A NEW ZEALAND-BRED LENS ON THE MELBOURNE CUP

ew Zealand-bred horses have enjoyed a long and fruitful association with the Gr.1 Melbourne Cup (3200m) with 46 winners of the great race including last year's winner Verry Elleegant (NZ) (Zed).

The Kiwi-breds represent six of the 23 runners in the field this year and below we take a look at their credentials and background.

Stockman (NZ) (Tavistock) finished eighth over 2000m at Rosehill on Saturday after winning the St Leger (2600m) a fortnight ago and is six runs into what is an old-fashioned Melbourne Cup campaign.

Fitness won't be an issue and nor will a wet track, with Stockman boasting four wins and a couple of placings on heavy ground.

Bred by Sir Patrick & Lady Justine Hogan, Stockman is one of three runners by Tavistock in the Cup. He was purchased out of Cambridge Stud's 2018 New Zealand Bloodstock Book 1 Yearling Sale draft by Jamie Walter's Proven Thoroughbreds and John Thompson for \$175,000.

The gelding is out of the Group Two winning Zabeel mare Crimson, dam of multiple Group Two winner Abidewithme and Gr.1 VRC Oaks (2500m) runner-up Miss Scarlatti.

It is fair to say **Young Werther (NZ)** (Tavistock) doesn't win out of turn, but Tuesday could be the day for this lightly raced son of Tavistock.

The five-year-old has won in excess of A\$1.1 million from his 14 starts, despite his only win coming in a Geelong maiden.

A very consistent galloper, Young Werther has long been aimed at the Melbourne Cup and finished just on three lengths behind Anamoe in the Gr.1 Cox Plate (2040m). He also likes Flemington and has placed in the last two editions of the Gr.1 Turnbull Stakes (2000m) at the venue.

By noted sire of stayers Tavistock, Young Werther is out of the winning Fastnet Rock mare Romantic Time, who is also the dam of stakes performer Romantic Lady.

The majority of the family have excelled over shorter distances, with the dam a half-sister to the Gr.2 Silver Slipper Stakes (1100m) winner Amelia's Dream.

Young Werther was purchased out of Cambridge Stud's draft at Karaka in 2019 for \$140,000 by Danny O'Brien and Aquis Farm.



Takes the award for the hardest name to pronounce in this year's Melbourne Cup, **Daqiansweet Junior** (NZ) (Sweet Orange) (pronounced Da – Chen- Sweet- Junior) was the winner of this year's Gr.2 Adelaide Cup (3200m) and he also went a huge race in the Gr.1 Sydney Cup (3200m) when third.

While on paper, his recent form looks fair, trainer Phillip Stokes has known he was guaranteed a Cup start for a long time and most of his runs have been sneaky good.

Bred by Brent Gillovic at Highview Stud (breeder of 1991 Melbourne Cup winner Let's Elope), Daqiansweet Junior was offered at the New Zealand Bloodstock Ready To Run Sale

By Regal Farm in 2019 where the son of Sweet Orange failed to meet his \$50,000 reserve.

Initially raced by a famous Chinese actor called Yu Qian (whose nick-name is Da Qian), the gelding was bought by OTI Racing through bloodstock agent Phill Cataldo after winning two races and placing at Group Three level for Murray Baker and Andrew Forsman.

With A\$621,142 in prizemoney, Daqiansweet Junior is the best of three winners out of the Keeper mare Paulette and is the best performer by Hong Kong Group One winner Sweet Orange, who has recently joined the stallion ranks in China.

Smokin' Romans (NZ) (Trish Dunell)

Smokin' Romans (NZ) (Ghibellines) as been a revelation this spring, winning the Gr.3 Naturalism Stakes (2000m) before landing the Gr.1 Turnbull Stakes (2000m) for the Maher-Eustace team, who know how to train a stayer.

'Smokey' spends most of his time at the stable's Fingal base and was sent out favourite in the Gr.1 Caulfield Cup (2400m) where he finished seventh in what was a trot and canter race.

