VADAMOS SHINES **WITH FIRST GROUP ONE**

Rich Hill Stud principal John Thompson has a spring in his step after two members of his exciting stallion roster posted Group victories at Matamata on Saturday.

Resident stallion **Proisir** (Choisir) added another Group victor to his resume when his son **Pier (NZ)** took out the Gr.2 Hawkes' Bay Guineas (1400m), while **Vadamos** (Monsun) recorded his first Group One win as a sire courtesy of **La Crique's (NZ)** dominant

performance in the Arrowfield Stud Plate (1600m).

"It was a great weekend, particularly getting those results on your home track," Thompson said.

La Crique had a standout three-year-old season, winning five of her eight starts and never finishing out of the placings. The Simon and Katrina Alexander-trained filly was a luckless runner-up in the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m) and also recorded

victories in the Gr.2 Avondale Guineas (2100m) and Gr.3 Desert Gold Stakes (1600m).

She resumed with a third placing in the Gr.1 Tazirino Trophy (1400m) last month on a very heavy track before winning by 3-3/4 lengths in Saturday's postponed Group One.

"We all know what she (La Crique) did last year and she was unlucky in the Derby. You don't see them demolish

Group One fields like that (on Saturday) very often," Thompson said.

She gave her sire Vadamos a valuable maiden Group One victory as a sire and Thompson is looking forward to her showcasing her talents in Australia over the coming month.

"It is crucial to get Group One winners. He (Vadamos) was a Group One winner himself and now he has got a Group One winner. Those sort of results are great," Thompson said.

"On those runs you would imagine she (La Crique) would be competitive in Australia. She seems to handle firm and soft tracks, which is a big advantage going over there."

The Gr.1 Empire Rose Stakes (1600m) and Gr.1 Mackinnon Stakes (2000m) at Flemington have been earmarked for La Crique, who is the best performer to date for Vadamos, a Group One winning miler by the great German sire Monsun.

Earlier on the card Pier was also impressive when winning the Hawke's Bay Guineas by 2-1/4 lengths for trainers Darryn and Briar Weatherley.

He added to his sire Proisir's burgeoning record at stud, with the Rich Hill Stud stallion already boasting elite level victories with Levante (NZ) and Dark Destroyer (NZ), with Pier looking to add to that tally when he contests the Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m) at Riccarton next month.

"We always believed Proisir was only

going to go from strength-to-strength from the mares and books he has covered," Thompson said.

"He has got a lot of other good horses going around as well, like Prowess and Legarto.

"To my mind, going forward he is a horse that could end a champion sire in the future with his better bred and bigger crops over the next few years."

Thompson was particularly pleased for the owner-breeders of both horses.

"It is really exciting for the Weatherley family (who bred and part-own Pier) and John and Jan Cassin, the owner-breeders of La Crique," he said.

"It is great for the people that support the stallions and go on and race the horses to have success like they had on the weekend."

FLEMINGTON DOUBLE THE AIM FOR LA CRIQUE

Sydney's big wet has helped persuade the **La Crique (NZ)** (Vadamos) team to send her to Melbourne for a potential pair of Flemington features.

La Crique's dominant victory in the Gr.1 Arrowfield Stud Plate (1600m) at Matamata on Saturday raised a number of questions about her

potential next target, with the Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m) at Hastings this coming Saturday seen as a potential option.

But Katrina Alexander, who trains the mare at Matamata with her husband Simon, said they would stick with their plan of going to Australia, targeting the Gr.1 Empire Rose Stakes

(1600m) for fillies and mares at Flemington on October 29 and then possibly the Gr.1 Mackinnon Stakes (2000m) at the same track a week later.

Though La Crique is still in the A\$10 million Golden Eagle (1500m) at Rosehill on October 29, the weather

in Sydney, which has endured a horrendously wet year, and the lesser status of the Golden Eagle means Melbourne is a better option for them.

"There's a lot of money up for grabs for sure in the Golden Eagle, which makes it very tempting, and I'm sure she's more than capable of running a huge race there, but the weather does make us a little bit nervous," Alexander said.

"But her owners (John and Jen Cassin), will be looking to breed from her eventually, the Group One status of the Empire Rose is important to them. They are keener to go for a traditional black type programme for her instead."

