WELLINGTON GUINEAS ON THE CARDS FOR THE RACKETEER

he Gr.2 Life Direct Wellington Guineas (1400m) is the likely target for The Racketeer (NZ) (Proisir) after his gutsy victory at Te Rapa on Saturday.

The Racketeer, one of two winners for the day for the Cambridge partnership of Shaune Ritchie and Colm Murray, led most of the way for in-form apprentice Kelsey Hannan to hold off a useful Rating 65 field over 1200m.

Ritchie said The Racketeer was an

exciting horse but he was unlikely to take on the big guns in the Karaka Million 3YO Classic (1600m) at Pukekohe next month.

"At his previous two starts he ran into the 1000 Guineas winner Legarto (NZ) (Proisir) and was only beaten 2.8 lengths, and the start after that he was beaten by the top male in Wild Night (NZ) (Vanbrugh), and they will be the favourites for the Karaka Mile," Ritchie said.

"So playing it smart and running him in the right races, perhaps the second tier three-year-old races, might be best for him. Because the Wellington Guineas is over 1400m and one week before the Karaka Million, he might dodge a few of the other horses that are going for that race."

Ritchie and Murray had been trying to teach The Racketeer to settle better in his races but they have now decided

he's better being allowed to roll along in front.

"He just doesn't seem to be able to hit the line as well when we're fighting him," Ritchie said.

"We've come to accept that he likes to roll along a bit, and when he got a soft sectional at Te Rapa he looked a couple of time he might get headed, but he was very strong. I thought he was coming away at the line."

The Racketeer had previously raced in the colours of the Ritchie stable but on Saturday he debuted new colours of Grosvenor Park, an agistment farm near Cambridge run by one of the horse's co-owners, Scott Massey.

"It's a new boutique spelling farm, a beautiful bit of land there between Milan Park and Wentwood Grange. We took all our yearlings out there last year, and it's going to be a massive bonus for us," Ritchie said.

"Fortunately, Scott had his staff party at the track, with two groups of 20 out there cheering the horse home, so they've had a great Christmas party. They might have lifted him the last bit, the noise they were making."

Ritchie's other winner at Te Rapa was the four-year-old **Regazzo (NZ)** (Tavistock), who scored his second victory of the season when taking out a Rating 65 1600m event in the hands of Opie Bosson.

Regazzo holds a nomination for the Gr.2 Auckland Cup (3200m) in March but Ritchie said his season target was more likely to be a very different event, the Gr.2 Easter Handicap (1600m) in April.

"He had wind surgery before he

won first-up last season, but since that surgery we've worked out that he's probably best kept fresh and running at a mile," he said.

"We're going to race him once a month and keep him to 1600m. We're probably more likely to try to get him into a race like the Easter Handicap with a light weight."

Ritchie was also impressed with the effort at Te Rapa of **Hammer Time** (NZ) (Vadamos), a granddaughter of the outstanding racemare Romanee Conti (NZ) (Sir Tristram). Hammer Time worked hard to lead in a maiden 1600m event but still fought strongly to finish third.

Ritchie hopes he can get Hammer Time to the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m) in late summer.

"He moves like a dead-set stayer," he said. "He'll win a big race, nothing surer, but he just needs to straighten up and concentrate a little more."

HINEPARA'S EFFORT AUGURS WELL FOR FUTURE

restige winner **Hinepara (NZ)**(Darci Brahma) delivered exactly the Te Rapa performance trainer

Josh Shaw was hoping for and an effort that has fuelled further feature staying race ambitions.

The reigning Gr.2 Avondale Cup (2400m) champion made her first appearance for six weeks in Saturday's open 1600m event and the Darci Brahma mare was doing her best work late in the piece to run fourth.

"It was good to see a run like that and I was proud to see her show a bit of form," Shaw said.

"I thought she would run a good

race and I had rung the owners and said if she doesn't run in the top six I would be disappointed."

The Levin trainer has had his share of problems with Hinepara, but now believes she has turned a corner.

"I haven't quite got her 100 percent right, she's had quite a few foot issues this year so I've been behind the eight ball a bit," Shaw said.

"She had a gallop last week with my good mare Faraglioni (NZ) (El Roca) and showed me then that she was coming back to her peak."

The defence of her Avondale Cup title is on Hinepara's program on the

way to a crack at the Gr.2 Barfoot & Thompson Auckland Cup (3200m).

"I've pencilled in for her to go to the Taupo Cup and then the Trentham Stakes and three weeks later there is an open 2100m at Awapuni to lead into the Avondale Cup," Shaw said.

"Hopefully, this time we can get to the Auckland Cup and then that will be her done. She didn't get there last time with a little issue.

"We could have got her to the race, but she wouldn't have been 100 percent so we pulled up stumps and put her in the paddock."

Shaw was also delighted with the last start performance at Te Rapa of his progressive mare Faraglioni and believes the daughter of El Roca is capable of making her mark in top company.

The four-year-old has been successful in three of her nine starts and had won during the Hawke's Bay carnival and on her home track before she finished third at Te Rapa.

