstock's National Yearling Sale draft last year by Myers for \$40,000.

"He was a really nice horse and it will be exciting to see what he can go on and do," Davison said.

"He's a big horse and what he's done so early is quite surprising really for such a raw-boned type, he's showing a lot of ability and when he strengthens further, he's going to be even more impressive."

He's Lucid is the first foal bred by Davison from the No Excuse Needed mare Big Dreamer (NZ), who was purchased off Gavelhouse in 2020 for just \$600.

"I had a mate, Johnny Orr, who rang me up and said that I should be buying No Excuse Needed mares to go to Contributer," he said.

"Johnny is a client and a pedigree buff who has mares with me, he's from the South Island and was on my case and kept saying buy No Excuse Needed mares."

Big Dreamer was a five-time winner and showed her quality with placings in the Gr.3 Thompson Handicap (1600m) and the Listed Matamata Cup (1600m).

She was trained by Paul Mirabelli, who secured He's Lucid's brother for \$20,000 at Karaka earlier this year and as Shoma produced a tidy debut performance to finish fourth at Ellerslie on Saturday.

Big Dreamer is due to foal to Profondo and will then make a return visit to the Group One-winning son of Deep Impact.

NEWS IN BRIEF

Te Rapa abandoned

The spate of bad luck with New Zealand tracks continued at Te Rapa on Monday, with the abandonment of racing at the Hamilton venue following several slips.

Jockey Sam Weatherley reported his mount, Ess Vee Are (NZ) (Shocking), had slipped prior to entering the straight before going on to win the opening race of the card, while Joe Doyle and Warren Kennedy reported that their horses, Oppenheimer (NZ) (Belardo) and Sabrina Hall (NZ) (Mongolian Khan), had also slipped in race three, resulting in a decision to abandon the meeting.

"We had the report from Sam Weatherley following race one regarding his horse moving around the final bend. An inspection was carried out following that race and all parties were happy to continue on," stipendiary steward Brady Jones said.

"Prior to race three we had a brief shower of rain and we had reports from Joe Doyle and Warren Kennedy that both of their horses had moved rounding that final bend, probably from the 500m right through to the 400m, and they felt their mounts were shifting.

"We conducted a further inspection following that and found little pieces of movement, nothing glaringly obvious. The riders went back and had a meeting amongst themselves, and they reported to stewards that they didn't have the confidence in the track to ride competitively on it, so the meeting has been abandoned."

Te Rapa had recently been the saviour of the Livamol Classic Day, which was transferred to the track after Hastings was deemed unsuitable for racing following the abandonment of the Arrowfield Stud Plate Day, and its subsequent transfer to Matamata.

A date has yet to be confirmed for the transfer of the Gr.2 James and Annie Sarten Memorial (1400m), which was set to take place at Te Rapa on Monday, with New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing to make an announcement in due course.

CUPS TARGETS FOR ESS VEE ARE

ummer Cups targets are on the horizon for stakes winner **Ess Vee Are (NZ)** (Shocking) following his bold win in the SkyCity Hamilton Waikato Cup Prelude (2400m) at Te Rapa on Labour Day.

In a small but select field, jockey Sam Weatherley took Ess Vee Are straight to the front where they were able to dictate terms throughout. The pair started to apply pressure from the 600m mark and opened up several lengths on their rivals turning for home, and Ess Vee Are was able to hold onto his advantage, running out a 1-3/4 length victor over Canheroc (NZ) (El Roca), with Diamond Jack (NZ) (Jakkalberry) a further four lengths back in third.

Darryn Weatherley, who trains the six-year-old gelding in partnership with his daughter Briar, was pleased with the winning performance.

"Before legging Sam on I said just make sure he is in a nice rhythm," Darryn Weatherley said. "My old boss Jim Gibbs used to tell me, if they are in a good rhythm they are happy horses.

"He executed it perfectly, he skipped off the corner and held on. It was nice to see."

There were a few anxious moments post-race, with Ess Vee Are having slipped and lost a shoe at the top of the straight. However, following a track inspection, the decision was made to proceed with racing.