The Mackinnon, against the males, is only a week later than the Empire Rose, but Alexander is confident she could handle two races in consecutive weeks.

"History tells us that the more she races, the easier she is to manage. She put together a fairly lengthy campaign last time and continued to thrive," Alexander said.

"We've never backed her up this quickly before, but because she thrives on the racing we'd be happy to run her in the Mackinnon if she's doing well we'd give her a crack at it."

Alexander had considered even bigger targets for La Crique, who won the Gr.2 Avondale Guineas (2100m)

and was an unlucky second in the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m), but she's decided they would be better for La Crique as a five-year-old.

"To me she's a Cox Plate (Gr.1, 2040m) horse, when the time's right for her," Alexander said.

"It was thrown around for this year, but even after the Derby last year our plan was to go to Australia for a look-around, pick a couple of races that might suit her nicely, and then really target something like the Cox Plate as a five-year-old.

"This year's Cox Plate also looks like it will be extremely strong so it's possibly not a year too for that."

Alexander said La Crique had recovered very well from the Arrowfield Stud Plate, something that was helped by having the race on her home track and thus avoiding a long float ride.

"We find after a trip of any length that for a couple of days you have to leave them alone, but we were able to take her to the track this morning and she was very happy," she said.

La Crique has been booked to fly to Australia on October 18. Alexander said it was likely she would be based at Mornington, south of Melbourne, but that has yet to be confirmed.

Also still to be confirmed is who will ride La Crique in Melbourne, with the

Alexanders considering a few potential jockeys.

"We are looking at the options," she said. "I don't want to say who we're in discussions with – that's a process that's going on at the moment – but we'd be more than comfortable with the choices that we have in front of us."

Alexander doesn't have many other horses in work at present. Her mare **Farrenc (NZ)** (Dalghar) was due to race at Matamata on Saturday but was scratched after drawing wide and will seek another option shortly.

"She's been very honest and has run in behind some nice horses so I'm hoping she finds a bit of form before the tracks get too firm for her," she said.

Te Toki (NZ) (Tarzino), fourth in the Gr.2 Auckland Guineas (1600m) last season, is in work, while Alexander is looking forward to seeing her five-year-old mare **Stopalltheclocks** (Real Impact), a two-race winner, resume.

"We've been waiting for her to strengthen up. She'll head towards staying distances this season," she said.

Stopalltheclocks will trial at Te Awamutu for Alexander tomorrow, along with the unraced filly **Franni Caccini (NZ)** (Puccini).

CIRCUMSTANCES FORCE UNCONVENTIONAL APPROACH

Co-trainer Graham Richardson's hand has been forced with **Defibrillate (NZ)** (Shocking), who will resume his New Zealand career without a preparatory outing ahead of Saturday's Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m) at Hastings.

His lead-up plans for the multiple Australian black-type winner were upset by the abandonment of the middle day of the Hawke's Bay carnival and the Gr.1 Arrowfield Stud Plate (1600m) then rescheduled to last Saturday's Matamata meeting.

"He will run first up over a mile and a-quarter, it's not ideal but at the end of the day it would have been worse to run him last Saturday and then back him up," said Richardson, who trains in partnership with Rogan Norvall.

"I didn't have much option, it was one or the other and I thought this is the better one.

"He hasn't had a run for five months and I didn't want to back him up. It was a tough call, but I'm quite sure I have made the right one."

Defibrillate showed early promise

and won two of his first three starts for Richardson, who also co-bred and part-owns the gelding.

He then relocated to Victorian trainer Patrick Payne, who prepared him to claim a further eight races, with three at Listed level including two editions of the Mornington Cup Prelude (2000m).

Defibrillate re-joined Richardson earlier this year and has since had three trial outings.

Stablemate and dual Group One winner **Tiptronic (NZ)** (O'Reilly) also

held a Livamol nomination, but will be absent following his unplaced run in the Arrowfield Stud Plate.

"He never, ever does much until Christmas time and it's just one of those things," Richardson said.

"Sam Spratt rode him and she did a good job, but said he just switched off and needs blinkers on. He did win the Herbie Dyke (Gr.1, 2000m) with blinkers on.