"I honestly don't know how good she is. Everything she is doing is coming while she is still learning," Shaw said.

"She's still floating around so once she puts it all together I think she will be a pretty serious racehorse."

Shaw has his fingers crossed Faraglioni will make the field for the \$100,000 special conditions event at Pukekohe Park on Boxing Day.

"I'm hoping she gains a start

on Monday in the Stella Artois Championship Final (1500m) and I think she will be spot on for that," Shaw said.

"I had been a bit kind on her after she won at Otaki. She banged a leg and I backed off her for 10 days and missed a little bit of work leading into Saturday's race.

"She needed a good hit-out to go to Monday's race so we got what we needed." – **NZ Racing Desk**

All-Star Mile for I'm Thunderstruck

Group One winner **I'm Thunderstruck (NZ) (S**hocking) is being set once more towards the A\$5 million All-Star Mile (1600m) at The Valley on March 18.

The son of Shocking finished runner-up to Zaaki (Leroidesanimaux) in the rich feature at Flemington earlier this year, and his connections are keen to try and get the lion's share of the purse in March.

Trained by Mick Price and Michael Kent Jnr, I'm Thunderstruck carries the silks of OTI Racing.

"The All-Star Mile is a race that fits perfectly into I'm Thunderstruck's preparation. Given the lucrative prizemoney on offer, it is a most enticing option for our five-year-old gelding," OTI Racing principal Terry Henderson said.

"He is a popular horse and we'd expect him to poll enough votes to gain an automatic entry. Doing so takes away any uncertainty or the need to rely on a wildcard. Either way, Thunder will bring a great deal to the race and we'd be surprised, as long as he stays fit and well, if he wasn't lining up in the race.

"This race, courtesy of the public vote system and associated benefits for the winning owner ambassadors, generates a great deal of positive interest in the industry. While it doesn't carry a Group One rating, the field is becoming a Group One class line-up. For the owners of the contending horses, the prizemoney available is outstanding."

The New Zealand-bred gelding had a pleasing spring, winning the Gr.1 Makybe Diva Stakes (1600m) and was runner-up in the Gr.1 Memsie Stakes (1400m), Gr.1 Caulfield Stakes (2000m), and Gr.1 Cox Plate (2040m).

TALENTED TWO-YEAR-OLD PUTS STAPHANOS ON THE BOARD

ith a dominant performance at Trentham on Saturday, promising two-year-old filly **Pignan (NZ)** became a fitting first winner for Novara Park stallion Staphanos.

A placegetter in both of her two previous appearances, the Lisa Latta-trained filly was a class above her four rivals in Saturday's Kernow Construction 2YO (1100m). She produced an impressive turn of foot in the hands of jockey Joe Doyle, kicking clear to score by three and a half lengths.

Pignan is the first runner and first winner for Staphanos, who now holds a narrow lead over Embellish and Santos on New Zealand's first-season sire standings.

"It was really exciting to see him sire his first winner on

Saturday," Novara Park principal Luigi Muollo said. "She was actually the very first Staphanos foal to be born.

"We've always known she was a good filly. She'd just missed the start in her previous race and then got a check, but she won well on Saturday and it was very exciting."

Staphanos himself was a maiden winner at two but went on to far greater things as he matured. The son of Deep Impact won three races up to Group Three level as a three-year-old, then was a multiple Group One placegetter in Japan and Hong Kong at the ages of four, five and six.

"When you're dealing with the Deep Impact breed, I've always believed that anything you get before April or May of the two-year-old season is a bonus," Muollo said. "It's all

about getting them matured. The fact that this filly was the first Staphanos born may have helped her get there a little bit quicker.

"I think the three-year-old season is when most of them will get there. Staphanos himself was invited to the Cox Plate (2040m) at the end of his three-year-old season, and then he really carried on with it as a four, five and six-year-old.

"With most of his progeny that I've got, I would say they're Guineas or classic types next season, so I'm taking that approach with them. I don't want to push them too hard, too early."

Staphanos sired almost 80 foals from his first two-yearold crop, and his progeny were snapped up by a number of reputable stables. At Karaka earlier this year, Chris Waller and David Ellis secured well-related Staphanos yearlings for \$250,000 and \$200,000 respectively.

"His first and second books were very big," Muollo said. "He dropped a bit in his third year, but has popped up again this year.

"He served 109 mares in his first crop and produced 77 live foals, so he's going to get every chance. One that I sold to Te Akau from my Explosive family was placed in a trial the other day. She's gone out for a spell now and will be back to race in March or April.

"Chris Waller has one out of Extra Explosive, so they're in very, very good hands. I tried to support the stallion with good numbers and quality mares, and hopefully that will pay off."

Buyers will have access to a handful of yearlings by Staphanos at Karaka 2023, with eight of his progeny in the catalogue for Book 2.

Meanwhile, this spring has marked the arrival of the first foals by Novara Park newcomer King Of Comedy.

Runner-up in the prestigious Gr.1 St James's Palace Stakes (1600m) at Royal Ascot, King Of Comedy is by the international sensation Kingman.