"We went out with the Stewards, Bart (Cowan, track manager), and a few of us jockeys," Sam Weatherley said. "You could see a couple of little marks (on the track), which happened after he lost his shoes. We put our heads together and made a decision that with the drying weather that there was no real concern going forward and we are happy to race.

"He is such a big gangly horse, and he has never led in his life, so as soon as he got let off the bridle his legs went everywhere. Losing the shoe and putting it altogether, he has moved a little bit and probably made it look a little worse than what it actually was.

"With the protocols now, we all come together and if one person is not happy then we are not happy, but everyone is sweet and ready to go."

Weatherley was impressed with Ess Vee Are's performance, and said he could have won by more if it wasn't for the slip.

"It was a good win," he said. "If that (slip) didn't happen, he could have maybe made it a little more impressive, but he was still impressive enough and it was good to see a good horse back to his best. He lost his way a bit last season, he went to Australia and a few things didn't go quite right. Today with the

small field, he was able to jump and dictate, and bring back his old form."

Initially nominated for next month's Gr.3 Martin Collins New Zealand Cup (3200m) at Riccarton, his Matamata-based trainers have opted to keep the son of Shocking closer to home, eyeing the Gr.3 Waikato Cup (3200m) and Gr.3 Wellington Cup (3200m) over summer.

"We won't have to hammer him, he is a horse that keeps himself pretty fit," Darryn Weatherley said

"Between now and the Waikato Cup I don't know what we are going to do, but that is the plan – Waikato Cup and then Wellington Cup."

Out of O'Reilly mare Reiveke (NZ), Ess Vee Are has now won five of his 26 starts, including the Listed New Zealand St Leger (2600m) at Trentham, and earned more than \$200,000 in prizemoney. – **LOVERACING.NZ News Desk**

JOLIESTAR READY TO DEFEND AUSSIE HONOUR

hris Waller denied a top Japanese galloper in last Saturday's Gr.1 Cox Plate (2040m) and he will look to bring down another of its stars this weekend.

The champion trainer has Cambridge Studowned Joliestar (Zoustar) heading towards the \$10 million Golden Eagle (1500m) at Rosehill.

The Group One-winning daughter of Zoustar is the considered the best local hope in a race that also includes Japanese Group One winner Ascoli Piceno (Daiwa Major) and unbeaten French gelding Lazzat (Territories).

Ascoli Piceno is looking to give Japan back-to-back Golden Eagle wins after last year's win to Obamburumai (Discreet Cat) and will have the services of Joao Moreira, who has warned Waller of what he is up against, but the master trainer is up for the challenge.

"I've spoken to Joao about him and Joao said he's very good," Waller said.

"We saw last year how good the Japanese horses are and that's the beauty of international racing; you get to bring formlines together.

"It's so important for Australia, because it's hard for us in Australia. We've got so much money here in Australia we don't need to travel, so when we get a few horses come here we need to bring our A-game."

Waller packed Via Sistina's (Fastnet Rock) A-game last Saturday at Moonee Valley, where the imported mare thrashed Japan's Prognosis (Deep Impact) by eight lengths in a track-record win in the Cox Plate.

Joliestar will be having her fourth

run of the campaign in the Golden Rose.

She resumed with a stunning win in the Gr.3 Show County Quality (1200m), was then beaten as favourite in the Gr.2 Sheraco Stakes (1200m) before a seventh placing in 1200m The Everest, when she was caught in traffic but flashed late to only be beaten 1-1/2 lengths.

"Joliestar has come through her unlucky run in The Everest well, she's bright and well and 1500 metres will be no problem," he said.

"It's a big race and I'd just like to see her draw well and I'd be very confident she can bounce back."

The Golden Eagle barrier draw will take place in Sydney on Tuesday.

STOTT JOINS NEW ZEALAND RIDING RANKS

ritish hoop Kevin Stott achieved his biggest moment in racing in the colours of Cambridge Stud's Brendan and Jo Lindsay at Royal Ascot four years ago, and now he has made his way to their homeland for a riding stint.