While the Gr.1 Caulfield Cup (2400m) wasn't Jamie Kah's finest ride, the champion hoop has stuck with the Mosgiel-bred gelding as she tries to emulate Michelle Payne and win a Melbourne Cup.

A truly White Robe Lodge product, Smokin' Romans is a tough stayer typical of the southern nursery. By talented sire Ghibellines, Smokin' Romans is out of White Robe Lodge's highly talented mare Inferno, whose 10 wins included two victories in the Gr.3 Canterbury Gold Cup (2000m). She is the dam of three foals, all winners.

Kiwi owner Don Frampton, who has raced Group One winners such as Booming and Trounce secured a share in the gelding following his sale to currently disqualified trainer Darren Weir for \$52,500 during the Book 1 sale at Karaka in 2018 and he was subsequently sent to Maher and Eustace, with New Zealanders making up the bulk of the ownership.

Smokin' Romans handles all surfaces and is a three-time winner over 2500m.

Round of applause for legendry breeders Sir Patrick and Lady Hogan - three Melbourne Cup runners with Stockman, Young Werther and **Tralee Rose (NZ)** (Tavistock) is no mean feat.

This Tavistock mare is lightly raced and likes Flemington, with her only unplaced run in five starts at the track coming in last year's Melbourne Cup when galloped on.

She ran quite well when hampered in the Caulfield Cup when 13th and Warrnambool trainer Symon Wilde knows how to peak a stayer.

Purchased by Cameron Cooke Bloodstock/Symon Wilde Racing for \$50,000 out of the Cambridge Stud draft at the Karaka 2018 - Book 1 yearling Sale, Tralee Rose is one of two winners from two to race out of the stakes-placed Zabeel mare Star Of Tralee.

Third in the Listed New Zealand St Leger, Star Of Tralee is a half-sister to the multiple Oaks winner Serenade Rose.

The daughter of Ocean Park was a last-start winner of the Gr.3 Bendigo Cup (2400m) and she has finished an impressive top-two in 12 of her 22 career starts.

Bred by the Hawkins family under the banner of the Llanhenock Trust, High Emocean was an \$80,000 purchase by bloodstock agent John Foote and Darren Weir out of Wentwood Grange's 2018 New Zealand Bloodstock Book 1 Sale.

A half-sister to Listed winner Elate, High Emocean is one of five winners from as many to race out of the unraced High Chaparral mare High Joy.

A half-sister to dual Listed winner Emperor Bonaparte, High Joy is out of the Group One-placed dam Endless Joy, a half-sister to the 9-time Group One winning champion Bonecrusher.

DREAM DERBY RESULT FOR CAMBRIDGE STUD

hose associated with Cambridge Stud were in full voice during the closing stages of the Gr.1 VRC Derby (2500m) on Saturday as **Manzoice** became his sire Almanzor's first Group One winner.

"It is a dream result," Cambridge Stud chief executive Henry Plumptre said.

"It is one that you hope for but it doesn't happen very often - a Group One in your first crop.

"We have had half a dozen nice colts (by Almanzor) including Dynastic (NZ) in New Zealand and Manzoice in Australia, and a couple of others like King's Crossing (NZ) and Virtuous Circle (NZ)."

Plumptre was full of praise for winning trainer Chris Waller. "We went into it hopeful rather than confident," he said.

"It was the combination of him being a very nice horse and the training genius of Chris Waller that got him over the line.

"He wasn't coming into the race off a perfect preparation. I think Waller is extraordinary at presenting these horses at their peak on the right day."

Plumptre said getting a Derby win so early in his stud career is pivotal for Almanzor as a sire, which Cambridge Stud have supported with a number of their blue hen mares, with several more earmarked to head to the stallion next year following their raceday retirement.

"It is very important for the stallion and vindicates sending mares to him like Probabeel (NZ) (Savabeel) and Amarelinha (NZ) (Savabeel)," Plumptre said.

"We have that nice mare, Excelida (Exceed And Excel), that ran third in the Empire Rose (Gr.1, 1600m) on the weekend. She will come back next year and got to Almanzor.