"I'm going to give him a week or 10 days out and start again and get him ready for the Zabeel Classic (Gr.1,

2000m) and so on and do what he does best at that time of the year.

"He is what he is and he's a dude. He didn't come to any harm, he just pulled up and had a yawn and went back to the stable."

Richardson and Norvall enjoyed a satisfying weekend on their home track on Saturday, most notably with **Paisley Park's (NZ)** (Azamour) second-up win in the Listed Matamata Cup (1600m).

"We were on the back foot a bit as he got really crook with a virus a couple of months ago and I had to tip him out

for 10 days," Richardson said.

"He did a bit of pre-training at JK Farms for a change of scenery and the plan of attack was then the Matamata Cup, he loves Matamata.

"He ran at Te Rapa over 1200m because there was nowhere else to run him and then stepped up to a mile. The goal was the Cup and I'm just going to wait and see how he is before deciding where we go next."

However, a long-term plan is in place for **Channel Surfer (NZ)** (Derryn) following his third placing in Saturday's Gr.2 Hawke's Bay Guineas (1400m).

While unsure just yet about the son of Derryn's distance limitations, Richardson will give the three-year-old every opportunity to prove himself worthy of a crack at the Gr.1 New Zealand Derby (2400m).

"I really like Channel Surfer and I don't know how far he'll go. He'll go a mile, certainly against his own age group, and we'll aim at the Derby," he said.

Placed in last season's Listed Castletown Stakes (1200m), he was gallant when resuming and backed that up with another sound effort in the Guineas for rider Jasmine Fawcett.

"He's a nice horse and when he ran third first-up at Taupo when he was trapped three wide the whole way," Richardson said.

"It was encouraging, the horse that beat him last time was The Intimidator and he won well again.

"I was a little bit worried on Saturday because he drew awkwardly too, but she rode him well and he went to the line really well." – **NZ Racing Desk**

Prix De Turn seeking Cup berth

Trainer Matthew Brown is seeking a Gr.1 Caulfield Cup (2400m) berth with his talented galloped Prix De Turn when he lines-up in the Gr.3 Coongy Cup (2000m) at Caulfield on Wednesday.

The Turn Me Loose entire gave Brown his biggest win in his career when he won the Gr.2 Alister Clark Stakes (2040m) in March, is 27th in order of entry for the Caulfield Cup and the only way he could gain a run is by winning the Coongy Cup, which carries an exemption from the ballot for the winner.

"He's obviously got to be pretty good on Wednesday but we want to give him his chance. Hopefully it's on a firm deck but it looks as if that will be touch and go though," Brown told Racing.com.

"We'd like to see him get his chance to see where he stands."

Brown sent Prix De Turn for a spell after he won the Alister Clark Stakes with the plan to target spring features.

He has had three runs this time in and has had to contend with wet tracks each time.

Prix De Turn finished fourth at Moonee Valley in two starts over 1600 metres to begin his campaign before he finished seventh of eight runners in the Gr.3 JRA Cup (2040m).

"It's been a bit of a disaster. The best track of the lot was first-up and he got caught up in behind them and just followed them around," he said.

Brown said if Prix De Turn didn't win the Coongy Cup but still ran a great race they would consider paying the acceptance fee for the Caulfield Cup if there was a chance he could get into the race.

"While there's not many imports this year we thought we'd have a crack. He's going to be better as a five-year-old but we're trying to see whether he can shape up," Brown said.

FORSMAN STABLE IN INTIMIDATING FORM

Andrew Forsman could take on the name of one of his horses going by the way his team are performing at present.

The Cambridge trainer has been in intimidating form across the Tasman with a pair of talented three-year-olds in **She's Licketysplit (NZ)** (Turn Me Loose) and **Mr Maestro (NZ)** (Savabeel), and back home he

looks like he may have unearthed another talented three-year-old in **The Intimidator** (Toronado).

In the hands of Wiremu Pinn, the Toronado gelding put away a handy field to win the Comag Limited 1400 at Matamata on Saturday, extending his record to two wins and a placing from three starts.

"It was a really nice win," Forsman

said. "He has always shown good amount of ability. He is quite a big, raw type of horse and he has just taken a bit of racing to switch on.

"He was very tractable yesterday and did things right and won quite comfortably.