The 30-year-old jockey recorded his first Group One victory aboard the Cambridge Stud part-owned Hello Youmzain in the 2020 edition of the Gr.1 Queen Elizabeth II Jubilee Stakes (1200m) at Royal Ascot, and the son of Kodiac now stands at the Cambridge farm.

"That was the best day in my life in terms of riding career," Stott said. "Unfortunately, it was during the pandemic, so there were no crowds.

"It is something that I will never forget, obviously your first Group One is massive, and I was lucky enough to ride another Group One last year on a very good horse. I have ridden some very nice horses and have a lot of experience all around Europe and all around the world."

Stott has plied his trade in a number of racing jurisdictions around the world and said he has always wanted to ride in New Zealand.

"I had always really wanted to come down and see New Zealand," he said. "I have been to Australia, America, Dubai, Qatar and Bahrain, and I thought I would come down here and have a look.

"A good friend of mine got in touch with Bruce Sherwin who then got me in touch with a few people out here."

Stott arrived in New Zealand last week, and hasn't been idle, riding track work in the Waikato and having his first taste of raceday riding at Monday's meeting at Te Rapa, which was subsequently abandoned.

"The quality of racing is getting better and the increase in prizemoney is a massive plus. I am really looking forward to getting going," he said.

"Hopefully I will be a bit busier next week, I only landed on Wednesday. I have had a couple of days at the tracks, at Cambridge and Matamata." "I am in Cambridge, but I will be doing track work in Matamata and Cambridge, and doing loads of trials to see if I can get some nice horses and hopefully we can get off to a good start."

Stott said he is willing to work hard, and he is hoping that is rewarded by trainers with raceday rides.

"I believe the people in New Zealand appreciate if you work hard, and if you work hard, they reward you," he said.
"That is definitely something I will be doing. Hopefully I can reward them with winners as well as they can reward me with rides."

TOWN CRYER TENACIOUS IN THOMPSON

t takes a talented galloper to run down **Town Cryer (NZ)** (Tavistock), and her rivals were no match for the classy mare in Sunday's Gr.3 Gee and Hickton Funeral Directors Thompson Handicap (1600m) at Trentham.

The Tavistock mare had a career-best season last term, winning the Gr.3 Taranaki Breeders' Stakes (1400m) and Listed Wairarapa Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (1600m), alongside placings in the Gr.3 Anniversary Handicap (1600m) and Gr.1 New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (1600m).

Roydon Bergerson, who trains the mare out of Awapuni, had hoped to target the Hawke's Bay Spring Carnival, but elected to bypass the features and returned to defend her crown in the Taranaki Breeders', where she finished a commendable second to The Hottie (NZ) (Swiss Ace).

Primed for a step-up to the mile, Town Cryer started the \$7.10 thirdfavourite behind Islington Lass (NZ) (Proisir) (\$3.80) and Spencer (NZ) (Derryn) (\$5.70) and she flew away from the barriers, assuming control of the tempo early under Craig Grylls.

Grylls increased the pressure passing the 600m and set a task for the field in the straight, where in her typical fashion, Town Cryer was too tough and held off last year's winner Diss Is Dramatic (NZ) (Dissident) by threequarters of a length to claim the feature.

A photo finish between Liffey (NZ)

(Niagara) and Lightning Jack (NZ) (Per Incanto) respectively completed the first four.

Grylls collected his fourth stakeslevel success for the season in the race, giving plenty of praise for Town Cryer.

"She popped away nicely and got rolling along as she does, but she was beautiful and relaxed the whole way," he said.

"She's best trying to get away from them a little bit, because she can sustain a gallop. The question mark was on the heavy ground, but she's so tough, she just wants to keep on running.

"I thought they were coming at me about the 200, but she gets going

again. She's a very tough mare and has been a great racehorse for the team."

Bergerson indicated post-race that he had questioned whether to start Town Cryer after heavy rain in the region across the weekend, but her quality shone through.

"I nearly scratched her, but there's no races for her for about six weeks until we come back for the Group One," he said.

"She loves it at Trentham, Gryllsy gets on so well with her and I was pretty confident after her run the other day at Hawera, she was just so well above herself.