"She will go to the paddock and have six to eight weeks off. Presuming that she goes right-handed, we have never tried her right-handed, what we would like to do is end up in Brisbane at the Tatt's Tiara (Gr.1, 1400m). I think 1400m is her best trip.

"We have been delighted with the way the Hayes boys have been able to keep her going. She is a sixyear-old mare now and has found about five lengths

in the last year.

"She is Trelawney bred, we bought her off Brent and Cherry (Taylor). They have been great supporters of our stallions, they have never missed buying shares in them.

"It was nice to support them, and we have got a really nice mare out of it."

While still coming down from the high of Saturday's result, Plumptre is looking forward the Gr.1 Melbourne Cup (3200m) where the farm's former stallion Tavistock will have three runners, including Young Werther (NZ), Stockman (NZ) and Tralee Rose (NZ), with all three horses having been bred by Cambridge Stud founders Sir Patrick and Lady Justine Hogan.

Tralee Rose was purchased out of Cambridge Stud's 2018 New Zealand Book 1 Yearling Sale draft by trainer Symon Wilde and bloodstock agent Cameron Cook for \$50,000, while Young Werther was purchased by O'Brien Thoroughbreds and Aquis Farm out of their 2019 draft for \$140,000, and Stockman was purchased out of their 2018 draft by John Thompson Racing and Proven Thoroughbreds for \$175,000.

"We went down to Danny O'Brien's and saw Young Werther working the other morning. He has got to be a good eachway chance," Plumptre said.

"If we can get a homegrown horse across the line, that would be fantastic. He is well weighted, so hopefully he gets a good run." – **NZ Racing Desk**





BREEDER'S CHOICE REAPS DERBY REWARD

lenheim is more accustomed to producing world-class wines than thoroughbreds, but last Saturday local resident Stephanie Hole celebrated her biggest moment as a breeder when **Manzoice** (Almanzor) won the Gr.1 VRC Derby (2500m) at Flemington.

"It's amazing to have bred a Victoria Derby winner," she said.

"I didn't think he was going to be

able to get out being kicked around so much and boxed in, but when he got out and was starting to wind up, I thought he could do it.

"But you never know when you have got James McDonald (jockey) out in front (on runner-up Sharp 'N' Smart (NZ) (Redwood))."

After a lifetime involved in breeding, showing and judging sport horses, Hole decided to try her hand at breeding thoroughbreds just over a decade ago, and she is pleased that she did.

"I have stood up to four stallions at a time. I did breed purebred quarter horses but with it being racing bloodlines, they were all in the 16 hand-plus range," she said.

"I also crossed them with thoroughbred mares and sent sport horses, from a lot of disciplines to a lot

of countries around the world.

"It got too hard to do it all myself and I thought 'I can't get out of horses, and if I am going to pay an agistment farm, it has got to be commercial."

With that in-mind, Hole ventured across the Tasman with bloodstock agent Bruce Perry and secured her foundation thoroughbred mare, Femme Britannia (Encosta de Lago), the second dam of Manzoice.

"I bought Femme Britannia in Australia." Hole said.

"I went to the sales there with Bruce Perry. I have a history in sport horses and did a lot of judging. I was using Bruce for the pedigree but if the conformation isn't there I am not interested.

"Femme wasn't on either of our lists but when I saw her, I just had to have her

"After much pestering of Bruce, I got him to put his hand up. I think he was waiting for someone else to outbid him, but I kept on pestering him.

"She just struck me and being infoal to Fastnet Rock it was hard to argue against. I think it couldn't go wrong until she slipped the Fastnet Rock at ten and a half months."

While her first foray into thoroughbred breeding didn't go to plan, she has had seven healthy foals out of the mare to date, including Choice, the Group Three-winning dam of Manzoice.

"I put Choice through the sales at NZB, but she didn't meet her reserve," Hole said.