"There were certainly ones in there with reputations and had the form on

the board. He really had to step up and I was rapt to see him win like that."

Purchased by bloodstock agent Stuart Hale for \$160,000 out of Inglewood Stud's 2021 New Zealand Bloodstock Book 1 Yearling Sale draft, Forsman is in favour of freshening the gelding in preparation for the Karaka Million 3YO Classic (1600m) at Pukekohe in January.

"We haven't made any firm plans with him yet but my gut feeling is that he might be better to go to the paddock now," Forsman said.

"He has had a good prep and at some point he is going to need a bit of a break. Ideally we would like to work through to the Karaka Mile as a target race for him.

"He has pulled up really well, but at some point we need to give him a freshen-up and that may be now."

While The Intimidator is likely to bypass the Gr.1 Al Basti Equiworld Dubai New Zealand 2000 Guineas (1600m) at Riccarton next month, Forsman looks to have another strong contender in the form of **Mr Mojo Risin' (NZ)** (Deep Field).

The son of Deep Field was runner-up behind Pier in the Gr.2 Hawke's Bay Guineas (1400m) at Matamata on Saturday and Forsman has been pleased with the way his gelding has come through the run.

"He wasn't as clean out of the

barriers as we would have liked. He did have to do a bit of work to punch through and get to the lead, then he had a bit of a soft time of it and he kicked well but was just beaten by a better one on the day," he said.

"At this stage we will keep pressing on towards the Guineas. He is doing well and seems to be coping really well in work. We have no firm plan with him but would consider the Sarten (Gr.2, 1400m) perhaps."

Another stable runner to make the Cambridge horseman proud was **White Noise (NZ)** (El Roca) in the Listed Matamata Cup (1600m).

Forsman was impressed by the grey gelding's brave placing and hasn't ruled out backing up the four-year-old in next Saturday's Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m) at Hastings.

"He went brilliant and was very brave. He was second-up and hadn't run in a little while so he was a touch vulnerable fitness-wise against some of those," Forsman said.

"From an awkward barrier draw (14) he has ended up covering ground but put in a very brave effort.

"With the preparation that he has had, the Livamol does become a bit of a tough option for him. We would like to if it works out, but that will be something we decide in the next 24 hours or so."

One stable runner that will

definitely be backing up in next week's Group One is **Mustang Valley (NZ)** (Vanbrugh), who put in an eye-catching runner-up effort behind La Crique (NZ) (Vadamos) in the Gr.1 Arrowfield Stud Plate (1600m).

"She was brilliant," Forsman said.

"She was tardily away and that cost her a touch. She wouldn't have beaten La Crique but I was rapt to see her get up for a very valuable Group One placing.

"She has put in a huge effort and seems in good form, and looks to have come through it really well.

"We are looking at backing her up (in the Livamol). That is definitely on the agenda assuming she is fine in the next couple of days at the track."

Meanwhile, Forsman can't wait to head back across the Tasman this week to watch She's Lickety Split line-up in the Gr.1 Thousand Guineas (1600m) at Caulfield on Wednesday before returning to the Melbourne track to watch Gr.1 Victoria Derby (2500m) favourite Mr Maestro contest the Gr.3 Caulfield Classic (2000m).

"She's Lickety Split and Mr Maestro had a good gallop on Saturday morning so they are all set for their assignments next week and we just hope the rain stays away now," Forsman said.

ROLLERCOASTER DAY FOR TE AKAU RACING

Saturday was a day of undoubted highlights for Matamata trainer Mark Walker, with a winning treble that encompassed a trifecta and a first-four, but one that saw him licking a few wounds as well.

Walker began Gr.1 Arrowfield Stud Plate (1600m) day at Matamata with a flurry of wins, producing **Romancing The Moon (NZ)** (El Roca), **Wild Night (NZ)** (Vanbrugh) and Challa (Dissident) for wins inside the first four races but feature race flops from **Imperatriz** (I Am Invincible) in the day's feature and **Dynastic (NZ)** (Almanzor) in the Gr.2 AHD Hawke's Bay Guineas (1400m) brought him down to earth with a thud.

"It was certainly an up-and-down day," Walker reflected on Sunday.

"There's a few that have got us scratching our heads. Some of those

horses that ran on that really heavy track at Hastings just didn't bring their usual form."