"She loves the fight, he took her to them at the 600 and they just couldn't get past her."

Town Cryer finished a game seventh

in last year's edition of the Gr.1 Mufhasa TAB Classic (1600m), a result Bergerson hopes to improve when she returns to the venue on December 7.

"She might have to go to Riccarton in the interim, but I'll probably just give her a trial, she races so well fresh. She's a good horse, a really good horse," he said.

"She goes on anything and good horses do that.

"I told the boys at her first start that we have a good horse here, and I think she ran 26 lengths last. I've always had faith in her and I'd like to thank all of my staff, they do a great job with her. It's a hard job for them, but they're there every morning, it's great."

Out of a three-win and Listedperforming mare The Speaker (NZ) (Volksraad), Town Cryer has won eight of her 35 starts with a further 13 minor placings, earning just shy of \$500,000 in stakes for a large ownership group.

FOUR IN A ROW FOR LAZIO

Ilan Sharrock continues to be rewarded for the careful handling of his untapped sprinter **Lazio (NZ)** (Per Incanto), who collected a fourth-consecutive victory in the WRC Life Members 1000 at Trentham on Sunday.

The son of Per Incanto has been lightly-raced by Sharrock, having just his sixth start on Sunday, with five previous appearances resulting in two seconds and three victories in succession.

The market reflected his impeccable record, backing Lazio into \$2.30 favouritism ahead of Bold Belle (NZ) (The Bold One) (\$6) and Waihaha Falls (NZ) (Sacred Falls) (\$8.40) as the only other runners in single figures, which was accurately emulated in the result.

Carrying just 51kg under Rihaan Goyaram, Lazio gained cover early behind Bold Belle and the pair travelled comfortably through the testing conditions down the chute. The gelding got on terms with Bold Belle on straightening and they eventually broke clear of the remainder of the

field at the 100m, fighting out the finish before Lazio proved too strong, taking the contest by a long head with Waihaha Falls a further $1-\frac{1}{2}$ lengths back in third.

Sharrock was thrilled with the five-year-old's performance, particularly in a career limited by soundness issues.

"I'm really proud of him, he's a gorgeous type of animal and he would be a pin-up boy if he was a model," Sharrock said.

"With the issues he's got with his joints, he's doing a terrific job. While there is a bit of precipitation around, I'll probably continue this prep, but the first sign of the tracks firming up, he'll go to the paddock.

"Unfortunately, his body just won't let him do that, it's quite sad in a way but I'm very proud of him in another way.

"There's a Listed race at Te Rapa but the chances of getting an off-track there are probably limited, and if it was firm, there is also an 1100m race at Wellington in a fortnight.

"There's more chance of rain at this end of the island, so it will all be determined by the weather at this stage."

Lazio is raced by Luigi Muollo's Explosive Breeding, who bred the five-year-old alongside Sharrock and Paul Dombroski from Listed winner Madonna Mia (NZ) (Red Clubs). The well-performed race mare has been a star in the broodmare paddock, also producing Group Three placegetter Signora Nera (NZ) (Sweynesse) and champion Hong Kong sprinter Lucky Sweynesse (NZ) Sweynesse).

Madonna Mia, part-owned by Waikato Stud, has been served by Savabeel in the 2024 breeding season.

The victory capped off a successful week for Sharrock, picking up a double at New Plymouth on Friday with Grit (NZ) (Proisir) and Swingit Our Way (NZ) (Zed), while he was also pleased with the performances of juvenile filly Almakeitgood (NZ) (Ardrossan) and Islington Lass (NZ) (Proisir), who finished fifth in the Gr.3 Gee and Hickton Thompson Handicap (1600m) at Trentham.

"I was thrilled with her (Almakeitgood), she absolutely hates heavy ground and was dead on her feet at the 300, then had the audacity to pick herself up and get beaten a head," he said.

"I'm very proud of her efforts and she'd be going close to qualifying for the Karaka Millions, we'll probably look for another race for her pre-Christmas but I like her, she's a really nice filly.

"Islington Lass was very brave to run fifth in the Thompson, I was really proud of her too. She went super."