"I raced her on my own and I was excited to get a second in the Soliloquy (Listed, 1400m) and she won the Eulogy (Gr.3, 1600m), which I thought was the epitome at that stage from a backyard breeder.

"I have accumulated a few more hoses now and they are all at Wentwood Grange. I am looked after there like I am part of their family."

New Zealand has long held a strong reputation in producing world-class stayers and Hole wanted to continue that tradition with her breeding endeavours.

European Champion Three-Year-Old of his year Almanzor quickly caught her attention when he was announced by Cambridge Stud, and she booked into the son of Wooten Bassett in his debut season at stud.

"I want to breed stayers and I have always loved the European style of horse," Hole said.

"I booked him (Almanzor) before I saw the horse, but I loved him as soon as I saw him.

"The colt (Manzoice) exceeded all expectations. He had that real look at me factor. He knew he was special."

Manzoice was raised at Wentwood Grange, just south of Cambridge, after returning from Australia where Choice was served by Shooting To Win, with the resulting filly set to go through New Zealand Bloodstock's Ready To Run Sale on November 16.

"I brought them straight back to Wentwood (after Choice was served)," Hole said.

"They have done everything, including the yearling prep, at Wentwood. Manzoice just went to Bhima as a consignor (where he sold for A\$340,000 on the Gold Coast).

"I am lucky to have an absolutely stunning filly go through the Ready To Run Sale.

"I am getting a lot of pressure to withdraw her, but she will go through the sale. We will see how that goes on the 16th."

Adding to the excitement of events on Saturday was the foaling of a full-sister to Manzoice at Wentwood Grange.

"A full-sister was born about an hour before the race. I think she is going to be in the mould," Hole said.

Choice will be served this spring by Westbury Stud stallion Tarzino.

ELLIOT PICKS UP TOP GROUP ONE RIDE

yan Elliot's prospects of a Classic double at Riccarton have been boosted with confirmation he will partner **Prowess (NZ)** (Proisir) in this Saturday's Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m).

Elliot is also the regular rider of the unbeaten Legarto (NZ) (Proisir), who is currently a \$1.80 favourite to win the Gr.1 Barneswood Farm New Zealand 1000 Guineas (1600m) on the final day of the New Zealand Cup carnival.

The daughters of Proisir clashed in the Gr.3 Soliloquy Stakes (1400m) at Te Rapa last time out with Prowess finishing third, the first defeat of her career, after suffering an interrupted passage.

"She will probably run this Saturday and Ryan will ride her," said Roger James, who prepares the three-year-old with Robert Wellwood.

"She didn't have much of a chance last time out."

Vinnie Colgan has partnered the filly in both of her recent outings and had a prior engagement to ride Desert Lightning (NZ) (Pride Of Dubai) for Peter and Dawn Williams this weekend, but will be reunited with Prowess if she backs up in the 1000 Guineas.

"She's a very good filly and she got a bit unbalanced the other day and lost her way and then came good again in the last 150m," Colgan said.

"I was already committed to Desert Lightning, he's been holding his own and got an upset chance."

Colgan has been aboard Desert Lightning in all three of his runs this preparation and combined for a last-start fourth in the Gr.2 James & Annie Sarten Memorial Stakes (1400m) at Te Rapa.

The Pride Of Dubai gelding is an \$8 chance in the 2000 Guineas market while Prowess is at a \$5.50 quote and a \$6 chance for the 1000 Guineas.

In the meantime, Colgan has a strong book of rides at Pukekohe Park on Melbourne Cup Day, including Prowess' stablemate Cheaperthandivorce (NZ) (Savabeel) in the Gr.3 Balmerino Stakes (2050m).

The multiple Group Three-winning Savabeel four-year-old

was unplaced when opening her campaign over 1600m at Te Rapa at the end of last month and is expected to be far more competitive on Tuesday.

"The track was a bit off and she didn't pull up that well and she's a lot better than that," Colgan said.

"She will be back up over ground with a nice draw and on a big track she'll be a different horse.

"She's a quality mare and we're expecting a bold run. She has been doing well and while she didn't pull up that flash after Te Rapa, she's 100 per cent now."