"I'm really happy with King Of Comedy's first foals, which look very much like him," Muollo said. "Day in and day out, Kingman just keeps stepping up. He was the second-fastest to 50 stakes winners, beaten only by Frankel.

"I think they'll perform well in this part of the world. The Green Desert and Invincible Spirit line has had a lot of success here with horses like I Am Invincible, Showcasing, and Charm Spirit has popped up again lately, so I think the Australians will have a lot of recognition and respect for it."

The third member of the Novara Park roster is Sweynesse, who has sired 45 winners including five at black-type level, and last weekend's Hong Kong International Races left Muollo wondering what might have been.

"Sweynesse was very unlucky not to have a Group One performer with Lucky Sweynesse in the Hong Kong Sprint (1200m)," he said. "He just couldn't get out, but probably would have gone close to winning the race if he did. That's the breaks in racing sometimes.

"He's only going to improve from here, and there's another Group One sprint there at the beginning of February. He'll only need a little bit of luck in the running to be a very big chance in that. I think he can probably get out to 1400m and maybe 1600m too, because he relaxes well and doesn't have to lead, so that gives him a few more options in the future. It's exciting.

"I've got his dam in foal to Sweynesse again now, and the dam's half-sister is as well, so hopefully there'll be plenty more to come with this family." – **NZ Racing Desk**

RICH HILL MILE NEXT FOR IN-FORM ENCIERRO

varied training regime is proving the perfect formula for in-form galloper **Encierro (NZ)** (El Roca) who continued his rich vein of form when successful in the Nationwide Livestock Mile (1600m) at Te Rapa on Saturday.

The Stephen Marsh-trained fiveyear-old has been rehabilitated from a serious tendon injury which he suffered after one start. He posted his fifth win from 14 career starts in a strong open handicap on Saturday.

Ridden by Sam Weatherley, the son of El Roca tracked the leaders throughout and despite having to wait for a gap mid-stretch dashed away from stakes winners Germanicus (NZ) (Rip Van Winkle), Paisley Park (NZ) (Azamour) and Hinepara (NZ) (Darci Brahma) to win by a length and a half under a hold.

"He did everything right yesterday," Marsh said. "He can be a bit wayward in his races but yesterday he settled well and though it was hard to find a gap when he finally got out, he stretched out and didn't want to do anything wrong. It was a very impressive win alright."

Encierro has won three of his past four starts, all at Te Rapa, and Marsh

is deriving plenty of satisfaction from seeing the gelding reach his potential.

"It was quite a bad tendon injury. It was pretty much a retirement job, but we gave him plenty of time," Marsh said. "He now just swims every day. He has probably only had a saddle on his back twice in the last three months beyond racedays and he does a lot of treadmill work."

Te Rapa and Hastings have been the locations for Encierro's past 12 starts, with consistency the key.

"I just wanted him to stick to the one direction (anti-clockwise) given

he is a tendon horse so that we are not going left and right-handed all the time," Marsh said.

"He seems to love Te Rapa and there is always a perfect race for him there. He has been the easiest horse to programme because there is always a good race there for him. He loves the track and it can be a bit of a horses for courses venue but it suits him."

As fortune would have it, Te Rapa will also be the venue for Encierro's next outing, the Gr.2 Rich Hill Mile (1600m) on New Year's Day.

"We were looking at the Taupo Cup, which is a \$70,000 race but the way he won yesterday and given the Rich Hill Mile is a handicap and he should get in well at the weights, you really have to have a crack," Marsh said.

Meanwhile, the Cambridge horseman was pleased to finally get some black-type with well-bred mare Oseleta (Deep Field), who finished third in the Gr.2 Manawatu Challenge Stakes (1400m) at Trentham on Saturday won by Darci La Bella (NZ) (Darci Brahma).

"We have been desperately trying to get black-type and she hasn't had a lot of luck," Marsh said.

"She was beaten a nose for third at her previous start and I thought yesterday she travelled beautifully, even though she was back. It was probably the best I have seen her hit out and attack the line for a wee while. It looks like she is going to potentially get a mile now, which is good so we will just try and get as much black-type as we can."

Marsh said the Gr.1 New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders' Stakes (1600m) shaped as the right long-term target for the five-year-old daughter of Deep Field, who prefers ease in the ground.

"She will only run in stakes races from here in and we will be watching the weather with her," he said.

Marsh proved he had several strings to his bow at Te Rapa on Saturday where his duties extended to judging the Fashions in the Field contest.

Trackside TV cameras broadcast the debonair trainer in full fashionistamode and he was quick to receive plenty of feedback from his industry contemporaries.

"I had my phone on silent and then I turned my phone on and was getting bombarded with texts and videos. People loved it and I copped plenty," Marsh said.

"It was sponsored by Waikato Equine Veterinary Centre and Greg Quinn, the main surgeon there, asked me a few weeks ago if I would present the awards and I said I'd be honoured.

"There was a very good line up of well-dressed ladies. The men's department was a bit rough around the edges and a bit smaller but there were a lot of very good keen ladies," Marsh said. – **NZ Racing Desk**