CLASSY CONNELLO BOOKS HER TICKET SOUTH

ess than 24 hours after watching her former star Belclare (NZ) (Per Incanto) collect the A\$2 million Gr.2 The Invitational (1400m) across the Tasman, Lisa Latta unveiled another Group One hopeful in the same colours at Trentham with **Connello (NZ)** (Time Test) storming home to take out the Happy Hire 1400.

Latta prepared Belclare to win two editions of the Gr.1 New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (1600m) among a number of other feature successes, and now in the care of expat-Kiwi Bjorn Baker, the quality mare displayed her class in an all-the-waywin on the big stage at Royal Randwick.

Belclare was bred and raced by Deb and David Woodhouse, and their familiar black-and-white silks were back on top closer to home on Sunday with the Time Test filly, who was coming off a last-start victory earlier this month at Egmont.

Connello defeated Wire Rope (NZ) (Darci Brahma) on that occasion, but the latter started favourite in Sunday's race at \$2.80 ahead of the filly, who closed at \$4.70. In the hands of Tina Comignaghi, Connello jumped away positively and settled into the one-one behind Anushka Shesastar (NZ) (Proisir), who sat outside of Wire Rope at a leisurely tempo.

Coming off the turn, several of the three-year-olds struggled to kick in the heavy conditions, but Connello was in her element and stormed to the lead at the 200m, continuing to extend the margin to the post over a game Skipper's Canyon (NZ) (Belardo) and Wingman (NZ) (Swiss Ace).

Connello powers away with the Happy Hire 1400 at Trentham on Sunday. (Peter Rubery (Race Images Palmerston North)) Connello holds a nomination for the Gr.1 Barneswood Farm New Zealand 1000 Guineas (1600m) at Riccarton Park, a race Latta has firmly on her agenda in three weeks' time.

"She's just a really genuine filly that does everything right," Latta said.

"I think she'll step-up to the mile and we look forward to heading south for the Guineas."

Latta shared a similar sense of pride after Belclare's victory, particularly for her Wairarapa-based connections.

"I was so proud watching her win a Group race over there and it's great for the owners, Deb and David Woodhouse," she said.

"They really deserve it, and then to top it off with Connello was great."

Bred by David Woodhouse alongside HGT Bloodstock, Connello has won three of her 10 starts and over \$80,000 in stakes for the former and Bill Rutherford. She is the eighth foal out of Woodhouse's homebred Towkay mare Ballieborough (NZ).

Connello's success was one of three by the Latta stable with Popsagoosey (NZ) (Tivaci) and Deadly Pony (NZ) (Puccini) saluting throughout the card, alongside a game Diss Is Dramatic (NZ) (Dissident) finishing second in the Gr.3 Gee and Hickton Thompson Handicap (1600m). – **LOVERACING.NZ News**

ELLERSLIE ON RUTTEN'S RADAR AGAIN AFTER TRENTHAM WIN

rominent owner Chris Rutten knows a thing or two about the Karaka Millions meeting at Ellerslie, and he might be heading in that direction again after a debut victory by **Too Sweet (NZ)** (Satono Aladdin) in Sunday's Graham's Painters 2YO (900m) at Trentham.

Rutten won the Karaka Million 2YO (1200m) with Vespa (NZ) (Elusive City) in 2014 and has since collected minor placings with Kingsman (NZ) (Darci Brahma) (2016), Yourdeel (NZ) (Dundeel) (2019) and Avonallo (NZ) (Belardo) (2021). He also had success with Scott Base (NZ) (Dalghar) in the Karaka Million 3YO (1600m) in 2018.

Rutten paid \$50,000 to buy Too Sweet from the Phoenix Park draft at Karaka earlier this year. She is by exciting Rich Hill Stud stallion Satono Aladdin, while her dam Sparkling Rose (NZ) (Bernadini) comes from the family of quality racehorses and sires Darci Brahma (NZ) (Danehill) and Burgundy (NZ) (Redoute's Choice).

Too Sweet headed into her raceday debut with two trials under her belt, finishing second at Foxton on September 18 before winning at the same venue two weeks later.