One of those was Arrowfield Stud Plate favourite Imperatriz, who was never in contention and finished eighth, more than eight lengths from impressive winner La Crique (NZ) (Vadamos).

"That hard run at Hastings on the first day might have just taken too much out of her and I'm starting to question her as a four-year-old now whether she's a pure sprinter," Walker said.

"We're going to spell her now and probably aim for the Railway and Telegraph."

The Gr.1 Sistema Railway (1200m) at Te Rapa on New Year's Day is a race Te Akau Racing has won with Advantage (Fastnet Rock) and Entriviere (NZ) (Tavistock) in the past two renewals and an important leadup to the Gr.1 JR & N Berkett Telegraph (1200m) at Trentham on January 14.

Walker was thrilled with **Prise De Fer's (NZ)** (Savabeel) effort for third in the Arrowfield Stud Plate and confirmed he would back-up in Saturday's Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m) with stable jockey Opie Bosson to ride.

"I'm hoping La Crique doesn't go there because if she doesn't he's right in the mix. He's come through the race really well," he said.

There were bright spots among Walker's three-year-old crop with Romancing The Moon beating stablemates **Elounda (NZ)** (Contributer), **Fay Khan It (NZ)** (Mongolian Khan) and **She's Outrageous (NZ)** (Reliable Man) to keep her hopes alive for the Gr.1 Barneswood Farm New Zealand 1000 Guineas (1600m) at Riccarton on November 12.

Walker said she would head to the Gr.3 Soliloquy Stakes (1400m) at Te Rapa on October 22, while fellow Matamata winner Wild Night would tackle the Gr.2 James & Annie Sarten Memorial Stakes (1400m) the same day.

"When you look at the times on the day, she ran quite a bit faster than those other races," Walker said of Romancing The Moon's 1400m time of 1:23.77," he said.

"We ran her second-up in the Listed race at Wanganui (O'Leary Fillies Stakes, 1200m) so we've always thought a bit of her and she still holds a nomination for the 1000 Guineas.

"She's come through the race well too. She's a guts. She looks at food and puts on weight. That's a good thing with a three-year-old filly, that's for sure."

Walker said Wild Night's mid-term aim was the \$1 million Karaka Million 3yo Classic (1600m) at Pukekohe on January 21.

"He's a horse who's definitely on the way up and a horse

that will get over a lot more ground too. He's a good prospect," he said.

However, the disappointments of Walker's three-year-olds included beaten Hawke's Bay Guineas favourite Dynastic and fillies **Stella Splendida (NZ)** (Zoustar), who was third as favourite in the Comag 1400 at Matamata, and **Sans Doute** (Not A Single Doubt), fourth in the Egmont Tyres 3yo (1400m) at Hawera.

"Dynastic was well below his best. He was impounded by the vets for a check and he had a bit of a slow recovery," Walker said.

"Whether he fibrillated or something else went on, I don't know, but he was too bad to be true. We'll do some further vet tests and see if we can put our finger on it. He does know he's a colt but he was gone a long way from home so something must pop up somewhere.

"If we don't find anything wrong with him, he'll probably go to the Sarten and we'll make our mind up about Christchurch after that," Walker said, adding that **Accidental Tourist (NZ)** (Telperion) had likely come to the end of his preparation after finishing one place further back in eighth in the same race.

On Stella Splendida, Walker said: "I really don't know with her. Whether it was that she was second-up and just lacked a bit of ringcraft, I'm not sure. But she had the run of the race and I was hoping for better. She seems fine this morning too. We'll still go to the Soliloquy and see how we get on."

Walker will now send Gr.3 Gold Trail Stakes (1200m) runner-up Sans Doute for a spell.

He was delighted with Challa's win over stablemates **Fashion Shoot (NZ)** (Savabeel) and **Millefiori (NZ)** (Iffraaj) in the Colchester Engineering 1200, the Dissident gelding's fifth win from 24 starts and his second in a row after a first-up win at Taupo.

"Our farrier Gareth Allis has worked hard to get his feet right. We struggled to keep his feet in good order last year but we've tried a few things differently and it seems to be working," Walker said.