Colgan, who has previously won twice aboard Cheaperthandivorce, will ride the Mark Walker-trained Self Obsession (NZ) (Shocking) for the first time in the Listed Karaka Classic (1500m).

The daughter of Shocking was a three-time Group Two winner last season and finished runner-up in the Gr.1 New Zealand Oaks (2400m) to tie with Belle En Rouge (NZ) (Burgundy) in the New Zealand Bloodstock Filly of the Year series.

Following a break, she was given two trial outings before overcoming a tardy start at Te Rapa when resuming to finish an eye-catching sixth over 1400m.

"Stayers can have that good sprint first-up and it's still only 1500m so that's a query," Colgan said.

"You will see her best runs when she's back up over more ground you would think, but I hope her class can carry her through.

"They are good, open fields and I've got some nice rides, but there are five or six horses in each race with just as much of a chance."

SAVABEEL COLT BOOKS A DATE FOR BIGGER TARGETS

hree-year-old colt

Saveadateforme (NZ)
(Savabeel) continued his winning
ways at Goulburn on Sunday taking out
a Class 2 mile with ease for trainer John
O'Shea.

Sporting the silks of Go Racing, Saveadateforme placed fourth on debut at the beginning of October before coming from last to score at Kembla Grange.

The colt backed up that performance with a four-length romp at Goulburn under Chad Schofield.

Go Racing's Albert Bosma was impressed by the win and has earmarked the Gr.3 New Zealand Bloodstock 3YO Spring Stakes (1600m) at Newcastle on November 12 as the next target for the promising galloper.

"It was a good win, he could have won by double the margin," Bosma said.

"He has a great turn of foot. As long as he comes through this race well, he will probably head to Newcastle in a fortnight for the Spring Stakes.

"He is very talented but still has a lot of maturing to do physically so whatever he does this preparation, we are very excited about his prospects in the Autumn."

Saveadateforme was bought by Go Racing out of breeder Waikato Stud's draft at New Zealand Bloodstock's National Yearling Sale for \$220,000.

He is a son of the late O'Reilly mare Dating (NZ), who was a quality act

during her racing days and won five races, including two at Group Three level and finished third the Gr.1 Captain Cook Stakes (1600m).

Meanwhile, another in the Go Racing stable by Savabeel, Atishu (NZ), lost no admirers following her fifth placing in the Gr.1 Empire Rose Stakes (1600m) at Flemington.

"She was very unlucky," Bosma said of the Chris Waller-trained mare.

"She got blocked twice in the straight and was hurtling at the line. With a clear run she finishes in the top three and would have threatened lcebath (NZ) (Sacred Falls), the winner.

"As long as she comes through the run well she will head to the Matriarch Stakes (Gr.2, 2000m) on the final day of the carnival at Flemington."





ANDERTON SET FOR BUSY CUP DAY

for veteran Mosgiel horseman
Brian Anderton.

Training in partnership with son Shane, Anderton has 14 runners set to line up at their home track meeting at Wingatui.

Additionally, the master of famed Southern nursery White Robe Lodge will be keeping a close eye on the Gr.1 Melbourne Cup (3200m), where **Smokin' Romans (NZ)** (Ghibellines),

a horse he bred with wife Loraine, will contest the great race.

Although White Robe Lodge is already linked to Melbourne Cup success, the octogenarian breeder would dearly love to have his name listed as a Cup winning breeder.

Smokin' Romans, a son of resident stallion Ghibellines, gives Anderton a solid chance of achieving that goal.

Prior to a last start seventh in a slowly run Gr.1 Caulfield Cup (2400m),

Smokin' Romans had triumphed in both the Gr.1 Turnbull Stakes (2000m) and Gr.3 Naturalism Stakes (2000m).

Prepared by Ciaron Maher and David Eustace, Smokin' Romans will be ridden by star jockey Jamie Kah and has just 51.5kgs in the two-mile feature.