The Roydon Bergerson-trained filly was sent out as an \$8 fourth favourite in Sunday's five-horse field, but she upstaged

her more-fancied opponents with a classy and determined performance.

Too Sweet and jockey Lily Sutherland sat back in fourth as Landlock (Merchant Navy), Grocer's Deelight (NZ) (Dundeel) and Almakeitgood (NZ) (Ardrossan) pushed forward through the early stages of the race.

That trio still showed the way coming into the home straight, but then Too Sweet quickened through an opening one from the outside and soon joined in. She found plenty in the testing Heavy10 conditions, reaching her neck out and edging ahead of Almakeitgood to score by a head.

Too Sweet earned \$23,000 from Sunday's win, which has historically been more than enough to secure a place in the Karaka Millions starting gates at Ellerslie on January 25.

"She's a beautiful filly," Bergerson said. "I was surprised that she raced quite greenly today, but she still quickened well in the straight and stuck her neck out and won nicely.

"The Karaka Millions is the big goal. That's the reason Chris bought her, and there's not many better judges when it comes to that race, outside of maybe David Ellis.

"She's qualified now, so it takes the pressure off and we can just pick and choose our path from this point on. We'll give

her a look around Ellerslie at some stage between now and then."

STORM FRONT STRIKES ON DEBUT

torm Front's (NZ) (Snitzel) pedigree, trial form and reputation within the Tony Pike stable created a buzz around his race-day debut in Saturday's Dunstan Horsefeeds 2YO (1100m) at Ellerslie, and the promising colt produced a first-up performance worthy of the hype.

Storm Front is by Australian super-sire Snitzel out of the Per Incanto mare Indecision (NZ), who Pike trained to win six races including the Listed Hallmark Stud Handicap (1200m), Legacy Lodge Sprint (1200m) and NZB Finance Sprint (1200m). Indecision also placed in the Gr.3 Sweynesse Stakes (1215m) and was a close fifth in the Gr.1 Railway (1200m).

Offered by co-breeders Trelawney Stud in Book 1 of Karaka 2024, Storm Front was bought by Pike for \$400,000. The colt has made a highly favourable impression on his trainer through the early stages of his two-year-old preparation, including a smart two-length trial win at Ellerslie on September 10.

Storm Front returned to the same venue to make his debut in Saturday's \$45,000 two-year-old sprint, and he lived up to his \$2.10 favouritism with a dominant performance.

Storm Front broke well from the starting gates and jockey Matt Cartwright sent him forward to sit on the outside of the leader, last-start winner Vega For Luck (NZ) (Lucky Vega).

Once Storm Front got balanced up in the home straight, Cartwright released the brakes and went for gold. The favourite kicked away from Vega For Luck and the strong-finishing Belle Du Monde (Zoustar), pulling ahead to win impressively by two and a quarter lengths.

"He's a pretty progressive colt," Cartwright said. "I've ridden a few two-year-olds this season, and he's definitely one of the better ones.

"He did a bit wrong coming around the turn, and it just goes to show how green he still is and how much improvement he's got. But he put them away well and had a lot more left.

"He's a nice horse going forward. I think he'll be pretty exciting come the autumn."

Storm Front earned \$25,875 from Saturday's win, which propels him straight to the top of the order of entry for the Karaka Millions 2YO (1200m) at Ellerslie on January 25. The weekend's other two-year-old winners, Roc 'N' Ready at Riccarton and Too Sweet at Trentham, each earned \$23,000 and took prominent positions just behind him in the standings.

"He's a lovely horse going forward," Pike said. "We always thought he might be a bit new and green in his first start today,

but most two-year-olds are. He just got on the wrong leg.

"But the best part of his race was the last 200m. He really drew away and did it comfortably in the end, which was good to see.

"We can work our way towards the Karaka Millions now. He's a horse that I think is going to improve with a bit of time on his side, so it's really exciting to have a nice colt like this in the stable.

"He's a Snitzel colt, so it would be nice to get a bit of black type along the way as well if we can. But we'll probably give him a week in the paddock for now and then make some plans after that." – **LOVERACING.NZ News Desk.**