Riccarton trips remain options for **Markus Aurelius (NZ)** (Ghibellines) and **Perfect Scenario (NZ)** (Iffraaj), who finished second and fourth in the Listed Matamata Cup, with both still holding nominations for the Gr.2 Coupland's Bakeries Mile (1400m) on November 9, a race Markus Aurelius won last year.

However, **Belle En Rouge (NZ)** (Burgundy) will miss next

Saturday's Gr.1 Livamol Classic (2040m) at Hastings after she finished last of the 14 runners.

"The better track conditions helped Markus Aurelius," Walker said. "Perfect Scenario is just at an awkward placing in the ratings and difficult to place. Over the Christmas-New Year period, there are races like the Taupo Cup that might suit.

"They'll probably go to the Thompson Handicap (Gr.3, 1600m) now and if they go well enough, they could carry on to Riccarton. I was scratching my head with Belle En Rouge. I thought she'd be hard to beat off her Ruakaka run. I don't know what went on there."

Leaderboard continued his build-up to the Gr.3 Martin Collins New Zealand Cup (3200m) at Riccarton on November 12 with a fighting effort for fifth in the Russell Yvonne Green Memorial (2000m).

"He's just an older horse now so we've got to get the miles into him ahead of the New Zealand Cup. When they sprinted he just kept grinding at that one pace," Walker said.

"He'll be better next start over 2400m at Te Rapa in two weeks and then he'll run in the 2500m leadup race at Riccarton (Gr.3 Nautical Boat Insurance Metropolitan Trophy on November 5) and that should have him spot on for the New Zealand Cup." - **NZ Racing Desk**

LORD JUSTICE STARS IN SINGAPORE

Lord Justice (NZ) (Showcasing) was the headline act with his fourth win in a row on a great day for New Zealand-bred horses in Singapore on Saturday.

The Showcasing gelding has had veterinary issues throughout a career that looked to be stalling at stages and if not for the patience of his owners he may have retired long ago.

Stepping up to Class 3 company for the first time in the Japan Racing Association Trophy, Lord Justice was sent out favourite and despite drifting out in the final stages took the win by a length and a quarter.

Trainer Donna Logan's assistant-trainer Hamsha Aloysius not only had two horses to saddle in the Class 4 race over 1200m – but also a jockey to find for Luxury Brand (NZ) (Charm Spirit) after apprentice jockey Yusoff Fadzli had a fall in the previous race.

He was declared unfit to ride after that so Iskandar answered the late call. With quick riding instructions ringing in his ear, he headed to the 1200m start on second-favourite.

After taking a sit behind the leaders and peeling off heels to sit on his stablemate Fadaboy's flank on the bend, Luxury Brand made his challenge early in the straight before kicking away strongly for the win.

"There's plenty of upsides to him," said Hamsha. "We still haven't got to the bottom of him, so we will enjoy this for now and see how he pulls up."

The winning hoop was also impressed with what he saw.

"You know this one is an amazing horse," said Iskandar, who rode a double earlier courtesy of Happy Moment (NZ) (Showcasing).

"I have never ridden this horse, so I just followed the instructions and

parked him behind the leader.

"He was a little nervous behind the barrier but once he jumped and I got him to relax, he did the job.

"He's a nice horse and very easy to ride."

Owner Kylie Bax from the BAX Racing Stable was ecstatic after the race from her home in New Zealand.

Earlier in the day debutant Flying Nemo (NZ) (Vespa) flashed home late in the Restricted Maiden race (1000m) to hand jockey Simon Kok Wei Hoong the perfect gift on his 27th birthday.

The young Malaysian hoop partnered Flying Nemo at his two barrier trials prior to his first run and was well aware of the improvement he has made.

"The owners are Singaporean businessmen and friends of (trainer) Desmond Koh," said stable representative Lee Soo Hin. "They bought the horse together at the New Zealand Bloodstock National Online Yearling Sale last year.

"He cost only NZ\$7,000, what a good buy. We might set him for a Novice race next."

With that first win from his only start in Singapore, Flying Nemo has now earned more than S\$40,000 in prizemoney for the connections.

Other New Zealand-bred winners on the card included Seson (NZ) (Dalghar), Hyde Park (NZ) (Darci Brahma), and Engine Start (NZ) (Highly Recommended). **-STC**