"It will be a big day on Tuesday. I am not sure if I will go to the races and I will watch the Cup at home. There will be a few that will call in I'd say," Anderton said.


"I gave that Caulfield Cup run away. He didn't look like the horse he had been at his previous starts. I don't know why, but he didn't seem to have that bit of vigor about him that he had.

"I watched the replay and when they sprinted, he got left a bit flat footed and was battling from then on. It seemed to be a slowly run race and you can put a line through the run for a lot of the horses in it.

"We prepared **Tawrrific (NZ)** (Tawfia) (1989 Melbourne Cup winner), who was born and raised here at White Robe and **Baghdad Note (NZ)** (Kurdistan) (1970 winner) was foaled here.

"Lomondy (NZ) (Noble Bijou) and Swell Time (NZ) (Mellay) both won the Caulfield Cup and hopefully we can go one better and breed a Melbourne Cup winner," Anderton said.

While the barriers will crash back in the Melbourne Cup at 5pm New Zealand time, Anderton will have half of his racing team stepping out at their bumper home-track meeting, including last-start winner **Exchange (NZ)** (Ghibellines) in the Grand Casino Open Handicap (1400m).

Like Smokin' Romans, Exchange is a son of Ghibellines and the six-yearold gelding is only just coming into his prime with the long-range plan is the Gr.3 White Robe Lodge (1600m) in early February next year.

"We are a bit slower getting going down here in the spring and all of our good racing starts from here on and we have good autumn meetings too," Anderton said.

"Exchange has only just matured now, both mentally and physically.

"It was a good win fresh up. It wasn't a strong field but you can't beat the way he did it. I am not sure as to how he will be in the ground (heavy). He has done very well since he raced and I expect a big run from him again."

Anderton also believes **Ruby's Lad** (**NZ**) (Ghibellines) and **Haggle** (**NZ**) (Ghibellines) are others that can return to form.

"Ruby's Lad seems to be alright again. The first-up win seemed to flatten him and then we had a few problems with his teeth, but he is over it all now and Shane said yesterday that he was very happy with him," he said.

"Haggle will be an interesting one. We have a fair opinion of him. He did disappoint at his last two starts but once again he seems to have turned a corner and the three-kilo allowance will help a bit."

Ghibellines will be represented by 19 runners at the Dunedin race meeting and Anderton is delighted with the job the well credentialed Shamardal stallion is doing.

"He is at the stage now where he

has got enough runners about to represent him and they are big horses that are a bit slower maturing. They are late growers.

"He is doing the job and has got enough around now to keep doing it."

Meanwhile, Anderton was buoyed by further New Zealand bred success across the Tasman on Saturday, where Icebath (NZ) (Sacred Falls) won the Gr.1 Empire Rose Stakes (1600m), I Wish I Win (NZ) (Savabeel) took out the A\$10 million Golden Eagle (1500m), and young Cambridge Stud stallion Almanzor sired his first Group One winner when Manzoice landed the VRC Derby (2500m).

"It might have turned a little bit back towards the New Zealand breds, whereas the Aussies were tending to get European horses in," Anderton said.

"I have got three young horses by Almanzor so it was good to see him get a Derby winner and great to see New Zealand breeders doing so well."

WAIKATO STUD'S DOUBLE FOR THE AGES

hrough the decades, breeding powerhouse Waikato Stud has celebrated countless big results on the track and in the sale-ring, but none as satisfying as the massive weekend double by I Wish I Win (NZ) (Savabeel) and Icebath (NZ) (Sacred Falls).

Within the space of 15 minutes on Saturday evening, I Wish I Win won the A\$10 million Golden Eagle (1500m) at Rosehill and Icebath shook off her Group One bridesmaid's tag with victory in the A\$1 million Empire Rose Stakes (1600m) at Flemington.

I Wish I Win's victory in the second richest race on the Australian calendar capped an incredible story from unsaleable wonky-legged foal to multi-millionaire, while for Icebath the sweet taste of Group One glory was recognised by all who have witnessed her 38-start career.

The celebrations at Waikato Stud were shared by those who had played a part in the breeding and rearing of both horses, with I Wish I Win a son of Savabeel, while Icebath is a daughter of the late Sacred Falls.

Leading the charge was stud principal Mark Chittick, who shares in the ownership of I Wish I Win with trainer and long-time mate Peter Moody.

"I would have loved to be at Rosehill with Moods but we're in the middle of our busiest and most important time of the year," Chittick said.

"We're 60 per cent of the way through something like 700 mares in the breeding shed, we've foaled down a bit over 200 and the yearlings come into the boxes on Wednesday, so it's full on around here and right now this is where I belong.

"At the end of the day sharing it with 40 people who put heart and soul into the farm – enjoying and celebrating it with them – that means every bit as much to me."

I Wish I Win's journey from a foal with a severely deviated foreleg to

Group One-placed two and three-yearold before being transferred to Moody has been well documented.

He will always have far from perfect conformation, but that has not hindered his rise to winning Saturday's lucrative four-year-old pop-up race that was won last year by fellow Kiwi-bred I'm Thunderstruck (NZ) (Shocking).

"Doing it with Moods is special," added Chittick.

"He and other Aussie trainers like John O'Shea and Danny O'Brien have been mates for years.

"We're all around the same age and have come through together, there's that special bond and days like this definitely mean so much.

"Talking to Moods afterwards, the satisfaction he took from what he describes as hitting the target was huge – he described it as his Melbourne Cup.

"It was a massive payday for both of us and I know he'll make good use of his share with the stable he's in the middle of building at Pakenham.

"The race itself wasn't an easy watch, especially over the last 150 metres or so.

"I'm thinking when he hit the front 'I hope you haven't gone too soon', and then the Waller mare (Fangirl) came hard at him, but he was up for it and he won by enough.

"It just about lifted the roof off here; we were all with Luke Nolen riding him home.

"It's just one of the really neat

stories when you think where he's come from, it just shows you that every horse you breed deserves its chance.

"He's an absolute trooper and it means so much to all of us here at Waikato to see him do that."

Satisfaction of a different sort came only 15 minutes later with Icebath's win in the Empire Rose Stakes at Flemington.

"If ever a horse deserved to win a Group One it was her," Chittick said of the six-year-old with just four previous wins and no less than 16 minor placings, five of them at Group One, from 37 starts across five seasons.

"She's been so close so many times in the past and to be fair even before this had won more than \$5 million, but this is the cherry on top."

Prodigal was sold by Ainsley Downs Stud at the New Zealand Bloodstock 2019 Ready To Run Sale for \$47,500 to Bevan Smith Bloodstock and trainer Michael Clements who celebrated five winners on the card and seemed to be particularly satisfied by the win of Prodigal.

"He's a difficult horse. Mind-wise, he's just a difficult horse to have in a consistent place all the time," he continued.

"He's very flighty and very fiery. We had been hoping that with time – and it has taken a long time – that eventually the penny was going to drop with him and he would settle down.

"His last win in a Class 5 race (on July 24) was okay. He's actually been running some fair races since then.

"The mile and the way Simon rides – the style of getting back and being patient on horses - would definitely suit him.

"He's come through, won and headed in the right direction. Finally!"

Kok – who had earlier ridden Burgundy Lad (NZ) (Burgundy) to win the Class 5 race over 1200 agreed that a patient ride was needed.

"I would say the last furlong – the last 200m – he really took a long time to wind up," said the Ipoh-born jockey.

"He still had plenty underneath him from the 600m. He was tracking up so nice - plenty in hand.

"I was lucky – there was a big run on the inside – so I took it and he just kept winding up.

"I didn't think I would win until the last 150m and I swapped (the whip) to the left and he started making ground - stronger and stronger.

"He's still very immature. He will get longer and when he matures, he will be better."

Other New Zealand bred winners at Kranji on Saturday included War Frontier (NZ) (Declaration Of War), Ksatria (NZ) (Reliable Man), & Absolute Radiance (NZ) (Contributer).
